At its January meeting the New England Swimming Board approved Nikki Shire (BGSC) as the new Junior Athlete Representative and Barbard Gould (coach, CSSM) as the new Junior Coach Representative...

#### MEET CORRECTIONS:

EIGHT AND UNDER CHAMPIONSHIPS: Some of the times included in the entry are incorrect. Correct times are in this newsletter.

AGE GROUP AND SENIOR QUALIFIER: The oldest age group should be SENIOR so that swimmers who are attempting to qualify for the Senior Championship may enter even if they are older or younger than 15 to 18.

NEW ENGLAND TRAVEL FUND SURCHARGE: There is a surcharge fo \$1.00 per swimmer at each championship meet. Although this information was included on the summary sheet for Age Groups, it was not included in the meet information.

#### NEW POLICY AFFECTING ATHLETE REGISTRATION:

At the recent convention, a new policy was recommended by the USS Registration/Membership Committee and subsequently apported at the USS Board of Directors meeting. The policy states that a Local Swimming Committee may impose a fine of up to \$100 per event against a person signing a document which indicates a swimmer is properly registered with United States Swimming for a meet when in fact that swimmer is not properly registered.

This policy is an option for the Local Swimming Committee. At its January meeting the Board of New England Swimming voted to accept this policy.

The Board of New England Swimming will meet at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, February 9, 1988 at the Harvard Community Health Plan Office on Route 9 in Welleseley, MA.

NOTE: These yard times are for the Fight and under Championship only. There will be different yard times for entering Eight and under events during the Long Course Age Group Championships.

#### VERIFICATION AT CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS:

Complete information for verification of entry times <u>must</u> be submitted prior to the start of the first event of each championship meet. For the Bronze Championships the seed time must verified: for all other championship meets the cut time must be verified.

A third line has been included on the championship entry forms which allows room for a verification code. Codes for New England meets have been included and the results of these meets will be available at each championship meet. For all other meets you must include your own code and also bring the result of the meet with you. Be sure to label the results with the code placed on the verification sheet.

A verification packet which includes the verification information and the results of all non-New England calendar meets used for verification must be brought to the verification desk prior to the start of the first event of each championship meet. Be sure each packet is labeled with the name of the championship meet, the coach and the team. The packet should be picked up by the coach at the end of the meet. The verification information should not be included with the entry submitted to the host team, but a copy of the entry with the verification information must be submitted in the verification packet. The packet should include only non-New England calendar meets that are being used for verification.

Verification will be checked for each swimmer who does not make the cut in an event or who scratches, false starts, or disqualifies. If the verification for these swimmers has not been included or can not be checked, the swimmer will receive an administrative DQ and will not be able to swim any more in the meet. If the verification table at the Silver and Bronze championships receives proof that a swimmer has swum faster than the fastest time allowable for the event, the swimmer will receive an administrative DQ and will not be able to swim any more in the meet

NOTE: THE VERIFICATION PACKET MUST BE TURNED INTO THE VERIFICATION TABLE BEFORE ANY SWIMMER ON THE TEAM COMPETES.

#### BREASTSTROKE:

I've received favorable comments on my last attempt at clarification of the backstroke, so here goes the breaststroke. This is directly out of the current NCAA Rule Book.

"BREASTSTROKE

Article 2 a. The forward start shall be used.

- b. A stroke cycle shall consist of one arm stroke followed by one leg kick. Each time the swimmer's hands begin their sideward and/or downward press, a new stroke cycle shall have been started. Drifting apart of the hands shall not constitute the start of a stroke cycle.
- c. The body shall be kept in the prone position with the shoulders in a horizontal plane. This prescribed body position shall be attained by the beginning of the first stroke cycle after the start and after each turn and shall be maintained at all times except when the swimmer is turning.
- d. All forward and backward components of motion of the two arms shall be simultaneous; and, at any given time except when the swimmer is turning or finishing a race, corresponding points on both hands shall be in the same horizontal plane. The hands shall be pushed forward together from the chest and shall be brought back simultaneously on or under the surface of the water. The hands shall not be brought back beyond the hipline except during the first stroke cycle after the start and after each turn when the swimmer may take one arm stroke with the hands coming back to the thighs. There shall be no sculling with the hands at the end of the first arm stroke following the start and each turn.
  - e. All forward and backward components of motion of the two legs shall be simultaneous; and, at any given time except when the swimmer is turning, corresponding points on both feet shall be in the same horizontal plane. The toes of both feet must be turned laterally (by outward rotation of the legs) during each backward movement of the legs, A "dolphin" kick is not permitted. That is, propulsive movements of the feet resulting from flexion with subsequent extension of the knees in a vertical plane are prohibited. Breaking the water surface with the feet shall not constitute a violation unless it is caused by a "dolphin" kick.
  - f. At each turn and at the finish, the touch shall be made with both hands simutaneously. It is permissible when approaching a turn or the finish to drop an arm after the final arm pull before the touch; however, the shoulders must remain in a horizontal plane. Once a legal touch has been made, the swimmer may turn in any manner desired. The shoulders must be at or past the vertical toward the prone position when the feet leave the wall.
  - g. At some time during each stroke cycle, except the first cycle after the start and after each turn, a part of the swimmer's head must break the surface of the water. After the start and after each turn, the swimmer may take one complete stroke cycle while wholly submerged; however, the swimmer's head must then break the surface of the water by the time the swimmer's hands reach the widest part of the second arm stroke after the start and after each turn."

The state in correct in every aspect, but one, at the present time. For this short course season, a swimmer can drop a shoulder along with an arm at the time only. Obviously, this was done to speed up the tume and get better times, However, starting next september, long course and short course rules for breaststroke will be the same and the entire above standard will apply.

"It is assumed, that the head coming out of the water once each complete cycle will be for a breath of air. After the breath of air, if the swimmer wishes to duck under water for the rest of the cycle, this is ok.

Another comment, concerned the simutaneous touch. It was felt that a dual touch was achieved if no more than 1 a finger length separated the touch. This obviously is a judgement call. If you feel the swimmer is not attempting a dual touch and

is instead stretching one arm out ahead to touch the pad sooner, then it was not a dual touch and is indeed a violation.

because of the dropped should, swimmers are brushing the wall with one hand while spinning on the other hand. Unless you're over the top, a brush could very likely be a phantom touch. Keep this in mind when the referee asks you, "where were you standing." It seems like walking the sides is becoming a thing of the past unless you have many officials.

What is the Eastern Zone? Many of you ask me this at Age Groups when we are picking the New England Eastern Zone Team. The country is divided into four zones for purposes of swimming championships. Western, Southern, Central, and Eastern. These are geographical as well as by registration. We have twelve LSC's in our Eastern Zone - New England being an LSC-Local Swim Committee. The others in our Zone are: Allegheny Mountain, Adirondack, Connecticut, Maine, Middle Atlantic, Maryland, New England, New Jersey, Niagara, Metropolitan, Potomac Valley, and Virginia. This means we compete at the Zone level with all these LSC's. It means we can travel as far south as somewhere in Virginia, and as far west as Pittsburgh, Pa. We have done both. The meet itself is a trials and finals format for all age groups. It is the best experience for age group swimmers to see top level swimming in each of their respective age groups. Being involved in trials and finals with their own team is a new experience. Whether or not a swimmer goes on to National level, these meets are something one would remember as a great experience. The enthusiasm of all teams in these facilities is something I have never run into anywhere else - certainly not at National meets - most teams are too small.

#### Positive Aspects of this type of competition

Swimmers learn from the experience. Age Groupers that are used to leaving a pool and going shopping or out to see the sights soon realize that to do well at night one must have some afternoon rest. Swimmers learn that is hard to do if half of your room do not want to rest but want to play. Rest does not necessarily mean sleeping - but one should get off their feet - they can play board games, read, watch TV but be off their feet. This is hard to police due to the numbers but no one said life is always fair.

Swimmers meet many people from other teams - this is very positive - some of these friendships last for many years. This is what this sport is all about.

Most swimmers who are the stars in their LSC find out there are others out there just as good - again this is a great learning experience. The better swimmers who may get beaten come home and work that much harder.

Negative Aspects at this level - over ambitious ten and under parents. This age group still does not have their olympic spot ready for them. These children should be allowed to be children. Some will swim well and some will not. If it is too intense then we will drive them out of the sport.

If all of you parents who read this would encourage participation and more importantly encourage proper behavior it would help us in our duties. Now that time trials have been curtailed at the National Level more swimmers in the 14 and over age groups should use this as a stepping stone to Junior Nationals. Relay swimmers cannot take part in time trials at the National level unless they have made an individual event.

This year for the first time 15-18 year olds will be taken to the meet by application only. Hopefully this will mean they want to swim fast.

Having been involved with this type of All-Star Meet - I endorse it completely - since it began in 1980 - I feel it can work if we all support it. It may turn into a Long Course meet in August eventually.

All swimmers should be encouraged to keep their school work up - if they make this team then they will miss three days of school - if work is done consistently over the year then this is not a problem.

#### 1988 EASTERN ZONE ALL-STAR MEET

This year the Eastern Zone Meet will be back in Buffalo at the State University of New York - Amherst Campus. Anyone who went on the trip last year knows that this was an exceptional facility. The meet will be March 30 - April 3, 1988. Travel to Buffalo will be March 30 - Wednesday - the team will compete on the 31st, April 1, and April 2 - then return home on Sunday, April 3, 1988. All swimmers must go on the bus with the team. Each swimmer will receive a team bathing suit, team sweatshirt, and a bathing cap. The team will be picked from Age Groups so a decision to participate must be made on the spot. Each swimmer must have competed in three New England Meets to be eligible to be on the team. #### TYPES OF MEETS:

- A(B)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "A" or better times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.
- B(A)-First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "A" or better times may swim if there is room.
- B(C)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "C" times or no times may swim if there is room.
- C(B)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "C" times or no times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.

#### CUTS: Meets that are over subscribed will be cut as follows:

- A(B)--"B" swimmers are cut by time; if all "B" swimmers have been cut, "A" swimmers are cut by time.
- B(A)--"A" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "A" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.
- B(C)--"C" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "C" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.
- C(B)--"B" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "B" swimmers have been cut,
  "C" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.

Specialty meets-cut by date of receipt.

NOTE-New England Swimming has established "date of receipt" rather than "post-mark" to allow for other methods of delivery-hand, UPS, etc

#### AWARDS:

- A(B)—Medals will be given to the top 6 (or 8 in the case of an 8-lane pool) swimmers (whether entered with "A" or "B" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 (or 8) "B" swimmers who finish with "B" times.
- B(A)--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 (or 8) "B" swimmers achieving "B" times.
- B(C)-Ribbons will be given to the top 6 (or 8) swimmers achieving "B" times (whether entered with "B" or "C" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 (or 8) "C" swimmers who finish with "C" tmes.
- . C(B)--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 (or 8) "C" swimmers achieving "C" times.

Specialty meets--Ribbons will be given to the top 6 (or 8) finishers

NOTE—Championship and specialty meets may have different awards which will be established at the time the bid is awarded.

At all meets appropriate achievement cards should be written for swimmers achieving times at a higher level.

A(B)-(or if medals are awarded) up to \$2.00; 4.60 per relay.

NOTE-Championship and specialty meets may have different entry fees which will be established at the time the bid is granted.

#### REIMBURSEMENT POLICY:

Included in this newsletter is a copy of the new New England Reimbursement Form. Each New England swimmer who desires reimbursement must fill out a form.

In order to be eligible for reimbursement a swimmer must be New England registered and participate in at least one individual event at national championships. In addition, the swimmer must have participated in at least three New England sanctioned calendar meets during the past season.

A New England swimmer who swims in an individual event at Junior Nationals in 1988 will be reimbursed 100; a New England swimmer who swims in an individual event at Senior Nationals in 1988 will be reimbursed \$200. A swimmer who places in the top 16 in one or more individual events will receive an additional \$50.

All forms must be submitted to the New England office within 8 weeks of the meet.

The next meeting of the Board of New England Swimming will be on Tuesday, May 3, 1988 at 7 p.m. at the Harvard Community Health Plan Office, Route 9, Wellesley, MA.

#### INSURANCE:

Included in this newsletter is a summary of the new New England insurance coverage.

At its January Meeting, the USS Board of Directors carefully reviewed and discussed the insurance coverage that has been provided to USS registered athletes. As a result, United States Swimming eliminated retroactively Catastrophic Accident Protection effective December 31, 1987. In its place, USS retroactively implemented an Accident Medical Insurance Program effective January 1, 1988. This change is adopted to better serve a larger number of USS athlete members.

The Report of Occurrence Form which was printed in the December newsletter still should be filed for all accidents. This form is for the liability aspect of the insurance and these reports help USS and NES analyze the various causes and sources of accidents so that more accidents can be prevented in the future.

#### ZONE TEAM:

A letter concerning the Zone Team is included in this newsletter. Please note that the final date of application for 15 to 18 year old swimmers has already passed. Swimmers who are 14 and under will be selected for the team at the Age Group meet.

Swimmers and parents of swimmers who anticipate that they may be invited to join the team should be ready to decide on the spot at Age Groups. Isabelle Fraser would like to invite any parents or swimmers who have questions to come to the Zone Team table at Age Groups and ask whatever questions the parents and swimmers might have.

WE WOULD LIKE TO SEND THE STRONGEST TEAM POSSIBLE TO THE ZONE MEET WHICH IS WHY I AM WRITING AT THIS TIME. Reinbursement requests for swimmers who attended Junior or Senior Nationals this spring must be received in the office within 8 weeks of the meet. Please remember that the forms must be signed by a team representative and a parent or swimmer. Forms that are incomplete will be returned.

#### LONG COURSE REIMBURSEMENT:

At the May Board meeting, the Board veted to reimburse swimmers for any one of three meets this summer. Swimmers may receive reimbursement for Junior Nationals (\$100 plus \$50 for finishing in the top 16); Senior Nationals/Clympic Trials (\$200 plus \$50 for finishing in the top 16); or the ASCA American Final (\$200 plus \$50 for finishing in the top 16).

Swimmers may be reimbursed for only one meet.

Some changes have been made in the reinbursement policy for this summer only. A swimmer who participated in three short course New England calendar meets in 1987—1988 must participate in only two New England calendar meets during long course, 1988 in order to qualify for reinbursement from Junior Nationals or the ASCA meet. A swimmer who has participated in three short course New England calendar meets in 1987—1988 does not have to participate in any New England calendar meets during long course 1988 in order to qualify for reinbursement for Clympic Trials.

#### REIMEURSEMENT FOR US OPEN:

At the May meeting of the New England Swimming Board it was voted to provide reimbursement for New England Swimmins who are representing New England Swimming and participate in the US Open in Indianapolis, Indiana on December 18-20, 1988. The amount will be voted before the Annual Meeting. In order to be eligible for reimbursement, a swimmer must attend three New England calendar meets between May 1, 1988 and December 17, 1988.

#### "COACH MEMBERSHIP" ENFORCEMENT POLICY

The United States Swimming Board of Directors met in Colorado Springs on May 14-15, 1988 and approved the following policy:

"Effective July 1, 1988 --

No person without a "Coach membership" will be allowed to participate in any coaching capacity at any USS sanctioned competition. This restriction will include being barred from the deck area at all local swimming committee, sone, Junior Chympic, national and international qualifying competitions,

If an offending person refuses to comply with these provisions you initial warning, all, athletes on that person's club shall be designated as "unattached" for the entire competition, unless the club has some other USS "coach member?" present.

It shall be the responsibility of the meet referee, or his designee, to enforce these provisions."

In other words all persons acting in a coaching capacity must bear a blue "coach membership" card. To receive ecach's credentials and gain access to the deck as a coach, one must present a blue "coach membership" card.

THIS POLICY WILL BE IN PLACE AT ALL 1988 SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS, INCLUDING THE PHILLIPS 66/U.S. SWIMMING LONG COURSE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (OLYMPIC SELECTION MEET) AND THE U.S. SWIMMING JUNIOR OLYMPIC CHAMPIONSHIPS.

### ENFORCEMENT POLICIES EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1988

#### Enforcement in Membership

When persons apply for opach membership, they must meet the full Coaches Sudaty Curriculum requirement (CPR and first aid) to be registered. They will not be allowed an interim coaching period or a non-athlete membership. (No pink card will be issued.)

#### Enforcement at Meets

No person without a coach membership will be allowed to participate in any coaching capacity at any USS sanctioned competition. This restriction will include being berred from the deck area at all local swimming committee, zone, Junior Olympic, national and international qualifying competitions.

an offending person refuses to comply with these provisions upon nitial warning, all athletes on that person's club shall be designated as unattached" for the entire competition, unless the club has some other USS coach member present.

It shall be the responsibility of the meet referee, or his designee, to enforce these provisions.

#### Enforcement at Practice

Continuous failure of a coach to satisfy the Coaches Safety Curriculum requirement will be grounds for termination of membership and loss of insurance coverages.

Clubs continuing to conduct a program with coaches who have failed to satisfy the Coaches Safety Curriculum requirement shall be grounds for termination of club membership and loss of insurance coverage.

#### Implementation Concerns

The following questions and answers have been reviewed and approved by the Samety Education, Membership and Insurance Committees.

- Q. For 1998 membarship requirements, who must be safety trained?
- A. All coaches, including assistant coaches, must fulfill the Coaches Safety Curriculum requirement. This includes any person who is working with athletes as a "practice supervisor."

- Q. What are the Coaches Safety Curriculum requirements for USS coach weakership?
- A. To fulfill the 1988 USS coach membership requirements, all coaches must show current proof of training in each of the two following areas:
  - 1. Ordiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
  - S. Cost Ed

All course certificates must be valid on the date of application for membership. Coaches should submit copies of the CPR and first aid cartilizates (front and back) as adequate proof of training. The ISC safety and/or membership chairmen are not expected to follow up upon contributes expiration. It will be up to the coach to rensw all certificates as necessary.

- o. What is the "grace" period for a newly hired coach to successfully complete his training in CPR and first aid?
  - proof of training to become a USS coaches. Coaches must show current proof of training to become a USS coach members. No coach may supervise UTS applicates without a coach membership (blue card).
    - Q. What if a parent escorts swimmers to a USS-sanctioned meet without the kappaint of a coach in attendance? Must the parent be a member? Can the athlete participate in the meet?
- A. The arewor here depends on the capacity in which the parent attends the meet. If the parent is simply a "chauffeur" and stays out of the deck area, the parent need not become a USS member nor show proof of safety arearing.

#### TOP TEN

To be named a New England Top Ten swimmer is a big achievement! The swimmer, coach and parents can all be justifiably proud of this recognition for their hard work and dedication to the sport. For some, however, the publication of the Top Ten lists is a time of confusion and disappointment. All too often the sad refrain is heard, "I have a better time than this guy...how dome I didn't make it.?"

We'd like to eliminate some of this confusion by explaining the eligibility requirements for Top Ten times, most especially which meets and events count and events which do not. In next month's bulletin we'll tell you about some of the major 102 h reasons for potential errors and omissions in the Top Ten. Forewarned is forearmed, and we hope you will take the initiative to spot these mistakes and "" " bring them to our attention BEFORE future lists are published. yd samli as

#### SHORT COURSE AND LONG COURSE

Short course refers to events swum in 25 yard pools. The short course Top Tenseason runs from May 1 to April 30 of the following year. This year's 1988 Short Course Top Ten will, therefore, include times achieved between May 1, 1987 and April 30, 1988. Long course refers to events swum in 50 meter pools. The long course Top Ten meason begins on September 1 and ends on August 31 of the following year. Events swim in 25 meter popis are not eligible for either short course or long course Top Ten ranking. STRVE

### NEW ENGLAND CALENDAR MEETS 34 53

The official New England Swimming Calendar for long and short course meets is published in the "Newsletter Plus" and is updated from time to time as needed Top Tenitimes can be achieved at any New England Swimming Calendar Meet held in a 25 yard or 50 meter pool. These include calendar meets held in our Local Swim Committee (LSC) area - Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont, and at ONE Maine club, Nautilus Swim Club (Cape Elizabeth, ME). Organizers automatically forward all results of these meets to the New England Swimming office. We then examine all swimmers' times for possible inclusion and the Top Ten lists. Times achieved at non-calendar meets, including area and state league meets, dual meets, YMCA league meets and Boys Club league meets are NOT eligible for Top Ten ranking. (Do not confuse YMCA league meets with New England Calendar Meets sponsored by member YMCA clubs. Times scored at these calendar meets are, of course, eligible for Top Ten.)

#### OUT-OF-DISTRICT MEETS

Certain out of district meets which are the EQUIVALENT of New England Swimming Calendar Meets and are U.S. Swimming sanctioned are allowed for Top Ten purposes. These include calendar meets from other LSC districts (Maine, Connecticut, etc.) and certain championship meets (Eastern Zone Championships, Junior Qlympics, Senior Nationals, etc.) Feel free to ask whether an out-of-district meet you are contemplating will be eligible for Top Tan consideration. RESULTS FROM OUT-OF-DISTRICT MEETS ARE NOT AUTOMATICALLY FORWARDED TO THE NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING OFFICE. It is the responsibility of the coach, swimmer, or parent to secure a copy of the official results and send it to us.

#### TOP TEN (continued)

#### EVENTS CONSIDERED FOR TOP TEN RANKING

Only events normally swam within an age group receive Top Ten ranking within that age group. For example, a 1650 swam by a twelve-year-old would not be awarded an 11-12 Top Ten ranking, since the event is not normally swam in that age group. Events swam in an open or senior division can count for both Open Top Ten and a specific age group Top Ten, as long as the event is normally swam in that age group. For instance, an outstanding 100 breaststroke time achieved by a fourteen-year-old swimming in a senior or open division could count for both Open and 13-14 Top Ten.

#### EIGHT AND UNDER TOP TEN

Swimmer's aged eight and under may achieve Top Ten times by competing in "Right and Under" events OR in those designated "Ten and Under." Their times are, however, only schedered for the Right and Under Top Ten List, since the 9 and 10 Top Ten List is specifically for swimmers of those ages. COACHES PLEASE NOTE: When entering an eight and under swimmer in an "Under Ten" event, be sure that your swimmer's correct age appears in the official results, so that proper credit can be given!

#### OPEN TOP TEN

The Open Top Ten ranks the overall ten best times achieved during the season in any given event, regardless of the age group in which they were achieved. There is no particular relationship between the Open Top Ten and open divisions offered at some meets. An Open Top Ten time can theoretically be achieved by any swimmer of any age, swimming in any division, as long as the event itself in included in the Open Top Ten jist.

#### RELAY SPLITS

Only electronically timed lead-off relay splits can be submitted for Top Ten consideration. The coach or swimmer must secure a card listing all relevant information (meet, date, swimmer's name, club, age, event, and split time), and have it signed by the meet referee. It is the responsibility of the individual, not the meet organizer, to send the card to New England Swimming. Please note that only rad-off splits can be submitted. Other relay splits will not be accepted.

#### TIME TRIALS AND CONVERTED TIMES.

Meither times achieved in time trials nor converted times (yards to meters or sectors to yards) will be considered for Top Ten ranking.

#### WIMMER BLIGIBILITY

In order to be included in the Top Ten, a swimmer must be registered with New England Swimming. The swimmer must also be currently registered with United States Swimming.

#### THE TASK OF REFEREE

#### JOHN JOHANESSEN, CHAIRMAN

There's not a whole heck of a lot around on Refereeing of Starting. I guess it's just assumed that at that time you will understand all. I'm going to take a shot at getting something down on paper and would appreciate any additional comments. Hopefully in a year or two New England will have a good handout from which to progress. Please don't feel that you have to have years of experience to make a comment, I'll take a good idea from anywhere.

The rules say that the buck stops with the Referee. This person is God, he or she can change anything, rule on anything, and is the last word on everything. Only a fool goes in feeling like that, if you do you're sure to go down in flaming glory.

It has been my experience that odd ball happenings only happen very rarely. Most of the time the basic everyday problems will pop up and haunt you unless you are properly prepared. If I'm going to be the Referee I start preparing weeks in advance. For instance, I want a copy of the entry form as soon as possible. Local rule interpretation or rules of the meet will be on this sheet for the Coaches. Well, it's for me also, so that you go in knowing the rules of the game. I also like to have contact with my Meet Director, just to check in and see if everything is going ok. I also prefer knowled in advance if I'm going to have enough Officials and who they will be. No way you can walk into a meet cold without knowing who is going to show up. This is inviting distanter. I just love those clubs that have a responsible Official that will occrdimate other Officials for me at the local level. That type person is destined for bigger and better things.

The Referee must watch everything. A good working relationship with your Starter is an absolute must. This is your other Senior Deck Official and must be the person that is your other set of eyes, your sounding board, your confirmation of opinion. The Stater is the person that steps in and covers for you should you be tied up with another task. In short, your good right hand. If you're not comfortable with your Stater then get another Starter. I feel that strongly about it.

Your job starts the moment you enter the pool. This should be a least an hour before the start of the most. There are too many things to do and check, less time is inviting problems. Even as you walk through the locker room, should anything be amiss, you MUST question it. With the amount of damage we have had at various pool sites anyone in a white uniform should feel obligated to step in immediately if you see a potential problem. We cannot afford to be closed out of good pool locations because of a few thoughless, vandalic'individuals. The Coaches need help: We MUST provide it.

Report immediately to the Meet Director and ask if all the heat sheets are worked out. Get your copy, check the time line, and ask are we on schedule to start on time? This is also a good time to ask do you need my assistance for anything, or do we have any potential problems exopping up? If there are problems, go no further! Resolve problems right now or suffer the consequences later!

Report to the pool and make sure the Marshalls are properly equipped, that there are enough of them, and that they know their task. Before leaving make sure that the time line will be watched and that sprint lanes will open up in time. The same person in charge of opening up sprint lanes should also be instructed on when to clear the pool. While you are busy with other things, the smooth operation of the warmpu session seems to set the torm for the day. If your Marshalls dan't run the warmup session, they certainly won't be able to run a meet.

Your Starter should also assist in clearing the pool and go right from there to testing the starting, theing and speaker system. One of you has to do this, as Referee you have to delegate, you just can't do all the jobs yourself. Have the Statter run through a test sequence. Set the system on a 50 and go down the line touching all

pads with your foot and simultaneously pushing the secondary button. It isn't accessary for you to witness the test, in fact you will most likely be at a cosches meeting, but do insist on seeing the tape for relay malfunction or timing hesitation of either primary or secondary systems. You MUST resolve timing pushless before you can proceed.

Someone also has to meet with the Timers. If you don't have a head Timer, YOU have to do it or your Starter. We can all march around the deck thinking how important we are, but the name of the game is TIME. It's the only thing that really counts; it's the main thing that beth Swimmers and Coaches have worked for all year. Screw up have and you might as well pack it in. Timers MUST have a clear view of the Starter, they MUST understand the importance of the secondary system, they MUST understand how important their watch time is should there be a failure, they MUST be assisted by the iturbat to keep the area around the starting blooks clear so that the Timers can do have to keep the area around the starting blooks clear so that the Timers can do have to the type of meet, this routine will alter somewhat, but don't EVER dare assume that any machine is working perfectly and has all the answers. Just as you faciling fat and happy, watch the board go blank, or the board light up like a like tree, or a finer yell out, "I wasn't ready," or "the machine didn't reset," or suffered a sudden power surge," or "power drop," or "the computer program disaptive to how to arrive at acceptable times.

rior to the start of the meet, you MUST meet with your Officials and place them you feel they will imposite best. With todays touch and position rules, Thrm of Stroke people MUST be at the end of the pool; otherwise when you ask, "there was you when you ask the violation," they will be more than two lanes away and not good position. In other words, too far away to clearly see the touch from the splant. It your Officials with the respect they deserve as Officials. Be sure to thank for their time and effect and in particular commend them if they did a good job. The Official that is unreliable, replace them as soon as possible but be sure to them. If you real the problem is a lack of knowledge, find a job for them near and HELP them. We can't afford to lose volunteers. If the Official is new, see they work with an experience person for a while. Getting over the jitters is and to a successful experience. Make sure the procedure is set for D.Q.s. I all D.Q.s reported to me; I want to find out for myself what happended. If the person, I mean to speak to the Skinner. In my mind, just a curt, "you're bear, will not do it, especially at Championships.

As Referee, the rules say that I should be responsible for the course and then been it over to the Starter for the start. The proceedure I follow is not necessarily the same an others. Each Referee tends to bring their own individuality to the job.

While I'm doing his I also make sure that all my Officials are back in position. Then I turn my tion to the starting area and make sure that all is ready and not in chaos.

This was before are the Timers. Are they imposition and ready to go? Usually ext swimmers are already in position, but don't count on it. When all checks I blow the whistle for attention, quiet for the start, and allow the next heat blocks. I will stay in a forward position with my arms in the air for quiet

and may on occasion blow the whistle several more times if need be for quiet. Don't be timid. When the crowd is coming around I then turn the course over to the Starter. Other Referees prefer to have the Starter get the swimmers up on the block. They will then step forward, blow the whistle loudly for quiet and swimmer attention and then turn the course over to the Starter. Try as much as possible to establish a routine. With continuous repetitiveness a smooth running professional operation soon develops in which Swimmers, Coscies, Timers and Officials can feel comfortable with.

Other than watching my pool and Officials during the race. I always want the order of finish. Usually I ask the Starter or at Championships another additional person to get the order of finish as they see it. I ask them not to look at the board and only get as many as they see correctly. They can check the order of finish with the board afterwards. I survise the order of finish mentally and quickly check the board. If I disagree with the board, I jot down my finish, then ask my Starter for his or her If we both disagree with the boards, I'll then ask for the tape and check the tacktip times. There are all sorts of reasons why the board may not have the correct order of finish and if it appears to be functioning correctly, no one will question the machinery until all of a sudden the roof falls in. It's been my experience that and or board or relay system will start malfunctioning by messing up the order first. the unfortunate part of the whole story is how many swimmers were cheated out of their priect places before the malfunction is so wild as to attract everyone's attention. will not change the order of finish unless both my Starter and I saw it differently tiong with the backup times. After all, we are only human and it's a long weekend. m the other hand, I will not allow a machine to dictate to me about what I saw.

Above all, try to be as polite as possible. It costs you nothing, and I realize that it's sometimes difficult with a Cosch or Parent all distraught over a call, Keep in mind, the Cosch many times is a paid professional. This is his or her job. You have just D.Q.ed one of their swimmers, you should expect them to ask for clarification if they didn't see it. Come to think of it, many times even if they did see it. This is not to be taken as a personal affront. As Referee, if your Turn and Stroke was in the correct position, AMD can describe what they saw, AND it is correct, then you MUST accept their opinion and support your Turn and Stroke. I feel a Turn and Stroke is in position if they are within two lanes, and forward on the edge. The buck stops with you; if on the other hand there is any question whatsoever, in any "Afficial's error," and take the behave yourself, since YOU above all realize these ings happen and can save face easier.

False starts, early relay starts, turn and stroke D.Q.s. these are always difficult. 99% of the time the swimmer goofed or had a lapse of memory or didn't realize they were doing was wrong. I have always found it difficult to D.Q. a distraught maker that has worked months for this meet, but it comes with the territory. I personally prefer finding out what happened and then asking the swimmer why they did me and so. This is less blunt, takes a little more time, and allows a dialogue between Referee and Swimmer. There may actually be a valid reason why the swimmer mis-D.Q.ed or false started. Most times, I find that when the swimmer is confronted that you saw, they will take responsibility for their actions. On false starts always preferred dual confirmation. It's possible, however, that you will be ally one that sees it. If this is the case, you have the authority to D.Q. and must and who did you see." There have been times when the Starter will have another on other than mine as to why they think the false start occurred. If I have a re-All person, I will call them over for discussion, NEVER do I assume that it's just of I saw it alone. At this time in particular, I will ask the swimmer, "Was there valid reason why you jumped early." I suppose what I'm saying is that I've altys felt that we are there to supervise a swim meet as fairly as possible, and "off their heads" will not make for an orderly meet. Always give the Swimmer the The fit of the doubt, NEVER be afraid to back down if there is any shadow of doubt. A TEN BEFORE JUDGEMENT, treat others as you would like to be treated. And always cen to suggestions on ways to improve things. You never know where a good idea . come from.

SEED CARDS: Seed cards are available through the New England Cards and the cost for plain cards is \$16.00 per thousand, including mailing. It the cards are picked up in Needham, the cost is \$14.50 per thousand. There is no minimum, and the pards may be split any way between boys and girls.

If you want initials on the cards, the price for 1,000 cards is 32.50, including mailing. If the cards are picked up in Needham, the cost is 32.60. If you want 2,000 or more cards with initials, the cost is \$19.00 per the cost is including mailing. If 2,000 or more cards with initials are picked up in 1966. The cost is \$17.50 per thousand. The minimum order for cards with initials are 1.000 cards.

NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING RULES FOR SANCTIONED, CALENDAR MEETS (as approved by the New England Swimming Board, July 12, 1988)

HOSTING MEETS: Teams planning to host meets must have a representative, preferably their intended meet director, attend the Meet Managers Seminar prior to submitting their bid. Host teams are responsible for informing themselves of the most current fees and cut procedures for the type of meet that they are planning to hold. Teams bidding on meets should make every effort to assure that they have the necessary manpower and resources to run a meet properly before submitting a bid. It is strongly suggested that host teams sign written agreements with the management of the intended facilities in order to avoid last minute cancellations which significantly disrupt the calendar.

DEPOSIT: Teams hosting meets will be required to submit a \$200 deposit which will be returned after the meet when it has been determined that all policies and procedures of New England Swimming have been followed. The check will be returned withing 6 weeks of the meet assuming that the financial report has been filed and the appropriate surcharge paid.

STAFFING: With the exception of Senior and Age Group Championships, host teams are responsible for staffing their own meets, either with their own members or by soliciting volunteers in advance of the meet. Teams may request, but cannot require, participating teams to provide volunteer timers, officials and marshals. In general, teams should aim to have most of thier timers and all of their officials and safety marshals identified prior to the meet. New England Swimming will attempt to make available the most current list of NES officials, from time to time, so that host teams may contact these individual well in advance of their meet.

MEET ENTRIES: Entries must be sent to all registered NE teams, the NE office, Sanction Chairman, Calendar Chairman, Age Group Chairman, Senior Chairman and the Technical Chairman. The meet information should be in the hands of the teams four weeks before the meet deadline. This means that the request for sanction should be sent to the Sanction Chairman a minimum of six weeks before the meet deadline.

MEET CHANGES: No fee or format changes may be made in any meet after the meet has been sanctioned by NES, without the express consent of the Technical Committee. If a team discovers that it must make format change(s) after the meet entry has been distributed, then it must notify the Technical Chairperson, who together with the Vice Chairperson and Age Group (if an age group meet) or Senior Chairperson (if a senior meet) may give authorization for the proposed change(s). It is the host team's responsibility to notify all participating teams in writing of any authorized change(s).

PRE-SEEDING: No meet shall be pre-seeded except for Senior and Age Group Championships and the National Qualifier. If a host team deems pre-seeding to be essential for the success of its meet, then it must submit a written request and explanation, along with its bid, to be presented to the Calendar Committee for review and authorization.

CUTS: It is the responsibility of the host team to notify all participating teams of any cuts in their entry seven days prior to the first day of the meet. If participating teams are notified of cuts by phone, then it is the host team's responsibility to follow up these telephone calls with written communication. Refunds will be made for any events from which a swimmer is cut. However, swimmers must still pay entry fees for the other events they have entered even if they choose not to swim these events. If for any reason, a host team finds it necessary to make substantial cuts in the meet, then it must notify the Technical Chairperson or the New England Swimming office of this situation. With the exception of Championship meets, all New England calendar meets must abide by the 4 hour per session rule.

WARM-UPS: Host teams are responsible for providing supervised warm-ups with safety marshals in attendance in accordance with the established procedure. It is the host team's responsibility to know the established procedure, ascertain the current USS registration of its safety marshals and inform these marshals of their durites and responsibilities. A warm-up schedule should be made available in the meet information. This schedule should include the format (separate warm-up for different ages, sexes, etc.), timing and length of the general warm-up. The meet referee or head safety marshal should be on deck during the warm-up period in order to answer questions, make necessary adjustments, and deal with problems during this time.

RESULTS: Results for meets must be arranged according to age and sex-all 10 & under girls' events together, etc. Ages for all swimmers (specifically 10 & unders and 15-18 or open swimmers) must be listed on the results as well as first and last names of all swimmers. Results must be sent to all teams entered in the meet and to the New England office (eight copies) within two weeks of the meet.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Two copies of the New England financial report must be sent to the New England office within 45 days of the last day of the meet. The New England surcharge or championship meet travel fee should be sent with the report. There is no surcharge for relays or senior development meets. No positive action (financial reimbursement, meet sanction, awards, etc.) will be taken on behalf of a New England team until it has met all of its financial commitments to New England Swimming.

NEW ENGLAND LOGO: All commercial ventures involving the official New England logo must be initiated by New England Swimming or one of its member teams for their own specific use and sale. Special permission must be granted by the Board of New England Swimming for all other purposes.

RETURNED CHECKS: There will be a \$10 charge for any team or individual who submits a returned check to New England Swimming or any of its member teams.

#### CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS:

ENTRIES: Teams hosting a championship meet (excluding 8 & under Champs) must submit all necessary information for their meet entry to the New England Swimming office seven weeks prior to the first scheduled championship meet.

AWARDS: The size and design of the medals and ribbons for the championship meets have been pre-established by New England Swimming. Medals are available through T.J.'s and must be ordered at least six weeks prior to the desired date of delivery. Ribbons are available through Hodge Badge Co., Inc. and should be ordered 4 weeks prior to the desired date of delivery. Award ceremonies are required at Age Group and Senior Championships.

OFFICIALS: Head referees for Age Group and Senior Championship meets must be non-host affiliate officials and should be contracted in conjuction with the Age Group or Senior Chairman (as appropriate) to work the entire meet in order to provide desired continuity. New England Swimming has established a set reimbursement fee for these referees which they will be paid by New England Swimming upon satisfactory completion and receipt of the standardized request form available through the NES office. Although reimbursement may include hotel fees, it is strongly suggested that wherever possible, host teams should provide these officials with any courtesy rooms made available to them. Teams hosting Seniors and Age Groups may require participating teams to provide volunteer timers in proportion to the number of entries submitted. However, officials and safety marshals must be solicited on a volunteer basis.

#### 1989 COACH MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

Individuals will be required to show current proof of training in CPR and first aid to qualify for United States Swimming coach membership in 1989. As most first aid certiciateds are valid for three years, coaches who were properly trained in 1988 will not require additional first aid training in 1989. Most CPR certificates are valid for only one year, however, so coaches should check the expiration date for their CPR courses.

At its July meeting the Board of New England Swimming voted that as of September 1, 1988 all coaches on deck at New England meets must display their USS membership cards while they are on deck.

#### REIMBURSEMENT POLICY FOR 1988--1989:

At its September meeting, the Board of New England Swimming approved the following reimbursement policy for Short Course 1988—1989 and Long Course 1989.

A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Junior Nationals will be reimbursed \$100. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Senior Nationals will be reimbursed \$200. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at the US Open (in December) will be reimbursed \$200. A swimmer who places in the top 16 in one or more individual events will receive an additional \$50. A swimmer may be reimbursed for a maximum of three meets and a maximum of \$650.

As in the past, a swimmer must participate in three New England calendar meets during the season in which the championship meet takes place in order to be eligible for reimbursement. The swimmer also must request the reimbursement. #### MESSAGE TO THE ATHLETES

Congradulations to all the New England swimmers who participated in the U.S. Olympic Trials, with an extra special congradulations to Dave Berkoff, of Bernal's Gator Swim Club. Dave bet 2 World records at the trials in the 100m Backstroke and went on to break that record during the prelime at the Olympics in Seoul. He brought home a silver medal for 100m Back and was a member of the world record setting gold medal medley relay team. Thank you Dave for showing the swimmers of N.E. that a N.E. swimmer is capable of accomplishing so much!

October 19 - 22, I attended the VSS national convention in St. Louis. Here, many topics of concern were discussed that were either agreed upon or rejected. The majority of topics discussed were rule changes and below I have listed the following changes:

- 1) FINA's interpretation of the backstroke start and turns was that the swimmer may stay submerged for a distance of ten (10) meters from the wall, as long as some portion of the swimmers body breaks the surface of the water before the swimmers toes have passed a distance of 10 meters. However, the House of Delegates decided to not accept this rule due to the strong opposition towards it by the athletes.
- 2) At a USS sanctioned neet, time trial times may be used for the Top 16 tabulations. This rule was not in effect before.
- 3) As of September 1, 1988, the long course start shall be used instead of the short course start for the short course seasons.
- 4) Official times done by UGS members in high school championship maets will be accepted for an OVC, if an official can prove that you complied with all the USS rules, by the end of the 1988-89 school year.
- 5) Foreign swimmers may not score points for a USS team at the Senior National Championships, but, subject to USS representation requirements, may represent that team and receive awards.

When I receive more information on other topics that relate to rule changes I will be than happy to have them put into the New England Swimming News. If you have any questions, please give me a call.

As a final note. Dave Berkoff was elected to be a member of the Olympic International Organization Committee and the National Planning Committe.

We understand that several State high school association's new 1988/89 swimming rules do not reflect the U.S. Swimming changes in Backstroke "gutter start", Breaststroke "armdrop on turn", and Forward Start that are effective September 1, 1988.

For a meet to be "USS-approved" for recognition of times for meet-entry and other USS purposes, it must be conducted in conformance "with all relevant USS rules and meet standards." Hence, it may be impossible to approve high school meets in your area.

To protect USS swimmers who wish to compete in high school, and to allow their high school times to be accepted for USS purposes, and if the high schools in your area do not meet the required criteria above, please be advised of the following:

"During the 1988/89 high school swimming season, times claimed in Conference, District, Regional, League, or State Championship meets may be submitted for all USS purposes, provided that a USS official representative is present and attests that the claimed swim was made under all USS rules including those prohibiting the Backstroke "gutter start" and the Breaststroke "turning shoulder-drop"."

Other high school rule differences may exist, i.e., 'No false starts" and foot placement in the forward start, but it is felt that these do not affect the time achieved and may be ignored under this special ruling. If other differences exist, we would like to be advised of them.

It is extremely important that this ruling be made known immediately to all of your high school swimmers who may be just starting their training season, as well as to those LSC members who plan to officiate at high school competitions.

# TO ALL LSC SEPERAL CHAIRMEN:

in the November issue of "United States Swimming News", the "Rules" column will carry the text of the 1989 USS Backstroke and Butterfly rules approved by the House of Delegates last worth in St. Louis and which were made "impediately effective".

In our haste to bring this important language to you as quickly as possible, a very serious error was made in transcription of the final language of the Backstroke rule, USS 101.3.

The "Rules" column will incorrectly show the Backstroke sub-section .2 relating to "Stroke" as follows:

".2 Stroke -- The swimmer shall push off on the back and continue swimming on the back and or the surface of the water throughout the race."

The words "and on the surface of the water" were proposed as an amendment to the rule but were not approved. The correct language will read:

".2 Stroke--The swimmer chall posh off on the back and continue swimming or the back throughout the race."

Please make decision that your swimmers, coaches, officials, and all others who receive b. S. Awirming News are immediately advised of the correct language.

We apologize for outs error, which is not our first and probably not our last but does of the that "Maste makes waste".

The FINA Backstroke Interpretation of the undervalur start and it's effect on USS swimming and officiating will be addressed in the December issue of USSN.

# New England Swimming Warm-up Safety Guidelines for Teams Hosting Meets

- 1. Each club must appoint a club Safety Officer whose responsibilities will include:
  - a. Supervising the staffing and assignment of marshals at meets.
  - b. Meeting with marshals before meets to go over their responsibilities and the plans for each particular meet (also, if necessary, meeting with coaches to discuss any safety rules or restrictions which relate specifically to a particular meet or facility, ie. bulkheads, warm-down areas, etc.)
  - c. Acting as safety liaison between N.E. Swimming, U.S. Swimming, and their home club.
  - d. Checking to ensure that their coaches and safety marshals have current USS registration.
- 2. Host clubs must provide USS registered safety marshals for warm-ups. However, visiting clubs may be asked to assist in providing sprint lane marshals. If there are not enough extra marshals for sprint lanes, then no sprint lanes will be opened. There must be one marshal per sprint lane to be stationed at the starting end of the pool.
- The number of meet marshals should be as follows:
  - a. For 6 lane facilities (before sprint lanes)
    - a minimum of 2, one at each end of pool.
  - b. For 8 lane facilities (before aprint lanes)
    - a minimum of 3, one at far end and two at starting end.
  - c. With sprint lanes a minimum of one marshal per sprint lane in addition to one marshal at the far end and one marshal at the starting end to monitor the overall warm-up.
  - d. Ideally, there should be a minimum of 4 marshals on duty during the entire warm-up and, wherever possible, host teams should strive to achieve this goal.
- 4. Marshals must be in place before warm-ups can begin.
- 5. Marshals should wear clearly visible and distinct identifying markers (ie. vests, armbands, jackets).
- 6. During warm-ups a marshal's only job must be to marshal. Marshals should not be assigned other tasks which may distract them from their role as marshal.
- 7. A marshal's job is to ensure that warm-ups are conducted in a safe manner and in accordance with the safety procedures adopted by New England Swimming. Specifically, marshals must enforce the following rules:
  - a. No diving or racing starts (including backstroke starts) during warm-ups except in designated, one-way sprint lanes. (Safety marshale should be cognizent of backstroke starts.)
  - b. Jumping into the pool is never allowed. Swimmers must ease or drop themselves into the pool.
  - c. Swimmers may enter the pool only at the starting end.
  - 'd. No unsafe practices such as running, pushing, fighting, or horseplay are ever allowed.
  - e. All swimmers participating in warm-ups must be under the direct supervision of a USS registered coach. Marshals should question any swimmer who does not appear to be under such coaching supervision. Any swimmer who is found to be unsupervised by a USS registered coach should be required to report to the meet referee, who will attempt to assign the swimmer to a USS registered coach.

- 8. It is suggested that a marshel also be applicated to any warm-down area or facility which is made available to swimmers during the meet. No diving or jumping is even permitted in warm-down areas.
- 9. Marshals should be alert and attentive at all limes and must not leave the deck without a replacement.

10. All marshals must be registered members of United States Swimming.

11. Seneral guidalines for warm-up::

a. Senerally, warm-ups begin with all lanes being used for circle swimming.

b. Sprint lanes are usually opened about 30 minutes before the

conclusion of warm-upt.

- c. Lanes opened as sprint lanes are energy only and should be located between circle estimating lanes in order to allow the swimmers in the sprint lanes to swim back in non-sprint lanes, if they choose to do so. For example, if lanes 2 and 7 are sprint lanes, then swimmers can swim back in lanes 1,3,5,8. If more sprint lanes are needed then every other lane may be opened for sprinting, beginning with 2 and excluding 8. At the discretion of the mast referee, two contiguous lanes may be opened for energy sprinting if only one team is using them.
- 12. It is suggested that, where possible, 90 minutes should be provided for warm-ups and the time divided as follows: 20 minutes general, 20 minutes women, 20 minutes wen, 20 minutes general-sprint, and 10 minutes to clear the pool and hold meetings for officials, marshals, and coaches as needed. Most clubs should consider the following factors when determining if a 90 minute warm-up is necessary:

a. Number of swimmers expected

b. Number and size/age disparity of cwimmers sharing sessions

c. Size and nature of facility

Note: During the course of any meet, the Mest Referee has the authority to extend or change the format of warm-ups whenever safety factors dictate that he/she should do so.
