COMMENTS

The gold medal was, as expected, a closely contested one decided on penalties. United States came out strong in offense and precise in defense, not allowing Brazil too many opportunities and scoring. In less than five minutes of the quarter, USA was able to score four goals to none for their opponent. Brazil then came out strong and scored two goals to cut the lead 4-2. Brazil countered with two extra man opportunities to tie the game at 7. The fourth quarter saw both teams use the opportunities to score on extra man and penalty to end the quarter tied up and go to a penalty shoot-out. During the phase, Brazil scored in their first chance but USA wasn't able to score on their chance. The second chance was an exact replica of the first one. Brazil was able to score and USA just couldn't score. Brazil missed their third shot while USA was able to break the ice and score. With everything on the line, Countinho put a dagger on USA's chance by scoring the decisive goal. United States had Bowen (#9) with 3 goals. Leyvas (#6) and Guimaraes (#11) led Brazil with 3 goals.
