COMMENTS

The last game of the tournament was between perennial powerhouses Brazil and Canada. Both teams came into the tournament ranked 1-2. Canada came out playing tough man to man defense while their opponent relied on dropping back. Both teams weren't able to capitalize in their first extra man opportunity. The first goal of the quarter was scored from 7 meters by #11 Torakis. Brazil had a chance to tie the game but missed an extra man opportunity. First quarter ended with Canada on top 1-0. With 6:1 left in the second quarter Guimaraes (#11) as able to squeeze inside and score the tying goal. Canada had the chance to get back up but missed the extra man chance, just to have Brazil score on their extra man chance. On their next possession Brazil scored on a counter attack increasing their lead to 3-1. With 16 seconds left in the quarter Canada scored on a counter attack cutting the lead to end the half 3-2 Brazil ahead. Both teams had opportunities to score at the beginning of the third quarter but couldn't finish the attack. Canada did score on an extra man to tie the game at 3. Canada's #6 Robinson was able to squeeze a goal with 47 seconds left to give his team a 4-3 lead after three quarters. The defining fourth quarter started with an extra man goal for Brazil tying the game at 4. With 4:14 left Guimaraes (#11) scored from 5 meters to put Brazil ahead by one. Brazil had a chance to close out the game but missed on an extra man chance. With 1:15 left in the game Canada got the golden opportunity to tie the score but missed their
