COMMENTS

COMMENTS

The last game of the afternoon, which would fill out the final spot in the semi-final round, had Puerto Rico and Canada do battle against each other. This game was a very tight one from beginning to end even though the score doesn't show it. Puerto Rico scored first on an extra man situation. Canada countered with three quick goals, two from center forward and one from a quick 4 meter shot to get a brief 3-2 lead. Puerto Rico was able to hold Canada's ferocious offensive attack in the second quarter, holding them to one goal in the quarter. Canada's defense was very tight in the quarter, which didn't allow many possibilities for Puerto Rico to have a good look at the goal. During the third quarter and fourth, Canada was more at ease with their offensive scheme. They were able to pound the ball inside to center forward and got either goals from that position or from extra man opportunities. Puerto Rico kept battling on every possession, and when they were able to put the ball inside the 4-meter area they got the results they wanted (extra man opportunities) but were not able to capitalize on them. Puerto Rico, who plays Peru in the 5-8 position games, had a balanced offensive attack with four players scoring one goal. Cote (#2) led all scorers with three goals. His team will play in the first semi-final game against USA.
