COMMENTS

The first game of the third of competition brought us perennial medal contenders Brazil and United States to do battle. From the first minute of the game, United States was able to set up the tempo of the game at both ends of the pool. The Americans just kept solid man to man pressure at all times, forcing some costly Brazilian turnovers and capitalizing with quick goals. When they weren't scoring from their defense, they just kept pounding the ball inside to center forward. It was from there that they generated the most offense. Their center forward players were either able to score on one to one, get ejections or pass to open players. USA was very effective on the extra man situations and their perimeter shooting was excellent. During the whole game Brazil just couldn't decipher USA's defensive scheme, and when they did their shots were either blocked by the defense or by the goalkeeper. Brazil's only goals came in the first and the third quarter. For this game, United States was led by Hendrix (#11) with 5 goals. Bonetti (#11) and Pascual (#12) were Brazil's only scorers with one goal apiece. USA will play Argentina and Brazil will go against undefeated Canada in Monday's morning session.

COMMENTS

South American counterparts Argentina and Peru were the opponents of the second game of this session. During the first quarter, Argentina started to up the tempo of the game by putting constant pressure on Peru. This pressure led to easy counter attack goals and a penalty goal to finish the first quarter ahead 3-0. During the second quarter, Peru was able to score from the perimeter in three occasions, while holding Argentina's attack to three goals. The first half ended with a 6-3 lead for Argentina. During the second half, Peru wasn't able to capitalize on their extra man opportunities and even missed a penalty shot. The game was still a close one due to an excellent work by the Peruvian goalkeeper Rodriguez, who stopped inside water and perimeter shots from Argentina. Two key mistakes by Peru led Argentina to quick goals to end the third quarter and increase their lead to 10-5. Peru was able to score on extra man to start the last quarter and cut the lead 10-6. Two straight misses by Peru from up close led to counter attack and perimeter shots scored for Argentina, putting the game out of reach of Peru. Argentina was led in scoring by Ruiz (#7) with 5 goals. Her team will have to be at their best for their next game against undefeated United States. Peru will play host Trinidad and Tobago during tomorrow's session. For this game they were led by Torres (#5) and Rodriguez (#11) with two goals.
