Message from Coach Chris

We're all wired differently. I just saw a movie, doesn't matter which one. What got me wasn't necessarily how I reacted to the various things that went on during the movie. I take it for granted that there will be a plot that manipulates and tugs at my emotions, brains or wherever laughter comes from. I don't try to figure out who did what or what the ending will be. I let myself get lost in the movie. It just so happens that the movie I saw had a happy ending,

but there was a lot of killing, a fair measure of justice along with a little bit of revenge, loyalty, romance, and a good dose of right and wrong sprinkled in to make the film whole.

What made me take this tact here is that, for me, watching a movie is a process. I want to get lost in it, let any moment surprise me or horrify me or, even, make me cry. I surrender to the

experience. For me, anything else would be less than whole, not as satisfying. I want to trust movies.

Trust serves athletes in a specific way. For the athlete to have the best chance to succeed he must trust different sources: himself and all of his abilities (physical, mental, emotional, intellectual, spiritual); his parents and those he regards as his sup-

port system; his coach. I believe trust requires the individual to give himself away to the source of his trust. The athlete must have faith that those around him believe what he endures on a daily— or even more minute, a moment-to-moment— basis is the best thing for him and his development.

I see it at every practice. Resistance. Doubt. Athletes not trusting either what their coach asks them to do or not believing in their ability to make the adjustments. Either way the process suffers, both for the athlete and the coach. I'll tell you this, the coaches believe in our methods. It is up to us to help you with the trust.


I'll say this as well: one doesn't experience anything totally if he doesn't give in completely to the process. You have to lose yourself in what you're doing. What makes it more difficult in swimming is the effort required to make adjustments, the time it takes to experience the muscle memory to have

those adjustments come naturally, and then the physical and mental fatigue you have to endure on a fairly constant basis just to become more fit. But if you don't give in to the process will you ever know the meaning of commitment? Can you ever trust that what the coaches tell you will help you enjoy the journey of swimming and make the fulfillment of reaching goals worthwhile?

It took going to a movie and getting lost in it to help clarify this theme. May you give in to a more fulfilling swimming experience.


