COMMENTS

USA defeated Puerto Rico in the last game of the 3-5 spots, a win that earned them the bronze medal. The USA offense and defense was too much for Puerto Rico. The constant pressure at both ends of the pool during the first two quarters led to many counter attack goals for USA and quite a few turnovers for Puerto Rico. The first quarter ended with a 5-1 lead for USA, one that they increased to 6-1. The only goals their counterpart was able to score came from Guzman from center forward and Melendez on extra man. The second half started much better on offense for the Caribbean team. They were able to score on two extra man possession plus two perimeter shots. USA was able to match goal for goal, finishing the quarter ahead 16-6. During the fourth quarter USA just kept the defensive full court pressure, which led to easy counter attack goals. There were no easy shots for Puerto Rico, and the ones they were able to take were well defended by the goalkeeper. United States had a balanced attack in offense, with three players scoring four goals apiece. Guzman (#6) for Puerto Rico was their leading scorer with three goals.

COMMENTS

Canada came out on fire to begin the game. They scored in five out of their first six possessions, each one different one from the other, to get a comfortable lead 5-0 with a little less than 4 minutes to go. Brazil was able to score with 1:30 left in the quarter to cut the lead to four goals. One minute later they scored on a penalty shot to further cut the lead 5-2. In the second quarter Brazil was more aggressive at offense, but that aggressiveness was matched by Canada's goalkeeper, who stopped shot after shot. A miscue in defense from Brazil, a penalty shot, and crisp outside shooting from three meters allowed Canada to score three quick goals, putting the score 8-2. An extra man goal helped them cut the lead at half 8-3. Brazil started the second half with two center forwards, a strategy that allowed them to score one goal from 2 meters in less that one minute gone in the quarter. The strategy worked once more when Canada clogged the middle and Brazil capitalized with a strong seven meter shot. Canada responded with a quick perimeter shot to keep a four goal lead. An extra man and a breakaway goal helped Brazil cut the lead to two goals to end the third quarter. A perimeter goal put Brazil just down by one. Canada came right back with a two meter goal to increase their lead back to two goals. A quick lapse on the defensive side was all Canada needed to score one breakaway goal with four minutes left. Both teams exchanged goals in the bext two minutes, leading to an exciting finish with two minutes left. Brazil just kept putting the ball in the two meters, getting the extra man chances, but not able to score on them. With the win Canada repeats as Junior Champions in the female category. Their leading scorer was Mc Dowell (#2) with 4 goals. Silver medal winner Brazil was led by Belorio (#9) with 4 goals.
