NEW ENGLAND SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS:

There has been some confusion about the time standards for New England Senior Championships. The time standards will be the ones printed in the entry sheet which has been mailed to the teams, not the ones which were previously printed in Newsletter Plus. These time standards will be used for this season only and will be carefully evaluated before the next New England Senior Championships. Entries are due by March 4, 1985. The information director is Mike Parratto, 603-742-5153.

INFORMATION ABOUT AGE GROUPS:

Age Group Championships will be a trials and finals format for 11 & 12 and 13 & 14 age groups. The meet will be presented with no penalty for nO-shows in the preliminary heats (morning sessions).

Please note the following scratch rules, since this is the first time Age Groups have been run in this format:

- (1) Any swimmer who competes in a preliminary heat and fails to notify the Referee of his intention to withdraw from the final within the 30 minute deadline after the announcement of the final qualifiers for that event, will be barred from all subsequent competition for the meet.
- (2) Any swimmer who does not positively check in with the Clerk of Course by the deadline for the 1000 and 1650 freestyle events will not be seeded in the event. (The deadline for the 1000 will be 8 a.m. on Friday; March 8; the deadline for the 1650 will be 7 p.m. on Saturday, March 9.)

UNITED STATES SWIMMING ADULT MEMBERSHIPS:

At the United States Swimming convention which was held last fall, it was voted that membership in United States Swimming would be required of all adults who: (1) coach USS registered teams; (2) vote as delegates LSC annual meeting; (3) serve as deck officials of USS sanctioned meets (referees, starters, and stroke and turn judges). A membership form was published in the December issue of Newslatter Plus; need another one, contact the New England office.

The following articles are reprinted from Swimming World Magazine, February, 1985.

New Membership Rules

As voted upon by the USS House of Delegates last September in Indianapolis, Ind., three new membership rules will go into effect on Jan. 1. 1985. All three have created "a bit of a stir" in some LSCs, and as a result, several U.S. Swimming staff members have been asked the consequences of non-compliance.

The rule changes that deal with membership are:

- 1. Meet directors, judges, starters, referees and stroke and turn judges must be members of USS.
- 2. All coaches of USS registered athletes must be members of USS.
- 3. All members of the House of Delegates must be members of

On request from U.S. Swimming Executive Director Ray Essick, Legislative Committee chairman Barney Favaro has answered the questions regarding non-compliance. His answers appear below.

1. The deck officials named cannot serve until they show proof of USS membership.

2. USS clubs cannot enter swim-mers in USS competition until they show proof of coach USS membership. The question that may arise here concerns nonmember coaches who wish to enter USS registered swimmers in unattached competition.

3. No person may serve as a delegate to the LSC House until he shows proof of USS membership. If anyone wishes to challenge this interpretation, they may petition the officers to assign original jurisdiction to the Board of Directors or to the National Board of Review for final determination.

Amendments Explained

There have been more than a few questions about the three amendments, approved at the 1984 USS Annual Meeting, which deal specifically with membership in United States Swimming. Note below the wording which will appear in the 1985 edition of USS Rules and Regulations:

- 1. 220:5 Any coach of athlete members shall join the Corporation as a member.
- 2. 341,3(2) All meet directors, referees, starts and stroke and turn judges, serving in an official capacity in the sanctioned event, shall be members of United States Swiming.
- 3. 563.1(2) Eligibility—Only current and members of United States Swimming are eligible to be members of the LSC House of Delegates.

The first amendment means that all coaches, including those designated as "temporary" or "part-time" coaches, must be members of United States Swimming. This membership requirement directly affects the membership of a club within USS. One of the requirements of a USS club is that all of its coaches must be members of United States Swimming. Such nullification would directly affect the club's liability insurance coverage through United States Swimming.

The second amendment requires all officials serving as meet directors, referees, starters and/or stroke and turn judges are required to be members of United States Swimming. Trainees in these positions, having no official status at a swimming competition, are not required to have memberships but are strongly

recommended. It is also recommended that all officials, serving in an official capacity at a USS sanctioned meet join United States Swimming. However, membership for these other officials is not manda-

The third amendment means that all persons who are voting members of the Local Swimming Committee's House of Delegates (committee chairman, board members, at-large members, club representatives, etc.) must be current members of United States Swimming. Some LSCs have interpreted this amendment to mean that all members of a swimming club's Board of Directors or all club officers must be members of United

States Swimming. Again, while membership in United States Swimming is encouraged for any person working with or interested in swimming, membership is required only for those voting representatives of the LSC's House of Delegates.

ADULT REGISTRATION:

There still seems to be some confusion about adult registration in United States Swimming. It is now a requirement that the following adults must be registered in United States Swimming: (1) All coaches and other adults who are on deck with the swimmers; (2) All meet managers, referees, starters, stroke and turn judges; (3) All team representatives at the Annual Meeting of New England Swimming.

Adult registration costs \$15 (or \$25 for a family) and includes a rule book as well as insurance.

REPORT OF THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE:

At the March board meeting of New England Swimming, the following recommendations of the Technical Committee, Bruce Schaefer, chairman, were discussed and accepted.

- 1. The format and schedule that is being presented for the coming year can be kept from year to year. A team that has sponsored a well-run meet one year will be given the right of first refusal on the same meet the next year.
- 2. A C-B meet will give C swimmers first consideration; if the meet is over-subscribed, the B swimmers will be cut first by postmark; if necessary, the C swimmers will be cut by postmark.
 - A B-C meet will give B swimmers first consideration; if the meet is over-subscribed, the C swimmers will be cut first by postmark; if necessary, the B swimmers will be cut by postmark.
 - A B-A meet will give B swimmers first consideration; if the meet is over-subscribed, the A swimmers will be cut first by postmark; if necessary, the B swimmers will be cut by postmark.
 - An A-B meet will give A swimmers first consideration; if the meet is over-subscribed, the B swimmers will be cut first by time; if necessary, the A swimmers will be cut by time.
 - (All meets with A swimmers will include AA, AAA, etc. swimmers.)
- 3. Meet events will not be mandated by the schedule. The teams may bid whatever they would like to bid, and the Calendar Committee will review the bids and make any changes in events needed to provide a balanced offering of all events.
- 4. Dual meets will not be on the schedule; teams may schedule their own dual meets.
- 5. Meet entries must be sent to all New England teams at least four weeks before the meet is scheduled; meet entries must be received by the sponsoring team 14 days before the first day of the meet.
- 6. Eight and unders will be allowed at a meet if the team sponsoring the meet wishes to run 8 and under events.
- 7. The championship meets will be as follows:

Seniors and Age Groups will remain as they are this year. Cuts will be the 32nd time from this year's meet.

Eight and under championships will remain as they were this year. The 32nd time will be the cut time, also.

B championships will be B through Age Group cuts. A swimmer may not swim the same event in two championship meets. (excluding Seniors).

- C championships will include only C swimmers in each event.
- 8. There will be established cuts for relays at championship meets.
- 9. New England, through the Calendar Committee, will enforce the rules to run meets and the responsibilities of the sponsoring teams.

NEWSLETTER PLUS JULY 1985

REIMBURSEMENTS:

The reimbursement policy for Long Course Junior Nationals and Senior Nationals will be similar to the policy for this past Short Course season.

The reimbursement for Senior Nationals, to be held in Mission Viejo, California, will be based on the lowest coach air fare (\$278). New England swimmers who swim individual events in Senior Nationals will receive a reimbursement of 100% of the air fare (\$278). Relay swimmers who qualified the original relay team will receive 30% and relay swimmers who swim as substitutes will receive 20%.

The reimbursement for Junior Nationals, to be held in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, will be based on the lowest coach air fare (\$240). New England swimmers who place in the finals will receive 100%; swimmers who place in consolations will receive 90%; all other individual swimmers will receive 80%. Relay swimmers who swam on the qualifying team will receive 30%, and substitutes will receive 20%.

At the July board meeting, it was voted that in the future the reimbursement will be set in the following manner. Each year at the board meeting preceding the Annual Meeting, the Board will discuss the revenues available to reimburse the Junior National and Senior National qualifiers and will establish a reimbursement policy for that year that at a minimum reimburses 100% of the lowest coach air fare for Senior National qualifiers and 50% of the lowest coach air fare for Junior National qualifiers. Relay swimmers will be considered as the funds are available. The reimbursement policy for each year will be announced at the Annual Meeting and published in Newsletter Plus at the same time.

New England Swimming recently reimbursed 40 New England swimmers, representing nine teams, who swam at Junior Nationals and Senior Nationals.

SLIDE SHOW:

The new United States Swimming Speakers Bureau Audio-Visual Presentation is available through the New England Swimming office. The presentation has been designed by Phillips Petroleum, the sponsor of Senior National Swimming, and United States Swimming and features John Naber as spokesman.

The 13-minute show includes a set of 80 slides, a soundtrack cassette, and suggestion for presenting the program. It is an excellent aid in introducing and promoting organized competitive swimming to any age group. It demonstrates how large scale achievements begin with participation at the grass roots level.

Teams may reserve the presentation through the New England office. There will be a \$35 deposit fee for the program which will be returned to the team when the slide show is returned to the office.

AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MEETS AND PACILITIES:

At its July meeting the New England Swimming Board formed an Ad Hoc Committee on Meets and Facilities which will be chaired by Steve Pike. The purpose of the committee is to see what can be done to encourage more teams to run meets and to locate more facilities to be used for meets.

Steve is particularly interested in learning about facilities that New England may use for meets, especially 50-meter pools. If you know of a facility that might possible be used for meets, he would appreciate a description of the pool, locker room facilities, etc., with Polaroid picures, if possible, and also the name of a contact person.

NATIONAL AGE GROUP DISTANCE MEET:

Last November a National Age Group Distance Meet was announced in Newsletter Plus. Swimmers swam at various locations, and the results were mailed to a central location for tabulation.

Nine and ten year olds swam 1000 yards; Il and 12 year olds swam 2000 yards; 13 through 18 year olds swam 3000 yards. Recently, the top 50 swimmers in each age and sex were announced in <u>Swimming World</u>, and several New England swimmers were listed.

A MESSAGE TO THE ATHLETES:

(Prom Kim Shire, Senior Athletes Representative)

From September 10 thru September, 15 I attended the United States Aquatic Seminar in Phoenix Arizona. I was one of about fifty athlets ranging from Region level swimmers to multiple Olympic gold medalists. There were swimmers from all over the United States, this gave me a chance to find out what swimming is like in other areas of our country.

The purpose of this annual seminar is to update existing rules, approve national meet locations, and recieve information to bring back to our local swim committees. The job of the athletes is to voice the opinion of swimmers around the United States. Athletes hold twenty percent of the votes on every committee, thus we hold some power, which is important since we are swimming.

The major issue at this years convention was National Junior Olympics. Some people wanted to do away with it because they felt that it took away from the Senior National meet, especially when coaches held swimmers back for a variety of reasons. The athletes, as a single body, came up with the idea of keeping JO's but as soon as a swimmer makes Senior Nationals he must move on in that event. The idea was accepted and will begin in 1987. For this year only swimmers who make Senior Nationals and go may move back down to Junior Nationals.

If anyone has any questions or suggestions of their own feel free to contact Scott Latch (WESC), junior athlete representative or myself (BGSC). We both attend most of the meets, so we are available, and are open to any ideas of yours. You must communicate with us because our job is to represent you.

- AB-Rirst consideration is given to swimmers with "A" or better times; "B" swimmers may swim if there is room.
- BA--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "A" and better times may swim if there is room.
- BC--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "C" or no times may swim if there is room.
- CB--First consideration is given to swimmers with "C" or no times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.
- CUTS: Meets that are over subscribed will be cut as follows:
 - AB--"B" swimmers are cut by time; if all "B" swimmers have been cut, "A" swimmers are cut by time.
 - BA--"A" swimmers are cut by postmark; if all "A" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - BC--"C" swimmers are cut by postmark; if all "C" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - CB--"B" swimmers are cut by postmark; if all "B" swimmers have been cut, "C" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - Mini-meets and specialty meets--cut by postmark.

AWARDS:

- AB--Medals will be given to the top 6 (or 8 in the case of an 8-lane pool) swimmers (whether entered with "A" or "B" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 "B" swimmers who finish with "B" times.
- BA--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 "B" swimmers achieving "B" times.
- BC--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 swimmers achieving "B" times (whether entered with "B" or "C" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 "C" swimmers who vinish with "C" times.
- CB--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 swimmers achieving "C" times.
- Mini-meets and specialty meets--Ribbons to the top 6 finishers.
 - At all meets appropriate "B", "A", "AA", etc. achievement cards should be written.

ENTRY FEES:

AB-- (or if medals are awarded) up to \$1.70; \$4 per relay

BA, BC, CB--up to \$1.25; \$3 per relay

Meets with trials and finals may charge up to \$2.50. \$6 per relay

Mini-meets and specialty meets may charge up to \$1.25 unless given permission to charge another fee when they received their bid.

SURCHARGES:

AB--30¢ per individual event;

BA, BC, CB--15¢ per indivual event

Note: In all cases "A" refers to "A" and better times.

Championships and specialty meets may have different awards and entry fees which will be established at the time the bid is awarded.

NEW ENGLAND BOARD MEETING:

The November meeting of the New England Swimming Board will be at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November, 19, 1985, at the Holiday Inn on Grove Street, Newton (just off Route 128). The meetings are always open to the swimming public.

AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MEETS AND FACILITIES:

The committee, chaired by Stephen Pike, is still trying to locate pools especially 50 meter pools. Any teams that know of 50 meter pools, please contact Steve, even if the team (or pool) would need some help in running a meet.

The committee would also like to hear from people who have ideas about why there were so few long-course meets in 1985. The committee comments, "We have asked twice before and the apathetic response has been under-whelming in light of the overwhelming complaints after the summer season's lack of long-course meets. We want to solve this problem now; the board has it as an agenda item for the next meeting, and the committee needs your input."

"UNATTACHED" STATUS EXPLAINED:

Information concerning the "unattached" status has been received from USSwimming. The status of an athlete when competing in a USSwimming sanctioned event may be determined by the athlete involved, parents of the athlete (if a minor) or the club the athlete represents.

Registered swimmers in United States Swimming have the right, at any time and at any point in a USS competition, to declare themselves "un-attached." This may be accomplished in one of the following ways:

- 1. The athlete enters the competition having indicated on the meet entry form that he/she will be competing without a club affiliation.
- 2. If entered in the competition "attached" to a club, the athlete or the athlete's designee must contact the clerk of course and indicate that the club affiliation of the athlete should be changed to reflect the "unattached" status for the specified event(s).

A LETTER TO THE COACHES:

Recently I attended the United States Aquatic Sports National Convention as a voting delegate and a member of the New England delegation (six voting representatives). It was quite an experience to be part of the future of our sport and to see the way decisions are made.

The next week I attended the American Swimming Coaches' Association World Clinic in Fort Lauderdale. There were at least thirteen coaches from New England among the 1,000 plus attending. This clinic was both an educational forum and a legislative meeting concerning our profession.

The most important point I gathered from these two prestigious aquatic conventions is that each one of us <u>must be involved</u> in our sport, our profession. The first step is to join. You must be a coach member of USS (\$15) in order to be on deck at any New England Swimming or USS sanctioned event. This registration also carries important liability insurance in conjunction with your club's registration. Second, each of us should be a member of ASCA (\$30). To not belong is to put the fate of our profession at risk. Then once you join, volunteer your opinions and your time--join committees, speak up!

Also, there are several publications that are key to keeping track of the happenings in USS. There are commercial magazines that we all know about, but there are also professional journals—among them are <u>United States</u> <u>Swimming News</u> (\$10 with USS registration), <u>ASCA Newsletter</u> (free with membership), and our own <u>Newsletter Plus</u> (\$7-one subscription free to each New England registered club). I have found these journals among others to be very helpful.

As I mentioned, one of my prime reasons for attending the conventions was to come back with information on the "certification" issues facing American swimming coaches. There are really two different types of certifications being implemented; Safety Training for Coaches and a separate ASCA program.

The Safety Training program will be mandated by some time next year for all USS-registered coaches. It will require that we each have a current First Aid certificate (any level), CPR (any level) and a specified Safety Training for Coaches card. The latter will most likely be available through the Red Cross. USS is working with the Red Cross on specifications including who will be eligible to teach this program as well as the curriculum.

The ASCA certification program is more contraversial, but is only a product or a service offered by ASCA to its members. It is not now, and supposedly will not be, mandated. You may choose to use this service if you wish. There will be five levels with each level including educational credits with the top three levels having performance criteria. Each level of certification will cost \$10, so the maximum cost ever is \$50. The program is underwritten by the Finals. For more information on this program or to join ASCA, please write to ASCA, 1 Hall of Fame Drive, Fort Lauderdate, FL 33316.

The final issue for this edition of Newsletter Plus for me is that of the workings of the New England Board of Directors under its chairman, Don Carper. Things are very organized now with most of the emphasis on returning funds to the athlete. The new budget included more national submission money and zone funding than ever with additional funds for programs directed to the developing swimmers. If you have any ideas on ways to benefit the up-and-coming athletes (books, lectures, films, anything), please contact me or any other board member so that the money will be spent well.



APPROVED MEETS:

Word has been received from USSwimming that effective January 1, 1986 USS Clubs and USS-member Leagues shall not host approved-category meets without the express, written permission of the USS National Headquarters Office. A Club or League shall submit its request for permission to the Vice-Chairman of the Local Swimming Committee in which it resides. The LSC shall then forward the request, with a recommendation for approval or rejection, to USS National Headquarters at least thirty (30) days in advance of the meet.

This procedure is adopted on the advice of insurance and legal counsel to the President on ways in which USS must reduce its liability exposure and anticipated insurance costs. More details will follow shortly.

To New England Swimmers,

WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING? IS IT WHAT IT USED TO BE OR IS IT BETTER? IF YOU COULD CHANGE ONE THING, ANY THING, IN NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING WHAT WOULD IT BE? DO YOU THINK THAT THE ADULT RUN WORLD ALLOWS US KIDS TO GIVE OUR TWO CENTS WORTH?

These are a few questions I think are very important. If the athletes aren't happy with the situation of swimming in New England than let's do something about it, let's get some power, some say and then voice our opinions. From the responses, or lack of them, I get the impression that everyone is pleased with the way swimming is run. Over-all I think it is run well but I know that I have some questions and complaints, I'm sure that you all do too.

At the last New England swimming committee meeting the financial situation was discussed. A new area was added, this is called the <u>All Athletes Fund</u>. It is for <u>all</u> the athletes of New England, not just the ones who make Junior or Senior Nationals. We hope to use it mainly for the "grass-roots" swimmers if I may call them that. As of yet I don't really have any ideas as to what we should do with the money, about \$2,000 for this season. If you get any inspirations tell me and I'll suggest them to the board. Remember this is your money.

Another thing that was accomplished at the meeting dealt with the national convention. Previously we have always sent one rep., to me that was dumb. By the time I finally understood everything that was going on it was over. From now on this LSC (Local Swim Committee) will send both athlete reps, one experienced and the other one to tag along and learn so the next year that person will be experienced. This way we'll be able to do something on the national level.

It was also decided that communications between the athletes needs to be better. At this time I am trying to obtain an athlete from every single team to be my contact. This person will relay the voice of his of her team to Scott Latch (athlete jr. rep.) or me. We will then relay the voices of the teams to the board. In doing this we hope to get all of the athletes involved. If you are interested please fill out the following information.

TYPES OF MEETS:

- AB-First consideration is given to swimmers with "A" or better times; "B" swimmers may swim if there is room.
- BA--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "A" and better times may swim if there is room.
- BC--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "C" or no times may swim if there is room.
- CB--First consideration is given to swimmers with "C" or no times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.
- CUTS: Meets that are over subscribed will be cut as follows:
 - AB--"B" swimmers are cut by time; if all "B" swimmers have been cut,
 "A" swimmers are cut by time.
 - BA--"A" swimmers are cut by post wrk; if all "A" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - BC--"C" swimmers are cut by postmark; if all "C" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - CB--"B" swimmers are cut by postmark; if all "B" swimmers have been cut, "C" swimmers are cut by postmark.
 - Mini-meets and specialty meets--cut by postmark.

AWARDS:

- AB--Medals will be given to the top 6 (or 8 in the case of an 8-lane pool) swimmers (whether entered with "A" or "B" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 "B" swimmers who finish with "B" times.
- BA--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 "B" swimmers achieving "B" times.
- BC--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 swimmers achieving "B" times (whether entered with "B" or "C" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 "C" swimmers who finish with "C" times.
- CB--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 "C" swimmers achieving "C" times. Mini-meets and specialty meets--Ribbons to the top 6 finishers.
 - At all meets appropriate "B", "A", "AA", etc. achievement cards should be written.

Meets with trials and finals may charge up to \$2.50. \$6 per relay

Mini-meets and specialty meets may charge up to \$1.25 unless given permission to charge another fee when they received their bid.

SURCHARGES:

AB--30¢ per individual event;

BA, BC, CB--15¢ per indivual event

Note: In all cases "A" refers to "A" and better times.

Championships and specialty meets may have different awards and entry fees which will be established at the time the bid is awarded.
