New England Seed Card

At the last Executive Committee meeting a standard New England seed card was adopted for use when clubs running meets want cards made out by those attending the meet. It is designed so that those working with the card the most can get the information they need quickly. Clubs running meets may use cards of their own design for their meets, however they must provide the clubs attending with cards in this case... or make out the cards themselves as in the past.

Those clubs on the New England mailing list have been provided with a sheet that can be duplicated on an electronic stencil and used on a standard mimeograph machine or taken to a printer and made up. Cards will print 4/81/2 x 11 sheet.

Cards should be Yellow for Boys and Pink for Girls. They should also be on card stock not paper.

These will be the required cards for Seniors and Age Group Championships.

RUCE CLARIFICATION: There has been some confusion on the Breaststroke and Butterfly turn and finish rules. Below is what we hope is a clarification of these rules in regards to the hands.

When a swimmer is doing the IM, the completion of the butterfly and the breaststroke is a turn, not a finish and the hands must touch simultaneously but the turn may be anticipated.

When a swimmer is doing a leg of the Medley Relay, each leg is an official finish and finish rules apply.

The Globe's All-Scholastic swimming team

There are many aspects of high school swimming that make it a bit different from other high school sports.

While the top high school players in the team sports can go an entire varsity career without facing each other, the best swimmers are brought together at the end of each season to face each other in sectional, state and New England competition.

The result is the very best in high school swimming with the high level of competition bringing out the best in the best high school swimmers in Massachusetts.

Of the 22 championships earned at this year's state and New England championships, 14 were earned by members of the 1979 Globe All-Scholastic swim team. Six members of Seekonk's New England championship team dominate the team as well as Seekonk coach Ellis Mayers, this year's coach of the year.

Seekonk places three repeaters from its 400-freestyle relay team, seniors Brian Seeley and John Kaczowka and junior Shaun Dolan.

The two individual repeaters are this year's swimmer of the Year, diver Andy Pallotta of Medford, and Haverhill's Palmer Lewis, All-Scholastic in the 500-freestyle.

And, if you like off-beat stuff consider this: This year's "swimmer" of the Year spends less than 10 seconds in the pool while performing his event. Lexington's Scott Whitelaw, an all-scholastic as a freshman, missed a chance to repeat as a sophomore because he broke his arm in a pool-side fall while celebrating his team's win over Gardner last year; and Norm Schippert made the All-Scholastic team despite the fact his school (Chelmsford) doesn't have a swimming team. Schippert's individual performance in the sectionals and state championships earned him All-Scholastic honors.

FOR OVER 25's ONLY.....

Every now and then Newsletter Plus writes something about Master's Swimming in New England and suggests to its readers that they might want to compete in their own age group for their health. Dr. Phillip Whitten who is the President of the North Shore Pirana's parents group is a Master's Champion. A former age-grouper and collegiate swimmer he was "out of the water" for six years and started swimming again to get himself back in shape although he didn't feel that he was actually out of shape. He joined a Masters group and has been swimming that program for about eight years. Recently, Dr. Whitten had an article in Family Health magazine giving information and some facts and figures about Masters swimming that we thought might interest some of you. In addition Parade magazine on May 20th will carry an additional article by Dr. Whitten. Look for it.

It is impossible to reprint all of the <u>Family Health</u> article, but the few excerpts below may give you food for thought.....

"Aging experts have long believed that after age 25, most people begin to deteriorate physically at the rate of about one percent per year. But studies have always concentrated on typical Americans: often fat, out of shape, probably smoking and drinking too much. How much of the decline, then, is really due to aging and how much to unhealthy living and decreased activity?"

Below is a box telling how you can figure what your maximum intensity for exercise should be. In a ten year project directed by Fred Kasch, MD a leading gerontologist, the conclusion was reached that you can forestall that 1% decline per year by regular exercise at 86%. Dr. Paul Hutinger, MD, of Western Illinois University, an active Masters swimmer confirmed Dr Kasch's facts on his own using himself as one of his subjects..."Hutinger showed that by training regularly at 80 percent intensity or higher, most Masters swimmers will have the physical abilities of an untrained person 20 or 30 years younger. Ponce de Leon searched in vain for the Fountain of Youth that Masters swimmers have found."

How Much Should You Swim?

There's no way around it.

If you want maximum benefit for your heart from exercise, you are going to have to make your body do a lot of work.

How much exercise should you do? The American Heart Association answers the question this way:

First of all, on three nonconsecutive days of the week, take your pulse immediately after exercising vigorously. (Place your finger on the back side of your wrist or the side of your neck and count the beats for five seconds. Then multiply that number by 12. The answer will be your heartbeats per minute.) You should be working out so that your heartbeats during exercise remain at about 80 percent of their maximum attainable rate for at least 20 minutes. If you stay below this rate, you won't strengthen your heart.

How do you know what your maximum attainable heart rate (MHR) is? You can calculate this figure—which is the highest number of beats per minute of which your heart is capable—by subtracting your age from 220. Thus, if you are 40, your MHR is about 180, and 80 percent of that maximum figure would be 144.



Shawmut Aquatic will sponsor a certification clinic on October 16th for timers and stroke and turn people.



Certification Chairmen, Ralph Boone and Don Benson are beginning to schedule clinics. They ask that you give them at least one months notice.

As soon as the bidding date closes, Calendar/Sanction Chairman, Dick Schafer will hold a meeting to award meets for the January through April season. More and more clubs are bidding meets and the competition is getting stiffer for those who want them. Clubs running meets should keep in mind that how well their meets run, how well the rules are followed, and the feedback Dick gets are all important when the final decisions are made.

Top Ten Chairman, Sylvia Chase, has met with her committee to do the final work on Long Course Top Ten. At their meeting it was decided to do away with the card system and go back to using results. This decision makes it imperative that those typing results put the proper information on them. The most common errors involve ages for 10 & Under events that have 8 and Unders swimming in them, Open events that have all age groups in them and leaving the name of the meet and the code sheets off the results that are sent to the office.

1979-80 New England (8 & Under) Time Standards

Under the current procedure of having only "A" and "non-A" times, the standard is arrived at by adding 5% to the 1980 Age Group (S.C.) Cut-Off. The "non-A" person is eligible for any "B" or "C" meet in New England choosing to offer an 8&U category. This method has been in effect since November 1978.

The <u>alternate proposal</u> is to return to the procedure of having "A" and "B" (and therefore "C") standards as with other age groups. These standards are chosen as 5% faster than 1980 Age Groups for "A" and 20% slower for "B". The intention is to ease the 8 year old "A" swimmer's transition into 9-10 where the "C" National time is significantly faster yet.

This Age Group Chairman would like to remind everyone that there are no 8&U's nationally for definite reasons, mainly having to do with keeping it low key. I personally do not favor their inclusion in championship meets believing that the attrition rate for this age group is distressingly high for such reasons. However, this is opinion only; until we have a computer to help follow the statistics...please bring comments to the upcoming general meeting or contact:

Effective June 1, 1979 and until May 1, 1980 the "one-piece" provision of AAU Swimming Rule 223.11(1) will not be enforced in short-course swimming competition sanctioned by the AAU. Suits must still be "non-transparent and conform to the current concept of the appropriate." The one-piece rule still applies to long course competition.

WORKING REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW ENGLAND CLUBS AT COMMITTEE PUN MEETS

THE FOLLOWING PROPOSAL WAS PRESENTED AND PASSED AT THE SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING IN SEPTEMBER. PLEASE READ THIS AND BE FAMILIAR WITH IT. ALL CLUBS ATTENDING THE CHRISTMAS MEET, AGE GROUPS AND SENIORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO FULFILL THEIR REQUIREMENTS AS OUTLINED.

x x x

Please Note: In the case of very large meets such as Minter Age Groups we will probably have more workers than we need, but clubs should not assume anything until they are told that their people are not needed they should plan on working.

THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBES HOW THE WORK WILL BE DIVIDED AND WHAT THE PENALTY WILL BE FOR NOT HONORING THE COMMITMENT:

- 1. EACH JOB THAT MUST BE DONE IS ASSIGNED A VALUE IN WORK UNITS.
- 2. EACH CLUB ENTERING THE MEET IS ASSIGNED A NUMBER OF WORK UNITS THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PER SESSION ENTERED.
- 3. CLUBS MUST FILL OUT THEIR MORK SHEETS IN ADVANCE OR THEIR ENTRY WILL BE RETURNED.
- 4. ANY CLUB WHO IS ASSIGNED AT A SESSION FOR A PARTICULAR JOB THAT DOES NOT PROVIDE THE WORKER FOR THAT JOB ON TIME WILL HAVE THEIR ENTRY PULLED AT THE BULLPEN FOR THAT SESSION OF THE MEET. *
 - * If a particular assignment is not filled by the club scheduled and the job can be filled by another club the swimmers will be allowed to swim, but the club that did not show up will be fined and not allowed to swim the next committee run meet until the fine is paid.
 - If noone can be found to fill in the swimmers will be pulled from events until a worker can be found to fill the spot. When a worker is found the swimmers will again be allowed to swim their events, but if the spot is filled by another club the fine will apply.
- 5. A SHEET WILL BE PROVIDED WITH THE ENTRY SHEETS AND ALL CLUBS WILL HAVE THE CHOICE OF DOING THEIR UNITS IN TIMING ONLY, HOWEVEP, EVERY CLUB WITH 20 OR MORE INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE TIMERS OR RELIEF TIMERS FOR AT LEAST ONE SESSION OF THE MEET.

THOSE WITH UNDER 20 INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES MAY DO THEIR WORK UNITS IN ANOTHER AREA.
