REIMBURSEMENT POLICY FOR 1988--1989:

A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Junior Nationals will be reimbursed \$100. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Senior Nationals will be reimbursed \$200. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at the US Open (in December) will be reimbursed \$200. A swimmer who places in the top 16 in one or more individual events will receive an additional 50. A swimmer may be reimbursed for a maximum of three meets and a maximum of 650 for the period of September 1, 1988 to August 31, 1989.

As in the past, a swimmer must participate in three New England calendar meets during the season in which the championship meet takes place in order to to eligible for reimbursement. The swimmer also must request the reimbursement. Swimmers who participate in the US Open may wait until the end of the short course season to make their request.

WAIVER REQUESTS:

The New England Swimming Board has been receiving an increasing number of requests for waivers of the "three meet rule" from college and prep school swimmers, the New England Swimming Board has established guidelines for requesting waivers from the "three meet rule."

A swimmer who does not participate in three New England calendar meets during the short course season (September 1, 1988 to April 30, 1989) may request a waiver for a championship meet during that season only if he/she participates in three New England calendar meets during the long course season (May 1, 1989 to August 31, 1989).

A swimmers who does not participate in three New England calendar meets during the long course season may request a waiver for a championship meet during that season only if he/she has participated in three New England calendar meets during the short course season.

All requests for waivers will be considered following the long course season.

The Board of New England Swimming will be on February 13, 1989 at 7 p.m. at the Wellesley Community Center, Wellesley, MA.

ATHLETE REGISTRATION:

Please remember that New England Swimming has adopted USS Rule 302.6:

"A Local Swimming Committee may impose a fine of up to \$100.00 per event against a person signing a document which indicates a swimmer is properly registered with United States Swimming for a meet when in fact that swimmer is not properly registered. This will be enforced by the Local Swimming Committee and the Local Swimming Committee will be entitled to the fee imposed."

Teams that have registered swimmers for 1989 have received membership cards and a computer printout for their swimmers. Please check the computer printout(s) in case there are errors.

NON-ATHLETE REGISTRATION:

Please note that all coaches, meet officials, meet managers, and meet marshals must be registered with United States Swimming. At this time, timers are not required to be registered.

ATTENTION COACHES AND OFFICIALS:

The New England Swimming Board has voted that all coaches, officials, meet managers and meet marshals must WEAR their membership cards (gray for coaches and peach for other adults) when they are on deck. This policy will be effective immediately!!

SWIM MEET NOTES:

It has come to the attention of New England Swimming that parents have been sitting on the deck at some meets. The only adults allowed on the deck at New England meets are properly registered coaches, meet managers, officials, and marshalls and timers (who do not have to be registered).

Some of our meet facilities have very limited spectator space. This is usually noted in the meet invitation, and coaches should inform their parents when seating is limited and poor. We are sorry, but seating for all spectators cannot be guaranteed at New England meets

New England Swimming requires that standard New England cards be used for entry in meets (when cards are required). Cards that are a different weight or size are difficult to work with in a bull pen..

Several teams have reported to New England that some teams are bringing glass bottles on the deck at meets. GLASS BOTTLES ARE NEVER ALLOWED IN AREAS WHERE SWIMMERS MAY HAVE BARE FEET! In addition, most teams hosting meets have specified areas where food may be consumed. Teams are to abide by these rules and also pick up any trash that they may create!

ATTENTION ALL COACHES AND SWIMMERS!

WARM-UP PROCEDURES:

In accordance with the warm-up procedures established by United States Swimming and adopted by New England Swimming (as printed in Newsletter Plus, April 1987) all coaches, swimmers, and families must be familiar with and adhere to these procedures.

- 1. Swimmers and coaches are to abide by the directions of the Marshals, who have authority through the Meet Director and the Meet Referee over the warm-up. A swimmer or coach may be removed from the deck for interfering with this authority.
- 2. No swimmer is allowed to enter the pool or participate in warm-ups until he/she is under the direct supervision of a USS registered coach. Any swimmer, who is able to anticipate that he/she will be without a USS registered coach in attendance at a meet, should make arrangements prior to the meet to have another USS registered coach supervise her/his warm-ups. All swimmers, including unattached swimmers, who find themselves at a meet without a USS registered coach to supervise their warm-ups, must report to the Meet Referee immediately.
- 3. All swimmers must enter the pool at the starting end of the pool.
- 4. No Diving or Racing Starts are permitted during warm-ups, except in announced one-way sprint lanes designated for diving. Absolutely No Jumping into the pool is permitted at any time during the meet. This includes warm-up areas and pools.
- 5. In addition to the above regulations which are standard in all New England meets, some pools and meets may have additional regulations depending upon the pool involved.

JUNIOR NATIONALS: Please note that the date for Junior Nationals was changed this fall. The correct dates are March 28--April 1.

VERIFICATION AT CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS:

Complete information for verification of entry times must be submitted prior to the start of the first event of each championship meet.

A third line has been included on the championship meet entry forms which allows room for a verification code. Codes for New England meets have been included and the results of these meets will be available at each championship meet. For all other meets you must include your own code and also bring the result of the meet with you. Be sure to label the results with the code placed on the verification sheet.

A verification packet which includes the verification information and the results of all non-New England calendar meets used for verification must be brought to the verification desk prior to the start of the first event of each championship meet. Be sure each packet is labeled with the name of the Cahmpionship Meet, the coach and the team. The packet should not be included with the entry submitted to the host team, but a copy of the entry with the verification information must be submitted in the verification packet. The packet should include only non-New England calendar meets that are being used for verification.

Verification will be checked for each swimmer who does not make the cut in an event or who scratches, false starts, or disqualifies. If the verification for these swimmers has not been included or cannot be checked, the swimmer will receive an administrative DQ and will not be able to swim any more in the meet. Scratches will be checked only at Seniors.

NOTE: THE VERIFICATION PACKET MUST BE TURNED IN TO THE VERIFICATION TABLE BEFORE ANY SWIMMER ON THE TEAM COMPETES.

VERIFICATION AT SENIORS: Please note that EVERY EVENT at Seniors in which a swimmer does not make the cut, scratches or DQ's will be verified. This includes those events entered under the new "two for one" rule.

For example, a swimmer who has made the time for the 200 butterfly may also enter the 100 butterfly. If the swimmer swims the 100 butterfly and does not make the cut, his or her verification for the 200 butterfly will be checked following the 100 butterfly. If the verification has not been included or cannot be verified, the swimmer will not be allowed to participate in any more events in the meet.

CHAMPIONSHIP MEET NOTES:

AGE GROUPS: All relays will be timed finals and will be swum at the beginning of trials for all age groups. Because of time constraints caused by using a six-lane pool, there will be no time trials at Age Groups.

SENIORS: All relays will be timed finals and will be swum at the end of finals (in the evening).

BRONZE CHAMPIONSHIPS: Swimming in the morning on Saturday and Sunday will be the 9 and 10 and 13 and 14 age groups; swimming in the afternoon on Saturday and Sunday will be the 11 and 12 and 15 and over age groups. All ages will swim on Friday evening. Please check the entry for details.

PINS: A new style of New England pin will be given to all swimmers attending New England Age Group Championships and New England Senior Championships. Swimmers should stop by the verification table after they have participated in their first event to pick up their pin.

1990 and 1991 CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The New England Barracuds have been able to obtain Wellesley College for Age Championships (short course) for 1990 and 1991. If any other New England teams would like to bid on these meets, or any other championship meets (long course or short course), please submit a bid as soon as possible. STARTING PISTOLS: Quality starting pistols are now available from New England Firarms, Inc, located in Gardner, MA. AGE GROUPS, 1990:

At its February Board meeting, the Board of New England Swimming did not accept the proposal of the New England Barracudas who had been able to obtain the pool at Wellesley College for Age Groups the weekend of March 24 and 25, 1990.

It did, however, vote to consider a proposal from Fhil Baker for a new championship calendar for short course, 1990. The coaches have received a copy of Phil's proposal and will discuss the proposal at their meeting at Age Groups. The Board will discuss the proposal at its April meeting.

RELAYS AT CHAMPIONSHIPS:

All relays at Age Groups and New England Senior Championships will be times finals. Relays at Age Groups will be held as the first event during trials. Relays at Seniors will be held as the last event during finals.

INFORMATION FOR COACHES:

The coaches will be meeting at Age Groups. The time and exact location will be announced at the meet. Coaches who wish to attend the meeting but who will not be at Age Groups should contact Barbara Gould or Phil Baker for more information. TOP 16 REPORTABLE TIMES and NEW FINGLAND RECORDS:

"THE RULES"

RULES APPROVED AT ST. LOUIS WHICH ARE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

NOTE: This is the way these rules will appear in the 1989 USS rulebook, which has been delayed this year due to the Olympic Games.

101.1 BREASTSTROKE

- .1 Start-The forward start shall be used.
- .2 Stroke—From the beginning of the first armstroke after the start and after each turn, the body shall be kept on the breast and both shoulders shall be in line with the water surface. The arms shall move simultaneously and in the same horizontal plane without any alternating movement. The hands shall be pushed forward together from the breast and shall be brought back on or under the surface of the water. The hands shall not be brought beyond the hipline, except during the first stroke after the start and each turn. Some part of the swimmer's head shall break the surface of the water at least once during each complete cycle of one arm stroke and one log kick, in that order except after the start and each turn the swimmer may take one arm stroke completely back to the logs and one log kick while wholly submorged. The head must break the surface of the water before the hands turn inward at the widest part of the second stroke.
- .3 Kick—All vertical and lateral movements of the legs shall be simultaneous. The feet must be turned outward during the propulsive part of the kick movement. A scissors, flutter, or downward butterfly kick is not permitted. Breaking the surface with the feet shall not merit disqualification unless followed by a downward butterfly kick.
- .4 Turns-At each turn, the touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously at, above, or below the water surface, and the shoulders shall be in line with the water surface. The head may be submerged after the last arm pull prior to the touch, provided it breaks the surface of the water at some point during any part of the last complete or incomplete cycle preceding the touch. Once a touch has been made, the swimmer may turn in any manner desired. The shoulders must be at or past the vertical toward the breast when the feet leave the wall and the form prescribed in .2 above must be attained from the beginning of the first arm stroke.
- .5 Finish—At the finish the touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously at, above, or below the water surface. The body shall be on the breast and the shoulders in line with the water surface. The head may be submerged after the last arm pull prior to the touch, provided it breaks the surface of the water at some point during any part of the last complete or incomplete stroke cycle preceding the touch.

101.2 BUTTERFLY

- .1 Start--The forward start shall be used.
- .2 Stroke—After the start and after each turn the swimmer must remain on the breast and is permitted one or more leg kicks, but only one arm pull under water, which must bring him to the surface. Both arms must be brought forward over the water and pulled back simultaneously. The shoulders must be in line with the water surface from the beginning of the first arm stroke after the start and after each turn.

(Continued)

"THE RULES" (CONTINUED)

101.2 BUTTERFLY (Continued)

- .3 Kick—All up and down movements of the legs and feet must be simultaneous. The position of the legs or the feet need not be on the same level, but they shall not alternate in relation to each other. A scissors or breaststroke kicking movement is not permitted.
- .4 Turns—At each turn the body shall be on the breast and the shoulders in line with the water surface. The touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously at, above, or below the water surface. Once a touch has been made, the swimser may turn in any manner desired.
- .5 Finish—At the finish the touch shall be made with both bands simultaneously at above, or below the water surface. The bedy shall be on the breast and the shoulders in line with the water surface.

101.3 BACKSTROKE

.1 Start

- A The swimmers shall line up in the water facing the starting end with both bands placed on the gutter or on the starting grips.
- B Prior to the command "Take your mark" and until the feet leave the wall at the starting signal, the swimmer's feet, including the toes, shall be praced under the surface of the water. Standing in or on the gutter or curling the toes over the lip of the gutter is not permitted at any time before or after the start. A backstroke starting block may not be used
- .2 Stroke—The swimmer shall push off on the back and continue swimming on the back and on the swiface of the water throughout the race.
- .3 Turns—The swimmer's head, shoulder, foremost hand, or ann must touch the end of the course. The shoulders must not turn over beyond the vertical before the touch is made. It is permissable to turn the shoulders beyond the vertical after the touch, however, on the push-off the swimmer must return to a position where the shoulders are at or past the vertical toward the back before the feet leave the wall.
- .4 Finish—The swimmer shall have finished the race when any part of the body touches the wall at the end of the course.

AU REVOIR BUT NOT GOODBYE: At St. Louis we announced that after some 30 years and for a variety or reasons we were not a candidate for Chairman of USS Rules Committee. WHAT TO DO ABOUT DELINQUENT DUES AND FEES

Several years ago, Bernard J. Favaro, USS Legal Counsel wrote an informative article about delinquent dues and fees. This article has been updated by Mr. Favaro to reflect changes that have occurred in the USS Rules and Regulations. This article is reprinted in its entirety.

WHAT TO DO ABOUT DELINQUENT DUES AND FEES

1. Club. What do you do if an athlete (usually his parents or guardians or custodians), or any club member, fails to pay his club dues and assessments?

303.5. When transferring from one LSC to another, a swimmer shall present a written transfer from his previous LSC indicating his last date of competition in an attached status and that he is a swimmer in good standing in that LSC in order to make such transfer.

When transferring from one club to another within the same LSC, the procedural requirements established by the LSC Registration Committee shall be followed, 303.6. If a club/ organizational member of an LSC has secured a court judgment against an athlete member (or his parents or custodians), for non-payment of financial obligations, that athlete shall be ineligible to participate in any event of the Corporation and from joining any other USS club/organization until the judgment is satisfied.

Procedure. If the indebtedness is acknowledged and not paid, the solution is simple. The athlete or club member may be suspended from any activity, including competition, until the indebtedness is paid.

If the indebtedness is denied, the club must obtain a court judgment for the indebtedness. This is usually a very quick procedure in Small Claims Court. Pending that judgment, the athlete is entitled to compete and the club member to participate in club and LSC activities.

If the problem arises in a situation where an immediate decision must be made (such as on deck during a swim meet), have an Emergency Hearing (see Appendix 6-A, 1989 Code). If an athlete is involved, the athlete may be permitted to swim under protest.

The reason for enactment of Section 303.6 is obvious.

An LSC must never get involved in inner-club disputes (club v. coach; coach v. athlete; club v. athlete; club v. member, etc.). Consequently, the LSC Review Section does not have jurisdiction unless the dispute involves a general factual situation or a general principle which is of concern to the LSC itself. An LSC could be overwhelmed with trying to resolve inner-club disputes if the rule were otherwise. Each club should have its own procedure for resolving them in its Bylaws.

2. Local Swimming Committee. What do you do if a club/organizational member fails to pay its dues and fees?

609.4. FAILURE TO PAY. The failure of a group member to pay dues or fees required by the LSC or by USS within the time prescribed, as evidenced by a decision of the Review Section or by a court of law, prevents competition, representation, and vote by the delinquent member. Continued failure to pay such dues or fees, within a reasonable period of time as determined by the Board of Directors, is cause for termination of membership.

Procedure. Note the difference here. A Review Section may take or be assigned jurisdiction to determine financial obligations of one of its group members, as well as take that group member to Small Claims Court for judgment.

Athletes attached to a club which is suspended, or the LSC membership of which is terminated, must swim unattached and observe the 120-day rule. That's tough on the athlete, but the rule is consistent with a principle adopted by United States Swimming very early in its life--that the 120 day rule must be uniformly and consistently followed in order to level out all the equities for the good of all athletes. The only exceptions are those specifically set forth in the Rules and Regulations (e.g., school competition).

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE:

The Technical Committee met on Saturday, May 6, 1989 and made the following recommendations which were approved by the Board at the May 8, 1989 meeting.

CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS: In response to a request by the coaches committee, the short course, 1989-1990 calendar was established with the Senior Champion-ship meet following the Age Group Championship meet. Swimmers who qualify for Seniors at Age Groups may enter Seniors. Please note that the format of short course Age Groups is expected to be the same as this year's short course age groups with 13 and 14 the oldest age group in the meet.

For this summer, relays at Age Groups will be the first event of each session; relays at Seniors will be the last event at finals.

- A(B)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "A" or better times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.
- B(A)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "A" or better times may swim if there is room.
- B(C)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "B" times; swimmers with "C" times or no times may swim if there is room.
- C(B)--First consideration is given to swimmers with "C" times or no times; swimmers with "B" times may swim if there is room.
- CUTS: Meets that are over subscribed will be cut as follows:
 - A(B)--"B" swimmers are cut by time; if all "B" swimmers have been cut, "A" swimmers are cut by time.
 - B(A)--"A" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "A" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.
 - E(C)--"C" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "C" swimmers have been cut, "B" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.
 - C(E)--"E" swimmers are cut by date of receipt; if all "E" swimmers have been cut, "C" swimmers are cut by date of receipt.

Specialty meets -- cut by date of receipt.

NOTH--New England Swimming has established "date of receipt" rather than "post-mark" to allow for other methods of delivery--hand, UPS, etc

AJARDS:

- A(B)-Medals will be given to the top 6 (or 8 in the case of an 8-lane pool) swimmers (whether entered with "A" or "B" times). If desired, ribbons may also be given to the top 6 (or 8) "B" swimmers who finish with "B" times.

- NOTE-Championship and specialty meets may have different awards which will be established at the time the bid is awarded.
- At all meets appropriate achievement cards should be written for swimmers achieving times at a higher level.

CLARIFICATION OF 1989 IC SENIORS MEET INFORMATION BOOK

In conformance with Article 206.8.2 of the Administrative Regulations of Competition, which limits the number of swims in the National Championships, the statement on page 6 of the 1989 Phillips 66/USS Long Course National Championship Meet Information Booklet is corrected to read "A swimmer may enter any number of individual events in which he/she has met the qualifying time standard, but may swim only four individual swimming events".

Pursuant to the authority granted under Article 514.1.1A (Amendments), the Rules Committee has determined that the backstroke and individual medley events in the 1989 Phillips 66/USS Long Course National Championship meet shall be swum in accordance with the FINA interpretation of the backstroke rule given on page 3 of the meet information booklet. All other events, including the medley relay, will be swum according to USS Technical Rules.

LONG COURSE CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS:

AGE GROUPS: Age Groups during Long Course season are timed finals. Age groups included in Long Course Age Groups are: 8 and under, 9 and 10, 11 and 12, 13 and 14, and 15 through 18. Swimmers may enter with either yard times or meter times, but the meter times will be seeded first followed by the yard times which must be indicated by an *. All times must be achieved after September 1, 1988 except the distance events which must be achieved after May 1, 1988.

SENIORS: Senior Championships will be trials and finals. Again this season the events will be paired—50 and 100 free, 200 and 500 free, 800 and 1500 free, 100 and 200 back, 100 and 200 breast, 100 and 200 butterfly, 200 and 400 IM. A swimmer who has achieved a Senior cut in one event may also enter the second event in the pair. Swimmers entering a paired event must enter with their best time achieved since September 1, 1988 (or May 1, 1988 for the 800 and 1500 free). Swimmers may enter with either yard times or meter times and will be seeded as follows: meter times which make the cuts, *yard times which make the cuts, meter times which are paired. *All yard times must be *.

For VERIFICATION at Seniors, paired events will be verified using the verification for the event in which the cut has been achieved.

THE BACKSTROKE, JOHN JOHANESSEN, REFEREE CHAIRMAN

At my last clinic for Starters, quite a bit of time was spent discussing backstroke. This is an indication of much concern to the Official, and I guess that the concern goes right up to the national level. I suppose that the best was to handle this situation is to tell you the story of what happened to me, two years age, at the Eastern Collegiate N.C.A.A. Championships.

All my Officials were Starters or better. During the 200 yard backstroke, I was called by the Turn and Stroke position to come quickly to the far end of the pool. Upon arriving, I was asked to confirm a coming D.Q. of the backstroke turn of the leader in this heat. I watched; after completion, I was asked my opinion? I answered, that I didn't adequately see it. The turn was so rapid that all was a blur, only the touch was visible. Thereupon my official said, "You didn't see it either"! Yet, just a moment ago, this official, from another Association, was going to D.Q. the eventual World Backstroke Champion, and eventual Olympic Gold Medal Winner, from competition. NO CALL is better than a poor call. DO NOT feel compelled to support something you can't adequately see. At this level, it's very difficult to watch the LOWER shoulder, the placement of the HIPS and the TOUCH simultaneously. The LOWER shoulder and the HIPS will tell you if the swimmer is past vertical. The UPPER shoulder (the one out of the water reaching for the wall) WILL be over the vertical because the swimmer is extremely flexible and is reaching for the wall. The rest of the body and hips WILL NOT be past vertical. Because of watching for the touch, your eyes will naturally focus on the upper rather than lower shoulder. It takes practice and concentration to break this habit.

The TOUCH is the key item. If a swimmer is turning WITHOUT touching, then a decided advantage is gained by the swimmer. This is your prime obligation, seeing that NO swimmer gains an unfair advantage over another swimmer. Own up to what you don't see, I can't see it either.

REFEREE COMMENTS

JOHN JOHANESSEN

A recent article by Waiter Lippman, the Ntl. Swimming Rules Chairman, concerning the word simultaneously in breaststroke and fly and, in line with the water surface. Bill goes on to state that this injects a judgement decision and leaves room for doubt. When officiating, give swimmers the margin they deserve. As Ive been saying since I returned from the Ntl. Officials Clinic, this rule change was not meant to be over officiated, and is to be looked upon as an honest attempt at being in line with the water surface and attempting a simultaneous two hand touch. When you feel that an honest attempt is not being made, raise your arm and talk it over with the Referee. When it bothers you, call it, cheating should not be allowed. Coaches should not try to figure out ways around this rule change, rather accept the leeway offered.

I wish to thank all the Coaches for their consideration at the Springfield meet. As it turned out, we had a perfectly run meet holding very closely to the time line while being over subscribed with swimmers. But it may not have been. We ran through 5 new Turn and Stroke Officials working with experienced people, plus 5 new Starters. Of course, they all had their share of litters in the beginning but all came through with flying colors. Only one false start, and that was in the 50 frees; great going gang.

New England swimming also unveiled their newest additions. We now own 8 head sets for communicating between Officials. Not only did this save much time but it turned out to be an excellent teaching tool. Whenever a question was asked, or an incident happen, the question was turned over, answered, or discussed. All were tuned in, so all learned, not just one. I feel very comfortable about the people that worked this meet.

We had a little trouble in the beginning, but when in doubt, read the instructions, then they worked. Batteries should be taken out of the units after the meet, in this way we will never suffer a " melt down". The units work best if left in the mode which requires you to press the red button in order to speak. Voice activated was NOT the way to go. Too much background noise in an enclosed building, so the units never shut off.

These head sets will reside with Mary Riddell and be available to those hosting meets. A check must be left to insure their safe keeping and the check will be returned when the head sets are returned. Turn and Stroke people didn't feel left out, even the ones at the far end of the pool. Comments broke up hours of boredom and rotation of Officials was handled very easily. The other innovation was a "mouse box", alias milk crate. This allowed "mini officials", the elevation they needed to see toe placement in the backstroke of all six swimmers. It worked, don't

REIMBURSEMENT POLICY FOR 1989--1990:

At its September meeting, the Board of New England Swimming approved the following reimbursement policy for Short Course 1989--1990 and Long Course 1990.

A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Junior Mationals will be reimbursed \$100. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at Senior Mationals will be reimbursed \$200. A New England registered swimmer who swims an individual event at the US Open (in December) will be reimbursed \$200. A swimmer who placed in the top 16 in one or more individual events will receive an additional \$50. A swimmer may be reimbursed for a maximum of three meets and a maximum of \$650.

As in the past, a swimmer must participate in three New England calendar meets during the season in which the championship meet takes place in order to be eligible for reimbursement. The swimmer must request the reimbursement within eight weeks except for those swimming in the US Open.



Compliance with the USS forward start rules and USS meet-approval requirement shall be waived for this competition until the end of the 1989-90 high school swimming season."

If you have a swimmer that you feel will be needing an OVC from a high school league championship meet, sectionals, or states, please see to it that there is a USS official on deck to verify the swim. Have the official sign a statement to the effect that the swim with in accordance with USS rules. Be sure to include the official's phone number.



T Dear New England Swimming members,

New England's fine representation among the National Age Group Top 16 and our ever-increasing number of nationally reportable swimmers should be a great source of pride to everyone concerned with the sport. Our swimmers, coaches, parents, and organizers can justifiably feel that all their hard work has received recognition at the highest level. They have contributed both to the overall quality of swimming in New England and to that of the nation as a whole.

As your New England Top 16 tabulator, the large numbers of these reportable times are a mixed blessing. Heedless to say, every effort is made to ensure that the reporting is correct and complete, BUT, human error being a fact of life, the more times there are to report, the greater the possibility of cmitting some deserving athlete.

So...here's where you come in, folks. I need your help in identifying these times. Included in this issue are the national reportable cuts for both short course and long course. Note that some short course cuts are faster than last year, while long course cuts have remained the same. As a rule of thumb, all these cuts are somewhat faster than AAAA times. Please familiarize yourselves with the times that concern you -- paste them in your log book, perhaps. That way, you'll know a reportable time when you see it, and, hopefully, you'll get the information to me.

Also in this issue is a form for reporting both New England Records and national times. Please save it and use it. ANYONE can send in the form - coach, parent, or swimmer. It makes no difference who reports it, since the time will later be verified against actual meet results. I'd far prefer to receive three forms for the same swim than none at all. Don't assume that someone else will do the reporting. Please do it yourself!

LETTER (continued):

Even partial information is helpful, since it tells me where to look for the time. This is particularly true with younger swimmers entered in national or open events, where a 30th place finish may well be a spectacular age group time. To illustrate the point, I received a reportable form from a parent this summer, long before JO results were available. The parent had copied the time from the clock, noted that the minutes and seconds were well within reportable range, but had missed the tenths and hundredths. She reported it anyway, figuring that I could pick up the rest of the time from the results. That was the smartest and best thing she could have done! It made her daughter's time easy for me to find and ensured that I wouldn't overlook it.

Relays are a problem to report. First of all, NAMES AND AGES OF ALL RELAY MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED. In many cases, these names and ages are not printed in meet results, and the only way to get them is from the coach of the team or from an alert parent. If your team has a good relay, familiarize yourself with the relay cuts. They are not impossibly fast. As a matter of fact, last spring, relay teams from FIVE different clubs made national short course cuts in the 11-12 girls' age group. Remember also that a 13-14, 15-16, or 17-18 relay team swimming at an open event is impossible to identify unless it is reported. It is also important to recognize that NAG rankings for older swimmers are specifically for 15-16 relays and 17-18 relays. Relays where swimmers are of mixed ages are not reportable.

Electronically timed lead off splits for relays and IM's are reportable. If the split is not going to be published in the results, you must get a card signed by the meet referee and submit it to me. Keep in mind that these lead off splits are incredibly easy to miss! Report them to me and make sure that they will be included!

In theory, A National Top 16 Tabulator is only responsible for meets held in her LSC (district). In fact, I like to report times achieved by our swimmers at out-of-district meets to ensure that our swimmers will be recognized. To do this, I NEED MEET RESULTS. One copy sent to the New England Swimming office is sufficient for my purposes, as well as for New England Swimming's verification and Top Ten. Remember...even if you send me the reporting form, I must still have the meet results to verify the time.

Thank you, in advance, for sending in your reporting forms. As I said before, I'd far rather receive too many forms than too few. In the unlikely event that someone sends me a form for a time that is NOT reportable for some reason, I will personally call to explain. Likewise, if any of you have any questions about NAG reportables, please call me before 9:00 PM, and I'll do my best to help.



New England Swimming extends its condolences to the family of GREG LAUSCN who died recently in an accident. Greg had been a member of the Cumberland Area Swim Team and had been a member of CAST's eight and under free relay: and medley relay both of which placed first at Age Groups this summer.

CONGRATULATIONS to RAY CAREY (BGSC) and JENNY THOMPSON (SSA) who will compete in the International Invitational swim meet in Perth. Australia in January in preparation for the 1991 World Championships.

MEET INFORMATION: At recent meetings of the Technical Committee and the New England Board, the following decisions were made:

AGE GROUPS: In addition to high point trophies for the top swimmer of each sex in each age group, plaques will be awarded to the swimmers in each sex in each age group who finish 2nd through 8th overall. Pins will be available for Age Group participants at both the short course and the long course meets. A REMINDER—At short course age groups, the 10 and unders swim timed finals in the morning; the 11 and 12 and 13 and 14 age groups swim trials in the morning and finals in the late afternoon. All relays will be timed finals in the norming.

SENIORS: There will be cuts for relays at Seniors which will be announced soon. If a relay is composed of four qualifying swimmers, it is automatically in the meet, but if there is one or more non-qualifying swimmer, the relay must meet the standards. Pins will be available for Senior participants at both the short course and long course meets. A REMINDER—Relays at Seniors will be timed finals to be swum at the end of finals in the evening. The events will be paired again this year and a swimmer who has qualified in one event in a pair may also swim the other event in the pair (50, 100 free; 200, 500 free; 1000,1650 free; 100, 200 back; 100, 200 breast; 100, 200 fly; 200, 400 IN).

BRONZE CLASSIC: This meet is no longer a championship so it may be cut if necessary. There will still be medals as awards, however. Swimmers at the Bronze Classic may not qualify for Age Groups, but they may qualify for the Silver Classic. However, swimmers who have already swum an event at Bronze will be the first ones cut at Silver Classic is the meet is over-subscribed. A REMINDER-Age Groups at Bronze Classic are 9 and 10; 11 and 12; 13 and 14; 15 through 18.

The next meeting of the Board of New England Swimming will be Monday, December 11, 1989 at 7 p.m. at the Wellesley Community Center, Wellesley, MA.

SILVER CLASSIC: This meet is no longer a championship so it may be cut if necessary. There will still be medals as awards, however. Swimmers who enter the meet with times achieved at the Bronze Classic will be the first ones cut if cuts are necessary. A REMINDER—Age Groups at Silver Classic are 10 and under; 11 and 12; 13 and 14; 15 and over. No swimmer may enter the same event at Age Groups and Silver Classic; no swimmer may enter the same event at Seniors and Silver Classic.

ZONES: Age Groups will be the qualifying meet for all 14 and under swimmers. Swimmers who have been selected for the meet at Age Groups may update their times at Seniors, however. Swimmers who are 15 to 18 must submit an application (in this newsletter). They may use times from Seniors. A REMINDER-All swimmers must have participated in three New England Calendar Meets to be considered as a team member.

MENT EVALUATION COMMITTEE: Isabelle Fraser and Jerry Zimmer have been named as the Neet Evaluation Committee. Starting with all meets held after January 1, 1990, the \$200 meet deposit must be submitted with the application for sanction and will be deposited. The team hosting the meet must then return the evaluation form and request the refund of the \$200. If all New England rules and policies have been followed, the committee will ask the treasurer to refund the \$200 deposit.

TO THE NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING COMMUNITY - ZONE TEAM 1990

Our short course Zone Meet will take place in Orono, Maine at the University of Maine on March 29, 30, and 31, 1990. Our team will be staying at the Days Inn, in Bangor, Maine.

Our team will be picked off of Age Groups at Brown University. Our 15-18 swimmers will be selected from applications received. Any 13-14 year old, or any swimmer that goes to New England Seniors and betters a time that they qualified with at Age Groups may submit their faster time.

New England Swimming pays for half of this trip. Each swimmer receives a suit, a sweatshirt or T-Shirt, and a cap. The cost to each swimmer will be approximately \$170.00 (meals not included). This depends on the number of swimmers that attend the meet.

All SWIMMERS MUST HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THREE NEW ENGLAND CALENDAR MEETS, to be considered as a team member.

wathe top two swimmers are automatically asked providing they are the right age as of the Zone Meet Date. If a swimmer changes age then the next swimmer will be asked. When the selection goes down the list any farther, it does not necessarily mean the next swimmer in an event will go. Some of the existing swimmers may be spread out a little farther depending on their times. Swimmers may be asked to go for one event, in order to put the best team together. This is something that parents should think about now.
