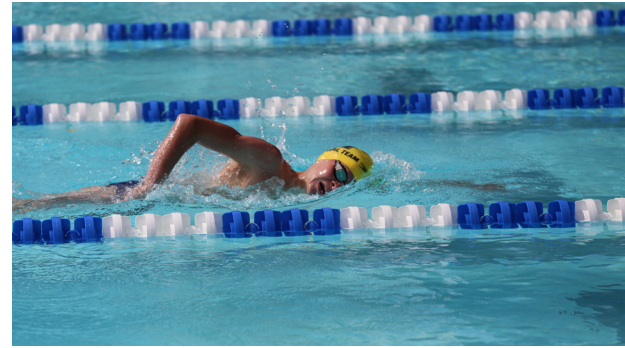
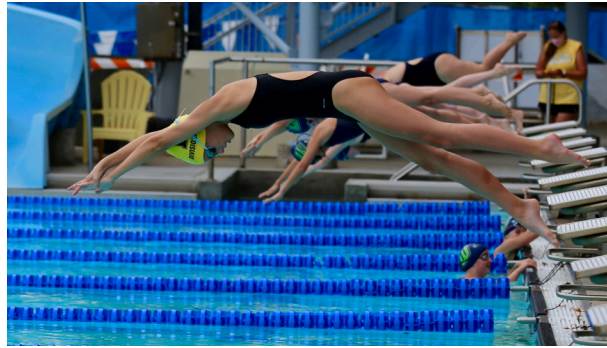

- **Spirit wear:** We are working with MAC designs again this year and the shop will be opening soon.
- The annual House of Delegates (HOD) meeting held virtually on October 3 passed the meet surcharge fee for swim meets. This means the host team can charge up to \$7 per swimmer for a one day meet, \$15 per swimmer for a two day meet, and \$20 per swimmer for a three day meet. It should be understood that even if a swimmer goes to 1 day of a 3 day meet families will still pay the 3 day surcharge fee.
