COMMENTS

The first game of the day brought two south American teams to fight for a spot in the top four teams of the event. Argentina came out playing very precisely. They were able to score at will during the first half, capitalizing on their strength from the inside and from their perimeter shooting. Brazil was only able to score from extra man and from a good center forward shot in the first half, which ended with a 8-3 lead for Argentina. The second half was totally different for both teams. Brazil started to put more pressure at both ends of the pool, which allowed them to score quickly for the perimeter and specially from center forward, with three goals from that position. During the last three minutes of the game both teams exchanged goals to keep the game tied. Brazil had a last chance to score but wasn't able to score on extra man, allowing Argentina to call time out and set up a play. A good defensive play by Brazil didn't allow their opponent a shot, and keeping the scored tied at the end of the game. Bacigalupo (#3) led a balanced Argentina attack with three goals. Silva (#4) led Brazil with three goals. During the next session Argentina will play Peru and Brazil will go against USA.

COMMENTS

Canada and Peru played the second game of the morning session. The Canadians once again showed their dominance at both ends of the pool. Their offense was precise and their defense allowed them to score from Peru's turnovers. The first quarter ended with a 9-0 lead. Peru was able to score two goals during the second quarter, one of them coming from a penalty shot. Canada kept their up-tempo game and scored seven goals, which allowed them to get a comfortable 16-2 lead at halftime. The second half started with two goals from Peru from inside 6 meters. Canada was able to tighten their defense and score from turnovers to score four goals and enter the last quarter with a 20-5 lead. A solid drop back defense by Canada didn't allow Peru to get good shots during the fourth quarter. Canada's leading scorer Perkov (#3) was deadly during the last quarter, scoring three of her six goals for the game. Torres (#5) and Rodriguez (#11) led Peru with two goals apiece. Canada will play Trinidad and Tobago while Peru will go against Argentina in the third day of competition.

COMMENTS

United States continued the dominance of their opponents during the second day of competition. The Americans started with very tight defense and scoring from Trinidad's miscues during the first half. USA just kept putting real tight man to man pressure for the first 16 minutes of the game, which allowed them to get a comfortable 16-0 lead by halftime. During the second half, USA established a combination of outside pressure and drop back zone defense, which allowed Trinidad to be more aggressive in the offensive side of the field of play and score their first goal of the game during the third quarter. The Americans kept moving the ball around the perimeter and were able to score on every extra man chance they had. The fourth quarter saw USA go back to a full drop back defense and moving the ball around in offense. Trinidad was able to score from inside 5 meters and from the perimeter. Dempsey (#4) and Flynn (#8) led a balanced USA attack with six goals each. USA will play Brazil in Sunday's session. Trinidad, who will play Canada in tomorrow's session, had Jordan (#5) and Valentine (#9) score one goal apiece.
