In addition, HISI Board of Directors retains the right to revoke the meet sanction and expunge all or part of the times uploaded to SWIMS due to non-compliance with all sanctioning requirements.

Meet Restrictions and Requirements

- Maximum number of people attending the event and in the aquatic facility must comply with local government requirements.
- Everyone entering the facility must have their temperature taken and must have a reading of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or less.
- Parents shall be required to confirm their athletes are allowed entry into the facility before the parent or driver leaves.
- Entry/exit gates will be monitored continuously before, during, and after the swim meet and under the facility owner's authority.
- Until further notice, coaches, officials, spectators (parents), should wear masks.
- Until further notice, athletes should arrive in their suits and depart in suits if possible. Locker rooms use should be minimized.
- USA-S rule 102.8D will be enforced - swimsuits worn for competition must be conform to the current concept of the appropriate.
- Unless approved in writing in advance of the competition by the Vice President of Program Operations, operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.
- Use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phones, is not permitted in changing areas, restrooms, or locker rooms.
- Photography behind the starting area(s) is not permitted.
- Only deck officials, timers, coaches, and athletes may be on the pool deck during competition. Athletes are to return to their team area soon after they have completed their events.
- Venue and pool rules will be strictly enforced & parking is permitted only in marked areas.

DIVING IS ONLY PERMITTED IN THE COMPETITION POOL

ENTRY LIMITS: Athletes are allowed to swim in only one (1) session and may enter a maximum of three (3) individual events.
ENTRY PROCEDURE: Entries must be received by the entry contact ON OR BEFORE 11:59 P.M. of the entry deadline.
NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Entries must include a SDIF compatible entry file and entry fee report. All athletes, proof of times, and USA-S IDs must be included in the entry file.

NOTE: All club entries SHALL include the Individual Meet Entries Report with Proof of Time.
 Session 1: All swimmers must show at least one "AA" entry time for an event to enter Session 1
 Session 2: Swimmers 13&Over may enter events slower than "AA" max entry time.
 Session 3: Swimmers 11-12 may enter events slower than "AA" max entry time.
 & Includes all 10&Under swimmers.

Failure to include proof of time may result in the swimmer(s) disqualified from the swim meet.

SESSION SCHEDULE, EVENT ORDER, ENTRY RESTRICTIONS & DIVISIONS: See attached Schedule of Events.

MEET FORMAT: X Timed finals (seeded and swum slowest to fastest); Prelims/Finals (championship seeding)
 Partial heats may be combined and/or swum out of order.

TIMING SYSTEM: Automatic w/ manual backup; Semi-automatic w/ manual backup; X Other (Automatic w/no backup).

RULES: The meet will be conducted in accordance with current USA Swimming and HISI rules. Coaches are responsible for instructing their athletes of safety guidelines, warm-up/down procedures, and venue specific requirements. The Safety Marshals, with concurrence of the Meet Referee, shall enforce safety procedures and maintain order in the swimming venue. Safety Marshals shall have full authority to remove or have removed from the vicinity of the event anyone whose behavior or actions are unsafe or are disrupting the orderly conduct of the swim event, including the disqualification of athletes from competition.

ELIGIBILITY: Clubs and their athletes registered within HISI are eligible to the participate in the event. No athlete who is not a member as provided in Article 302 will be allowed to compete or participate except as provided under 202.8 or USA Swimming's "open border" policy included in its Registration Manual. All new HISI athlete registrations (and registration fee) shall be mailed directly by each Club Registrar to the LSC Registrar and POSTMARKED NO LATER than 14 days prior to the scheduled start of the meet. All swimmers must be registered prior to the entry deadline. It is the legal responsibility of each club to ensure that each athlete entered is a current member of USA Swimming. The age of the swimmer shall be the age on the first day of the swim meet.

SCRATCHES/HEAT SHEETS: Scratches of Individual Events for Sessions 1 are due to the Entry Contact by Noon on the day prior to the scheduled start of the meet. Coaches are to present their credentials to pick up scratch sheets and heat sheets. Exceptions must see the Meet Referee.

WARM-UP/DOWN: HISI warm-up/down procedures shall be in effect for the meet.

RACING STARTS: Any athlete entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the athlete or the athlete's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.

AWARDS & RESULTS: Individuals will be awarded ribbons for 1st through 8th place in each age group, gender, and division (excluding 19 & Over). Results posted on HISI website at: www.hawaiianswimming.org.

DIVISIONS: 8&Under, 9-10, 11-12, 12-14, 13-14, 15&Over. Divisions may be swum combined with result ranking reported and awarded separately.

OFFICIALS & TIMERS: Each club entered is expected to provide officials and timers as designated by BIS.



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SAFETY MARSHALS: Shall have authority enforce safety protocols and remove anyone whose behavior or actions are unsafe and/or disrupting the orderly conduct of the event, including the disqualification of athletes from competition (must have concurrence from the Meet Referee).

HOSPITALITY: No hospitality will be provided at the swim meet.

ADDITIONAL FACILITY REQUIREMENTS: All attendees enter the Hawaii Preparatory Academy (HPA) facility and grounds shall adhere to the HPA Safety Committee policy and complete HPA/ASC Safety Pre-Screening questionnaire. 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In accordance with Hawaii Preparatory Academy (HPA) policy for a day student or employee travel, we, ASC/BIS participants, officials, and coaches must follow safety protocols by adhering to the following policy, as approved by the HPA Safety Committee.

BIS Swimmers and/or Coaches who travel off-island

- If you travel off of Hawai'i Island, upon return you must:
- 1. Participate in the Hawai'i State Safe Travels Program;
 - a. Receive a negative pre-travel PCR COVID-19 test within 72-hours prior to arrival.
- 2. Meet all Hawai'i County Travel Requirements;
 - a. If traveling from out-of-state, a rapid COVID-19 test may be required at your airport of arrival, either Kona (KOA) or Hilo (ITO). i. Receive a negative post-travel COVID-19 test if offered at the airport, upon arrival.
- 3. The swimmer, official or coach may then pursue one of two paths to return to HPA's campuses:
 - a. The swimmer must quarantine away from campus for at least five days while remaining on Hawai'i Island;
 - i. Receive a nasopharyngeal or saliva PCR COVID-19 test from S&G Labs on or after their fifth day after arrival on Hawai'i Island and receive a negative result. Please email test results to HPA's Health Services Department at infirmary@hpa.edu;
 - ii. The swimmer, official, coach, may then return to campus to practice.
 - Continue closely monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms and refrain from practice and see their care provider for evaluation/testing if any symptoms develop.
 - b. The swimmer, official, coach, must quarantine away from campus for 14 days while remaining on Hawai'i Island. i. The swimmer, official, or coach may then enter the HPA campus.

Swimmers, Officials, or Coaches who have household members who have traveled off-island

Should a swimmer, official, or coach have a family member travel off of Hawai'i Island and return, there are two paths that are available for the day student to come to campus:

1. Abide by the [HPA Guidelines to Healthy Households](#); OR
2. The swimmer must quarantine away from campus for at least five days while remaining on Hawai'i Island.
 - a. The family member who traveled off-island must receive a nasopharyngeal or saliva PCR COVID-19 test from S&G Labs on or after the family member's fifth day on Hawai'i Island, and receive a negative result. Please email test results to HPA's Health Services Department at infirmary@hpa.edu.
 - b. The swimmer, official, or coach may then return to campus to resume practices, competition.

Report any positive test results of swimmers, officials or coaches, or household members in direct contact with a BIS member right away to your club's coach.
