

The Oahu Swim League (OSL) and Hawaiian Swimming (LSC) are excited to be co-hosting the upcoming age group championships at UH.

We were just at the venue this Saturday for a senior meet and everything ran very smooth. As of right now, it looks like we will be operating out of the diving well with the long course pool utilized for warm-up and cool down.

Here are some notes for all clubs that needs to be distributed to your clubs ASAP:

- 1) All Oahu Clubs seating will be on a first come, first served basis. Tents may be left at the venue overnight, but they will need to be taken down each night (tops off). For outer island clubs, we will assign seating based on where we will be setting up tents/providing cover. There will be no official seating map. Clubs may also sit on the concrete benches by the long course pool. There should be NO SWIMMERS setting up their stuff in the weight room and/or hospitality room during the meet. The deck should remain "clean" during the competition meaning only officials and coaches. Swimmers may briefly visit their coaches post race but should not be set up on deck around the diving well.
- 2) The Venue will open at noon on Thursday, 02/20. Please do not try to enter the pool area until then. This is defined in the permit with UH and we need to follow that.
- 3) Parking should be in parking garages only. If you want to park outside of campus, that's fine but we don't want people parking anywhere on campus other than the parking garage. Keep in mind that Friday is a school day, and parking may be somewhat tight so the best advice is to arrive early (7:00 AM or earlier).
- 4) The Oahu Swim League will be doing all key jobs such as hospitality, heat sheets, awards, clerk of course, etc. In the coming week these jobs will be assigned (to OSL Clubs) and all other jobs (marshalling and hospitality) will be divvied up amongst all the leagues (MAGSA, BIS, Kauai Swimming, and OSL).
- 5) There will be no food for sale at the meet unfortunately. There is an L and L within athletic buildings and many restaraunts within walking distance (.25 miles or less) just off of campus.
- 6) A timeline will be posted ASAP, and psych sheets will be posted after entries are verified

We are looking forward to a GREAT meet. We know all the clubs have been working very hard to prep their swimmers for the meet and we can't wait to see how many records are broken, new time standards acheived, and new personal best times.
