

Ontario Government Enhanced Covid-19 Vaccine Certificate

Beginning September 22, 2021, participants entering the Toronto Pan Am Sports Centre will need to be fully vaccinated with vaccines approved by Health Canada (two doses plus 14 days).

Along with proof of vaccination, patrons will need to show photo ID (health card, drivers license) to gain access to the facility. This will need to occur upon every entry into the facility.

Patrons under the age of 12 are exempt from the vaccine mandate as are unvaccinated people with a medical exemption. Children under 11 will be required to wear masks at all times while in the facility with the exemption of aquatic sports which allows the removal of masks at the field of play.

Currently, a medical exemption only applies to people who are allergic to a component of the vaccine, which must be confirmed by an allergist or immunologist, or to an individual who suffered myocarditis or pericarditis after the first dose of a vaccine accompanied by a note from their treating physician and a negative COVID test within the last 72 hours to allow entry.

Unvaccinated parents without a medical exemption will not be allowed to accompany their child into the facility.

Patrons with the red and white health card can call the Provincial Vaccine Booking Line at 1-833-943-3900 to receive an email copy of their vaccination receipt. Those who received their first or second dose out of province will need to receive proper Ontario documentation via their local public health unit.

As of October 22, 2021, a verification app should be available from the province of Ontario available to provide vaccination certificates (PDF with a QR code) which can be printed or stored on a mobile device.

Masks will continue to be worn upon entry, in common areas and up until athletes and staff reach their field of play- masks are only to be removed when engaged in activity- just prior to entry to water or stepping on the court. For those accessing food and beverage- masks can be removed while eating or drinking.
