State of the Union - Joe Thompson

It would seem that our communications problems are pretty much over here in in New England. We are now getting the information out to those who want it. The problem I see is those that should receive it are not getting it, namely, Newspapers, industry, contributors to your local program, or people other than swim coaches and swim parents. If we had large advertisers for our Newsletter we could probably afford to send it all over the country, but until then I would like to suggest that clubs try to set up local people and news agencies either by buying them or having them buy a subscription to our Newsletter. This way we can show people other than swimmers that our New England swim organization is and is working.

If you heard rumors to the fact that the Executive Sub-Committee has been having closed meetings I guess we can say it was true, but it was all a mistake. It seems that at the last meeting held Wednesday, January 12th on the 17th floor of the Plaza building in Worcester, some night workers took the liberty of locking the doors to the meeting room area and those that came after the doors were locked were unable to get our attention. This was a sad happening and it held down the productiveness of our meeting.

One strong point brough out at the meeting was the old By-Law problem and I have sent Bob Pyatt of Belmont Hill Swim Association out to solve the two main problems which are:

- 1. Just what can the Executive Sub-Committee do in changing the rules of New England Swimming?
- Up-date and take out ambiguities and repeats from our present rules of swimming.

To do this properly is a very difficult task and anyone wanting to help may call B.b or myself with information and/or services.

The "Letters of Intent" should be in your hands by now and should be used for the next swim season. The last meeting has been set up to complete a meet packet and this will be sent to those who have been awarded a meet in the future.

NEWS FROM THE CERTIFICATION CHAIRMAN

Kim Bierwert, Certification Chairman asks that those planning on holding clinics submit an application form by the 3rd day of the month preceding the clinic date to ensure that the clinic may be included in Newsletter Plus. Applications have been sent to all clubs on the Swim Committee. Those who did not receive them and would like one may write Glenna Griswold at 48 Brainard Road, Wilbraham, MA, 01095.

The following are rules changes and /or clarifications included in the 1977 AAU rule books. The rules are in effect beginning Januaryl, 1977 so all officials should take note.

- 1. The new backstroke starting blocks (Moriarty Co.) will be allowed for Short Course meets.
- 2. Breaststroke Rule The arms extended and drifting apart after the underwater pull and kick and before the head surfaces does <u>not</u> constitute an infraction <u>unless</u> the hands have begun a sideward or downward press a very subtle judgement so think about this change carefully.
- 3. Butterfly Rule Any squeezing of the legs in the straight position shall not constitute an infraction.
- 4. Counters in individual events of 400 meters or longer except the IN shall be permitted to use stop watches and may signal (visular or verbal)intermediate times.
- 5. In Across-the-Board Place Judging a judge may call a tie if no distinction can be made among the finishes.
- 6. A competitor shall not be disqualified if the judge calling the infraction does not raise his/her hand.
- 7. If a race is started and one or more swimmers has used an illegal starting position gone unseen by the Starter, then the swimmer(s) cannot be disqualified by a stroke judge or the Referee.

AN EXPLANATION

There still seems to be confusion among clubs about who belongs to the Swim Committee and who doesn't.

The New England AAU is the parent organization for all the AAU Sports Sub-Committees in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Vermont, and New Hampshire.

The NEAAAU Competitive Swimming Committee is a sport sub-committee whose function is to guide swimming in this area. AAU Swimming Clubs are not automatically members of the Committee. Swimming Committee membership is a separate thing from AAU membership. Only AAU Clubs may belong to the Swimming Committee, but these clubs pay a yearly fee of \$5.00 for twelve month membership. Membership on the Swimming Committee begins and ends in May. Clubs joining mid-year pay the same membership much the same as swimmers joining the AAU gay the same no matter when they join, and their memberships all expire at the end of the vear.

This year about half of the AAU Swimming Clubs in New England are Swimming Committee members. This ratio is up from last year. It is the hope of the Competitive Swimming Committee to have a larger ratio in the coming year. Those working on the committee hope that when the time rolls around again for clubs to decide whether or not to join the Swimming sub-committee those clubs that are not members will seriously consider becoming members.

Below is a "LETTER TO THE EDITOR" sent to us by Jay Mogavero, Senior Gach, New England Barracudas. "De always welcome comments from our readers.....

The challengeof the next few years is whether we have the wisdom to enrich and elevate swimming on the Senior level and advance the quality of our training programs. Imagination, initiative and indignation will determine whether we build New England Senior Swimming where progress and perfection is the servent of our needs or Seniors where old values and new visions are buried beneath the antiquated undergrowth of tangled, provincial attitudes. For in this time we have the opportunity and obligation to move not only to the Challenging Seniors and the richness of the Regionals, but upward to the greatness of the Nationals.

Swimmers who qualify to compete in our AAU Nationals represent the top 3% of swimmers throughout the world. Without question, this should be one goal of each and every swimmer.

The Nationals must rest gigh on our list of goals, and it demands an immediate end to negative squabbles, watered down meets and a swimmer's failure to pay the price; to mention but a few of the injustices to the great world of swimming Me hold a distinct honor just to be a part of the long and majestic tradition Of United States Swimming.

The Mationals is a meet where swimmers can find knowledge to enrich their minds and enlarge upon their talents. It is a place where a total committment to swimming is a welcome change upon which to build and reflect, not a feared cause of boredom and restlessness. It is a place where the excessive desire to achieve serves not only the massive needs of the mind and the demands of the body, but the desire for beauty and hunger for representing the best in a community of excellence. 





THE FOREMOST HONOR OF ITS KIND IN THE UNITED STATES

ABOUT THE AWARD:

The AAU Swimming Award is conferred annually upon an Individual or Organization by the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States. A Resolution adopted by the AAU Board of Governors in 1953 authorized acceptance of the Award from its Founder and Donor, Bruce S. Hopping of Laguna Beach, California. The Trophy is a life-size bronze statue and is permanently located in the lobby of the AAU House in Indianapolis. A bronze replica of the original clay sketch of the sculpture and a diploma attesting the honor are conferred upon the Laureate each year during a special ceremony at the AAU National Convention Awards Banquet by the National AAU Swimming Award Committee.

THE BASIS OF SELECTING AWARD LAUREATES:

The AAU Swimming Award Committee, in selecting the Laureates each year, will give consideration to the following criteria used as a basis for judgment in making evaluations of the contributions of Individuals or Organizations nominated for the Award:

-Emphases on the importance of swimming as a healthy exercise, for recreation, competition and utilitarian value.

-Efforts which stimulate increased interest on the part of government and communities, institutions and service organizations to provide suitable facilities to further the purposes of swimming as an essential activity. -Stimulation of interest in providing instructional personnel in swimming and communities, colleges, schools and industry.

-Writing and developing original material in the various fields of swimming. Such material will include text books, motion pictures studies, charts and other audiovisual aids which tend to improve instruction. -Outstanding achievement in competition which creates incentive to advance swimming.

FOUNDED, COMMISSIONED AND GRANTED TO THE AAU BY BRUCE S. HOPPING, KALOS KAGATHOS FOUNDA-TION, LAGUNA BEACH, CALIFORNIA.

ABOUT THE STATUE:

The creator of the statue was Joe Brown, Professor of Sculpture in the School of Architecture at Princeton University. His conception suggests that swimming is an activity in which the individual - if he is to be successful - must relate his own abilities to the limitations that are imposed on him by the character of the natural factors involved - the water. The Giant symbolizes the Spirit of Water -Poseidon - who has spread his arms to allow two swimmers to utilize the good that can be found in healthy water experience. The powerful arms and shaggy head suggest a capacity for turbulence, for in swimming the importance of the water - the need to cooperate with rather than fight Nature is always evident to the swimmer, whose victory is over Man, not Nature, and his pride is tempered by humility.

SWIMMING COMMITTEE ANNUAL MEETING

The semi-annual meeting of the entire swimming committee took place on Saturday, September 17th in Morcester. The all-day meeting attended by about half the clubs on the swim committee spent most of the day on budget. Below are some of the main points that came out of the meeting.

New budgeted items include support for transportation, administrative and award costs for increased all-star competition, support for New England swimmers attending National Junior Olympics and Senior Nationals, an increased operating budget for the committee, and some support for the chairman to attend the National Convention.

For income to support the new items the committee voted in an increased surcharge that is designed to allocate expenses to those that are receiving the most. Beginning November 1 the surcharge on "C" entries will be 10¢, on "B" entries 15¢ and on "A" entries 25¢. The committee hopes to build up some advertising in the Newsletter and will also pick up the running of two Age-Group Championships per year to help support the increase in the budget. The committee will still run Seniors unless an individual club wishes to bid for it.

Complete minutes of the meeting will be available shortly to member clubs. An additional motion passed was to change the club surcharge to \$20.00 per year for committee membership. This fee will include the Newsletter, the Meet Managers Manual, Top Ten Times for long and short course, a New England Record Book, the current rule book and any mailings put out by the committee. Clubs who have already paid \$5.00 and wish to stay members of the committee may pay an additional \$15.00 and their membership will run until September 30, 1978. Those that do not wish to pay the additional \$15.00 will continue to receive their Newsletter through June, 1978 but will not be committee members.

Our Fall general meeting brought to light the question of who pays for the swimmers trips to Nationals, Mational JO's and All-Star Meets. It was partially answered by a vote for Man Findland Competitive Swimming Association to pay a part of our swimmers transportation cost. This is a burden, I feel, that should not be borne totally by the parent, even though some parents can afford the fare it is not morally correct in concept of us not to give every swimmer a chance at Mationals or Mixmoics just because they cannot afford it.

I feel the burden should be shared by the MEAAAM, the MEAAAM Competitive Swimming Committee, the swimmer's club, the community and the parents. (1) The MEAAAM has the authority to dive money in proportion to their budget as their committee feels is there. This is done only by request from the MEAAAM Competitive Swimming Committee. (2) The MEAAAM Competitive Swimming Committee has voted to give up to half of the travel money needed in accordance to allocated monies on hand. This money is being raised by surcharge on each entry. This also has to be applied for by the swimmer or the clubs involved. (3) Some clubs, through their own fund raising get money to give their top swimmers travel expenses. (b) Industry has been known to help swimmers pay their way to these top events for they also feel that swimming should not be for the rich only. Top examples are phillips 66 diving money to top finishers in this last Mational meet and Sears aiding in the cost of the John. (5) Some parents feel they can afford the travel and do not apply for this money.

All money received by a swimmer for travel shall be openly accounted for and under no conditions should the total allocated for the trip be more than the cost of the transportation itself.

Kitchen, a sophomore, was selected Swimmer of the Year by the Eastern Mass. Swimming Coaches, a division of high school girls and women sports, chaired by Julie Doherty of Medford. Her other accomplishments include a first in the Eastern Mass. 100-Freestyle, and a second place finish in the same event at the State Meet. She also anchored her Durfee freestyle relay, which captured first in both the Eastern and State meets.

MERRY CHRISTMAS AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR

There are many things happening this month to keep New England on it's toes.

The International Womens meet to be held at Harvard January 7th and 8th has been changed to the Brown pool. The Harvard pool is not quite ready as it was expected to be. The meet has been changed to Brown to keep it in New England. The Brown facility has completely automatic timing, but, the International Rules state that there should be three back-up button pushers and one mechanical watch per lane and a turn judge at each end of the pool on each lane. This means there is a need for forty or fifty certified officials to run the meet each session. Some of the officials will be National regulars, but, Mr. Close, National Officials Chairman, has asked me to get a list ready of New England qualified officials to fill any spots that will be needed. If anyone desires the chance to Officiate please send me their name, address, telephone number and their certification level so I will have a list ready if you are needed. You will be expected to wear a white uniform and make the Pre-Meet briefing each morning you officiate.

Secondly, the monthly meeting of the Executive Committee was postponed because of bad weather and because the Holiday season is so close we will not meet again until the second Wednesday of January. This means we could not act on any four hour rule at Mini Meets. All mail received favors a four hour time limit and the comsensus is that the Executive Board will also vote a four hour limit in effect at the next meeting. My thoughts are that this will be done too late to affect the Shawmut Mini-Meet that has advertised their meet at 6 hours, but I have talked to the meet manager and he is going to do his best to keep the meet as far under this time as possible.

Thirdly, I would like to inform all club Coaches, Presidents, Swimmers and parents of a new swimming publication trying to get on the market. Their main problem is getting a mailing list of interested swimmers. I cannot justify giving the names and addresses of New England swimmers so it will be up to each club or swimmer to give their OK. The name of the magazine is <u>Swimmers Magazine</u>. The cost is nothing for four issues the first year. Their aim is to get six issues a year.

The editor has asked for one favor from our area. They would like us to organize the New England list to cut down on their clerical work and cost in handling individuals interested in taking them up on their free offer. Our way of helping is to mail the subscriptions by clubs. Unattached swimmers can mail theirs to Glenna and she will forward them at the right time.

If you feel your club wants this service write or call Glenna Griswold and let her know how many registration forms you need and she will send them out to you. By the way, the first issue is due out in March.

Fourth, we had an unpleasant surprise when Springfield had to cancel their "AA" meet because it was undersubscribed. (Less than 200 entries for a full two day meet) This is a problem we did not expect. It might have been too early in the season or that New England coaches do not feel they are ready for such action. We do have enough "AA" swimmers to have a successful meet but because of reasons unknown not enough wanted this chance. It is expected the "AA" meet subscriptions will be smaller than an age group "A" meet but they will grow in time just as

Seniors have grown. It is possible next year to have this new catagory set in solid enough so as a swimmer may not move down to an "A" meet after making "AA" times. When this happens it will mean New England is getting closer to National top times and we will be getting more swimmers to the Nationals.

Lastly, the Competitive Swim News (a National Newsletter that comes out bi-monthly) found it could not send an issue to all swimmers. The cost was prohibitive. They are now taking subscriptions and the cost is \$8.50 per year. The newsletter contains what they claim to be all the AAU swim news and they will mail it first class. We have been reproducing this newsletter and sending it to member clubs but we also find it a big problem we cannot control until they have a more organized printing. I feel it is a very informative paper and does contain a lot of pertinent information on all of the National Committees. It is usually a lengthy letter of thirty to forty pages on all aspects of AAU and FINA goings on.

Again I wish you a HAPPY HOLIDAY and GOOD SWIMMING in our New Year.

- Mearing proper attire. Referrees, starters and stroke and turn judges should wear white. Timers and other officials if possible should wear white but will not be required to do so.
- 2. Review and Recertification Clinics. Major clinics will be run at conveniently located places in Mew England for the purpose of review and recertification in addition to certification of Mew England swimming officials. These clinics will be run at least once a year hopefully in the Fall near the start of the swimming season.
