

## Athletes of the Year

**Jessica Varady** was a two-year member of the intercollegiate softball team. She was a selected a team captain, and was involved in team leadership class. Jessica received high honors both years playing softball. She was a two year Coast Conference Most Valuable Pitcher, 1st Team All League, and was selected to the All State 1st Team as a Pitcher both years. She was selected on the All Tournament team of the March Madness Tournament in 2010 and 2011. In 2011 she also received the National Fast Pitch Coaches Association All American Award for excellence in softball. Jessica was the Tri City Voice Female Athlete of the Month of April in 2010 and again received the same award from Tri City Voice in 2011. She was also the California Community College Athletic Association Athlete of the Month for the month for April, 2010.



In 2010 and 2011, Varady led the Renegades to the California State Community College Softball Championships. Ohlone softball qualified for Post Season Play largely because of this young lady's talents. She played in every game and was a leader in base stealing, base percent, doubles, triples and homeruns. She batted .408 and was listed in the top 15 batters in Northern California in 2011. She also pitched, (a workhorse on the mound,) and broke Ohlone's pitching records (25 years of records) in many categories in 2011. Career innings pitched was 421, conference innings pitched was 109 innings, single year wins in 2011 was 27, career wins (2010-2011) was 52, and career strikeouts was 355. These were all records dating back 24 years - 1988 to the present time. Jessica has received a full softball scholarship to play at San Jose State University which is a Division I school, in the WAC Conference.

Jessica's intense determination to succeed, ability to stay focused on her goals, and discipline to balance academics and athletics, will assist in her ability to conquer her challenges at the next level and in life. She sets high standards for herself and works hard to achieve them. Her demeanor and persistence to get it right makes her a great competitor. This young lady will not be outworked.



**Jason Corbett** Jason is the most decorated male swimmer in the history of Ohlone College. He was named an all-american in 13 events over the last two seasons. He owns school records in 4 individual events and 3 relays. He is currently swimming for Cal State Bakersfield.

Although Jason suffered through some shoulder issues this season Jason won the consolation final in the 100 Breaststroke at the State Swimming Championships at East L.A. College. He also was a pivotal member of three relay teams that made the finals at the State meet. He helped 2 relays to two 6th place finishes in the 200 Free Relay and the 200 Medley Relay.
