One of the most special parts of swimming is the opportunity to set goals, no matter whether you're in Novice or Elite, and to work your butt off to achieve them. Goals may be simple, like moving from Novice to Blue, or they may be extremely ambitious, like winning an Olympic Gold Medal. Either way, there's a place in the sport for everybody, and as coaches, we are the lucky ones that get the joy of EVERY athlete striving towards their own victories and achievements. I must say, Alex Cohen produced one of the most inspiring and emotional swims I've seen as a coach, and it's a race I'll remember throughout my life and career.

Alex is a young man on the rise- a freshman at Blue Valley West, and a new face to the upper levels of the sport. He joined the Blazers from his Indiana team just a year ago, and he came to the team as a very quiet, conservative, gentle young man. He didn't necessarily get overly excited for his races, was still building up his confidence, and had much to learn. Throughout that last year, he hit

several obstacles, from sickness to harder training to a nagging coach who wanted him to come to more practices. Little by little, he knocked off every single one of those obstacles and rose to each new challenge. His time drops last year were RIDICULOUS. He dropped so much time in the summer that it was hard to believe he had swum the year before!

For example, think about how hard it is to drop a full second in the 50 Free. Now imagine how hard it is for a 14 year old boy who has already grown and trained a lot. Now try to digest the fact that Alex has dropped NINE seconds in his 50 in the past 12 months. Not to mention 35 seconds in his 100 Free, 1:13 in his 200 Free, and 2:53 in his 500 Free. Holy cow! After all of that, Alex hit the water in his final event of the Turkey Classic, this month, the 1000 Free. It was his last Blazer event before leaving for Boys' High School Swimming, and he wanted to end with a bang. He had a race strategy in mind, he was confident about all of the hard work he had done, and he ATTACKED. 40 grueling laps of intense, brutal toughness. As the race developed, we slowly realized how special it was. Not only was it going to be a dynamite swim, but it was also going to be Alex's first "A" and "Division 1" time, ever. His first 500 was nearly a best time, and he negative split the swim where his last 500 WAS a best time. Each 50 had to be under 36.0 seconds, and he steadily cranked out 35.8, 35.6, 35.5... on and on. At about the 700 mark it was clear that he wouldn't be stopped, and I couldn't help but smile and enjoy the moment. That's why we coach.

Congratulations, Alex, on overcoming every single challenge and inspiring us all. The scary part is that you're just getting started at this new level, and you've got a world of potential still to come!

We teach day after day what it means to be a Blazer. We teach all the time that success comes from the inside and that the coaches and teachers are there to provide the opportunities when the swimmers are ready to take advantage of them. Lainey has been working very hard at refining all areas of her swimming and training over the last few months. She is clearly getting ready to take advantage of her opportunities.

When we are doing dry land work, Lainey is making sure that her form is correct and that her push ups are even better than the day before. When we are swimming, she is refining her form based on the things we have talked about, and working on speed through her turns. When we have a set where she is not sure what additional things to think about to improve, she asks. After practice, or

after a set, she looks for feedback so that her focus can change as her training changes, and when we finish a workout early, she is the first to ask if we can work on turns with the time remaining. And, it is paying off. She has had 100% best times this fall, and six times more Division II times than she had at the start of September.

This new focus of Lainey's is also making her a leader on the team. She helps get

everyone started on dry land, and she is regularly the first swimmer in the pool. Her enthusiasm for working on stroke technique and turns during spare minutes after practice has rubbed off on the rest of her teammates, and now, though Lainey is still the first to ask for extra turn and stroke work, she is not the only one and the whole team is willing to stay in the pool instead of getting out early. We are thrilled that Lainey has had such focus and determination over the last few

months, but we are even more thrilled that her teammates are following her lead.

### Notes

In general, each swimmer will be in one of the three "Tracks" throughout the year. While this does not include every scenario, it gives a good general picture of what meets your swimmer will be eligible. It will also be common for swimmers to move "up" a track as they improve, and move "down" a track as the age up. Questions regarding eligibility for meets should be directed to the head site coach. If a meet says "Qualifiers", there are specific times for that meet in play.
