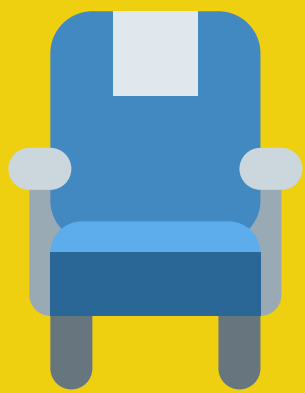


"BE A FAN, NOT A FANATIC"
