Swim Meets: Qualifiers vs Invitational

To help you understand the meet line up for June and recognize that this season is unique, we wanted to share some info about these meets.

Invitationals are meets created and organized by swim clubs, independent off our governing bodies. Time standards are set by the host club.

- Mayor's Cup is an invitational and we are so excited to offer swimmers who have no qualifying times across Ontario a chance to swim and potentially place at this meet.
- AGI is an invitational meet with a fast-qualifying time

Championships Meets: These are created and organized by our governing bodies and have qualifying times. There are both Central region and Provincial meets in June and in July there is the Swimming Canada National meet.

Central Region (the region NYAC is part of) Meets

- Central Region B Championships – has faster qualifying times than Central Region C
- Central Region C Championships – has qualifying times



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Provincial Meets organized by Swim Ontario

- Festivals –Provincial championship for the top 13 & under swimmers in province – due to Covid-19, the qualifying times have been expanded to allow more swimmers to race.
- Ontario Youth Junior - Provincial championship for 13 & over similar to Festivals – due to Covid-19, qualifying times have been expanded to allow more swimmers to race.
