MEET ENTRIES FOR "END OF SEASON" MEETS:

All entries for the "end of season" meets (Regionals, 12 and under Age Groups, New England Open) will be checked for **complete and accurate** registration data BEFORE each meet begins.

If an unregistered swimmer is found entered in a meet, a \$100 fine will be imposed. If inaccurate names or ID numbers are found, the entry will be returned to the team, and all information must be corrected before the swimmer can participate in the meet.

It is strongly advised that you check your team registration data with the web site online registration tool before you do your meet entries. If you find a discrepancy, check with the most recent registration list that you have received from the office. If you have an error, please correct it. If there is an error in the SWIMS data base, please notify the office of the error and the correction. If you are not sure of the correct information, please check with the family. If you correct information in your data base, be sure that the ID number changes to reflect the changes you have made.

Before you submit your entries to the "end of season" meets, please run your entry through the online registration tool again. The directions are on the web site (www.neswim.com). If you have any problems using this tool, you may email the web master (webmaster@neswim.com) or Harold Whitney (whitney@seacoastswimming.com).

TEAM LISTS: Included in this newsletter are two team lists. One includes all the teams with the name and address of the team contact. The other lists all the teams with their official team initials.

REGISTRATION INFORMATON: For your convenience, athlete and non-athlete registration forms are now posted on the web site. If you are using the form to register an athlete, please remember that all athlete registrations should be submitted through the team registration manager. If you are using a form to register a coach, be sure to submit copies of current CPR, First Aid, and Safety Training for Swim Coaches (or Lifeguard Training) cards if they are not on file in the office. Remember that coaches who are reregistering for the second year must complete the education requirement. If you are using a form to register an office, be sure to submit a copy of both sides of the blue official's card with the registration.

Faxing a registration form does not speed the process since a check needs to accompany the form. You may, however, fax copies of new certifications if you need to update a coach registration.

MEET REQUIREMENT FOR THE NEW ENGLAND OPEN MEET: A swimmer who is entered in the New England Open Championships must have participated in two sanctioned New England meets. There is no meet participation rule for the 12 and under Age Group Championships or the Regional Meets. The Regional Meet can count as one of the two meets to meet the requirement for the Open Championship.

EASTERN ZONE MEET: New England Swimming will not be participating in the Eastern Zone Meet for the short course season and entries from individual swimmers will not be accepted. New England will be participating in the Eastern Zone Meet for long course season and will be hiring buses, arranging for hotel rooms, food, etc. Save your enthusiasm for the summer!! More information, including time standards, will be published in the spring.

SWIMS Update

SWIMS, the new USA Swimming times database, is up and running and a vast improvement over the former STAR database. All times from New England calendar meets will automatically be added to SWIMS. Non-calendar New England sanctioned meet results may also be added to SWIMS if the meet results are emailed in an appropriate format to Rosemarie Meissner, the New England SWIMS Top 16 and NTV Coordinator, at 508-384-2925 or remecon@comcast.net.

To successfully import times into SWIMS several criteria must be met:

- 1. Swimmers <u>must</u> be USA Swimming registered at the time of the swim.
- 2. Swimmers' USS ID numbers <u>must</u> be correct. Accurate birthdates, middle initials, proper names, and correct spelling are important. All teams and meet hosts are *strongly* encouraged to use the registration tool available on the New England website to check accuracy of swimmer registrations.
- 3. Relay results <u>must</u> include the names and ages of all swimmers in the relay.
- 4. All New England unattached swimmers <u>must</u> be listed as UN-NE. This is the only acceptable acronym for unattached swimmers.
- 5. Results must have been achieved fulfilling the minimum timing requirement of three manual watches. Meet results from competitions where only two watches have been used will not be added to the database.

If these criteria are not met, teams and swimmers run the risk that their results will be deleted from SWIMS. It is particularly important that out-of-LSC teams attending New England meets and New England teams attending non-New England meets follow the above guidelines. SWIMS Coordinators have been advised by USA Swimming to delete all times that do not conform to these criteria from the database. In most cases a SWIMS coordinator will try to resolve non-conforming times, however this becomes especially difficult if the coordinator is unfamiliar with the team and/or swimmer in question.

National Times Verification- High School, YMCA, and College Swim Meets

This is a reminder that Senior National and US Open qualifying times achieved at high school, YMCA, and college invitational and championship meets can be used if the individual swim or entire meet has been observed by USS officials and if the proper requests have been made and approved.

The necessary forms requesting observation can be found on the New England website under "Forms and Policy". Requests should be submitted 10-28 days prior to the start of meet. There are different requirement requests for dual meets, invitational meets, and

championship meets so please read the forms carefully and refer to the NTV Handbook if clarification is needed.

Currently, USA Swimming requires that all times used to qualify for Olympic Trials, World Cup, Senior National, and US Open competitions are verified by the LSC NTV Chair and are included in the SWIMS database. However, with the success of the SWIMS database, USA Swimming is encouraging LSCs to begin requiring verification and inclusion in SWIMS qualifying times used for Sectional, Grand Prix, and LSC Championships. This trend makes it increasingly more important that high school, college, and YMCA meets are observed.

Do not assume that your or your swimmer's high school, college, or YMCA meet is being observed. Be proactive. In the last three years, no New England public high school championship or invitational swim meet has fulfilled the requirements for USA Swimming Observation. A non-observed swim can not be verified. If it can not be verified, it is not a valid qualifying time. Do not let your qualifying swimmer miss out on the opportunity to swim at a national level meet because of a technicality.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TEAM CONTACTS

Newsletter Plus is mailed free of charge to two members of each team, the Team Contact and the Safety Coordinator. The Safety Coordinator is responsible for all information pertaining to coach registration, safety marshals, and other safety material. The Team Contact is responsible for sharing ALL information in the newsletter with the appropriate athletes, coaches, officials, parents on the team.

Recently, we have had several problems resulting from a failure to communicate on the team level. Although we printed the list of teams registered for 2004 several times, some teams claimed they did not realize they were not registered. We have a policy that all swimmers must be registered before they are entered in meets, yet we still find unregistered swimmers entered in meets. A reminder of the \$100 fine for unregistered swimmers has appeared in several newsletters. At least one swimmer lost a national qualifying time because arrangements were not made to observe the high school meet. PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGE:

It has come to our attention that we are in violation of our by-laws when we allow coaches to be Safety Coordinators. If we wish to continue this policy, we need to amend our by-laws. The proposed change was approved by the Board of New England Swimming at its meeting on March 9, 2004. The proposed amendment will come before the House of Delegates at the Annual Meeting on March 1, 2004.

Below are the parts of our current by-laws that apply to the situation.

- 2.1.2.C. Active Individual Members—An Active Individual Member is an individual other than a Coach Member or an Athlete Member who is a trainer, manager, official, meet director, marshal, Board Member, At-Large House Member, officer, coordinator or committee chairman or committee member of NESI or a Group Member Representative or alternate and any other individual desiring to participate in the sport of swimming and who is in good standing as an Individual Member of USS and NESI.
- 2.2.3. CLUB SAFETY COORDINATOR—Each Club Member shall appoint an Active Individual Member to be a Club Safety Coordinator. The Club Safety Coordinator shall be responsible for disseminating safety education information received from USS and NESI to the Club Member's athletes, coaches and other members and shall make recommendations to the Club Member concerning safety policy and its implementation. The Club Safety Coordinator shall make any reports requested by NESI's Safety Coordinator.

Here is the problem. The Safety Coordinator must be an Active Individual Member and an Active Individual Member is an individual other than a Coach Member. The problem can be solved, if you desire to, by inserting "or Coach Member" in 2.2.3. so that it reads, "Each Club Member shall appoint an Active Individual Member or Coach Member to be a Club Safety Coordinator."

The Technical Committee report was accepted by the Board of New England Swimming at its meeting on April 13, 2004. A separate vote was taken to accept the section concerning the change in sanction fees (under OTHER in the report). That new policy will take effect for the short course season.

.NEW ENGLAND SWIMMING TECHNICAL COMMITTEE, March 24, 2004

The Technical Committee met at the home of Priscilla Davis on Wednesday, March 24, 2004. Chairman, Dan Warner, call the meeting to order at 5:40 pm. Attending were: Dan Warner, Pam Warner, Priscilla Davis, Mariella Allard, Caitlin Grant, Ray Grant, Bruce Mohl, Mike Parratto, Amy Parratto, Mary Riddell.

EVALUATION OF END OF SHORT COURSE SEASON MEETS:

- 1. Mariella Allard reported that most of the evaluations that she received concerned the regional meets—the site at Easthampton and awards problems at Pioneer Valley. Most of the complaints came from parents, not coaches.
- 2. The Open Meet concept was discussed. All agreed that the meet was well run, fast, exciting, but too large. Mike Parratto suggested that the meet be continued in the future but that a Senior meet be offered for the faster swimmers. The Open time standards would be about the same (with some adjustments for the distance events), and the Senior meet would use the old Senior cuts. Swimmers could attend only one of the two meets. The Senior meet would be held first, before the Sectional meet. The Open meet would be held later. A swimmer with one, two, three, or four Senior cuts could swim 5 Senior events. A swimmer with five or more Senior cuts could swim up to 9 Senior events. There would be no bonus events for the Open meet. The 13 and 14 age group would be scored the way they were this year. There was discussion about pools for the Open. A suggestion was made to approach Harvard about installing a bulkhead across the diving well. Another suggestion was trying to get a long term arrangement with MIT. Dan Warner will talk with MIT. Next short course season the end of season meets will be: Seniors, Open, 12 and under Age Groups, Regionals
- 3. Ray Grant said that the time standards for 12 and unders will be a little easier next year.
- 4. Ray Grant suggested that "best time" ribbons be awarded at the Regional meets for 9—10 and 8 and under swimmers. All agreed that this was a good idea. It was also decided to consider the regional meets championship meets.
- 5. The distance events at the Open were discussed. Because of the size of the distance events in the meet, coaches wanted the 500 and 400 IM to be swum fastest to slowest. It was decided that these events would be swum in the traditional way (slowest to fastest) and that the size of the events would be better managed by adjusting the time standards. All agreed that it is not a good idea to

change the meet information after it has been posted, but all agreed that the referee is able to do make adjustments if the situation requires it. Next year's entry should make it clear that the referee can do this. The positive check-in for the 500 free and 400 IM worked well and eliminated most of the open lanes that there were in previous years.

6. The committee discussed the suggestion that we place a limit on how late at night sessions can run. It was agreed that we can do this for the end of season meets, but that teams running other meets can make that decision themselves as long as the session is not in violation of the USA Swimming four-hour rule. (Note this rule is not in effect for championship meets.) The Calendar Committee will be more careful about checking these limitations when they accept end of season bids in the future.

SPRING AND SUMMER 2004 MEET SCHEDULE

- 1. 12 and under meet: The committee received 3 bids for 12 and unders. YNS cannot have the pool for 3 ½ days, however. It was decided to go with Harvard rather than Springfield College because of the size of the facility. There was still some hesitation because of the Democratic Convention. Tim Murphy has been able to obtain some rooms in Burlington. It was decided to advise teams to book their rooms early and to suggest that they look at outer areas—Burlington, Framingham, Natick. The age groups for the meet will be 11—12 and 10 and under. There was discussion about an end of season meet for the 8 and unders. Bruce Mohl will "rejigger" the times for the 8 and unders at the qualifier so that all 8 and unders can swim there.
- 2. The dates for the Open will remain Thursday through Sunday (rather than Wednesday through Saturday) even though Nationals will begin on Tuesday. The committee was concerned about taking parents (timers and officials) and, to a lesser degree, swimmers out of work for another day.
- 3. Ray Grant discussed zones. Laura Matuszak will be in charge of zones this summer and has arranged for buses and hotel rooms. Swimmers who are on the team will be expected to travel to and from the meet with the team and stay for the full time. A swimmer who is accepted for the team will have to have at least two cut times. Ray suggested that we have 5 coaches, a head coach and a coach assigned to each age group—10 and under, 11 and 12, 13 and 14, and 15 and over. It was agreed to pay a stipend to each coach of \$125. Ray passed out the information from the task force on the Eastern Zone meet.

SANCTIONED/NON CALENDAR MEETS:

1. Now that we are sanctioning more non calendar meets, Mary Riddell has some concerns about the process. It was decided that sanction requests would have to be sent to the office at least two weeks before the meet. There must be a certified

referee, the entry file must be run through the on line check before the meet, and all surcharges must be paid. Mary Riddell would like to be able to confer with the calendar committee if she has concerns about a non calendar meet conflicting with a calendar meet.

- 2. Mary Riddell brought up the situation that a team from AD is running meets in New England. They will have to be sanctioned by New England and follow New England rules, including surcharges. She will talk with the AD Sanction Chairman to work things out.
- 3. The New England fee schedule will be changed to reflect that the championship fees, surcharges, etc. are for New England Swimming championship meets.

WEB SITE

- 1. Amy Parratto is very interested in having a parent page on the web site. It was suggested that she get together a committee and they can begin by answering some commonly asked questions.
- 2. There is a concern that some things are not being posted on the web site in a timely manner. Everyone appreciates Rick Osterberg's work and his considerable talent but it appears that at times he has too much to do. It was suggested that someone (Harold Whitney?) be able to post items when Rick is not available. Mary Riddell suggested that he acknowledge that he has received materials and will be posting them as soon as possible.

REGISTRATION ISSUES

- 1. Beginning with the summer season, all teams running meets will be required to run the meet file through the on line registration check and forward the exceptions report to the office. No unregistered swimmer will be allowed to swim in the meet, and teams must "clean up" ID problems before swimmers will be allowed to swim in the meet.
- 2. Some of the ID number problems are a result of deck entries or time trials swum by swimmers who are not entered in the meet. Deck entries will not be accepted without a membership card or a copy of the official registration list which every team receives. This way the team running the meet will have accurate ID numbers.

OTHER

1. There has been some confusion about time trials this year. Time trials require a separate sanction from the meet. Some teams have run time trials without a sanction for them. It was decided that all teams requesting sanctions should automatically receive a time trial sanction, also. To cover this, the sanction fee

would change from the current \$15 per day sanction fee plus \$15 per meet for time trials to a fee of \$20 per day (\$15 for the meet sanction and \$5 for time trials).

2. There was some discussion about date of the Annual Meeting. The date of May 1 was reserved and announced several months ago, but turns out to be during NH April vacation. Several board members will be on vacation at that time. If the date were changed to the following week, it would conflict with the Catch the Spirit Camps and with the Zone Meeting in Portland. It was decided that it was too late to change the date.

The meeting was adjourned by chair, Dan Warner, at 9 pm.

BY-LAW CHANGE:

2.2.3. CLUB SAFETY COORDINATOR—Each Club Member shall appoint an Active Individual Member or Coach Member to be a Club Safety Coordinator. The Club Safety Coordinator shall be responsible for disseminating safety education information received from USS and NESI to the Club Member's athletes, coaches and other members and shall make recommendations to the Club Member concerning safety policy and its implementation. The Club Safety Coordinator shall make any reports requested by NESI's Safety Coordinator.

ENTERING MEETS: Some teams running meets have reported that there is some confusion about entering meets. Once a team has sent a meet entry via e-mail, the team must mail the check and a hard copy of the entry so that the team running the meet receives it within 4 days. If the check and hard copy are not received within this time frame, the team running the meet does not have to accept the entry. Teams entering meets may update times up until one week before the meet. They may not change the original entry in any other manner, either by adding swimmers or events or by deleting swimmers or events. If you wish to add swimmers or events, check to see if the team running the meet has space and is willing to accept an additional entry. However, this additional entry may not replace any swimmers or events on the original entry.

USA SWIMMING RULES & REGULATIONS COMMITTEE

AMENDMENT TO RULES TO CONFORM TO FINA RULES

Effective June 5, 2004

BACKGROUND REGARDING PACE MAKING DEVICES

FINA has recently determined that certain wearable radio receivers that have recently been brought to market are not permitted. These devices, designed to be worn by swimmers in the water, can transmit information from a coach or someone else on deck. FINA rule SW 10.15 with language prohibiting pace making is the basis for this FINA determination. The Rules & Regulations Committee has conformed our rules to those of FINA.

102.10 DISQUALIFICATIONS

.10 No swimmer is permitted to wear or use any device or substance to help his/her speed, <u>pace</u> or buoyancy during a race. Goggles may be worn, and rubdown oil applied if not considered excessive by the Referee.

INTERPRETATION

The official interpretation of 102.10.10 as amended to conform to FINA rule SW 10.15 is that no mechanical or electronic device than can convey pace or speed may be worn in competition.

AUTHORITY

Article 510.1 states in part that "the Rules & Regulations Committee may alter, amend or repeal any portion of Part One at any time to conform to the rules of the Federation Internationale de Natation Amateur (FINA)."

The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee approved the change to USA Swimming 102.10.10 and the interpretation, both shown above, on June 5, 2004, effective immediately.

PLEASE NOTE:

This is a New England Team travel event. All swimmers, coaches and chaperones must travel together on the team busses to Buffalo. All 10 and under swimmers will remain at the hotel with their chaperones after the preliminary sessions. GUIDELINES FOR MARSHALS

Marshals must be current members of USA Swimming.

102.18 MARSHALS—Shall wear identifying attire and enforce warm-up procedures and maintain order in the swimming venue for the entire meet. The marshal shall have full authority to warn or order to cease and desist, and, with the concurrence of the Referee, to remove, or have removed from the swimming venue anyone behaving in an unsafe manner or using profane or abusive language, or whose actions are disrupting the orderly conduct of the meet.

Responsibilities of Marshals include:

Marshals should arrive at the swim venue at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to the beginning of warm-ups. They should check in with the referee to receive instructions, i.e. where they will be positioned, special safety concerns for the meet, etc

The head Marshal should have a whistle. Marshals should be easily identifiable by a distinctive article of attire (ie. hat, jacket, vest, etc.).

Warm-down areas must be marshaled throughout the meet.

Marshals must not leave the area until coverage is provided or until excused by the referee.

Marshals' duties include:

Make sure swimmers behave in a safe manner (i.e. no running, abusive behavior, etc.).

During general warm-ups, make sure swimmers enter feet first from the starting end only and ease into the water. There should be **NO** entering from the opposite end or sides of the pool during warm-ups. **ABSOLUTELY NO DIVING!!!!**

Be alert to dangerously overcrowded warm-ups and alert the meet referee or manager.

Notify the coach of any swimmer who is behaving/acting in an unsafe manner.

Use appropriate language. NO POWER TRIPS, PLEASE.

Make sure lanes are cleared before sprint lanes begin.

Your role is to help maintain a safe environment. Please, Pay Attention!

In about 3 weeks a new feature will be unveiled on the USA Swimming website. Link City as it appears now will go away. Instead, when a user does a Club Search...the results will also have a link to "Club Portal." When club portal is clicked the next page will show the club's address and list of coaches attached to that club. If a club has their own website, the link will also appear on this page and a user will be able to click on the link to access the club's website. In order for the correct club website address to appear on this page, the website address has to be entered into the SWIMS club database in the "Website:" field in a specific manner. For instance, The Dolpins have a site..it is:

http://www.dolphinsswimteam.org. The address must be entered in the field exactly like this..not as "www.dolphinsswimteam.org" or not as just "dolphinsswimteam.org"...You must include the "http://www." ...before the address. There are a few exceptions..some links do not use the www. in the address. In these cases you will enter it as http://swimtucson.usswim.net

We bring this to your attention now because many LSCs create their own club membership application form. Therefore, each application will need to request the club's website address (if they have one) for the address to be entered into SWIMS by the LSC registration chair. There will be no other way for the club's website to be added/linked from USA Swimming's website other than through this feature.

Currently there are very many club links on our website listed under each state. I will attempt to add as many of these links to SWIMS club database files as I can. In the event time is drawing near for the new feature to be unveiled I may e-mail those LSCs who still need to be listed in SWIMS and ask for your help.

As I mentioned above Club Search will have some very exciting new features for our members. Club Portal is actually an individual webpage in itself for each club. The club will appoint a "club administrator" to enter the information to the club's site. This will be password protected so that only one person has the access to update/add/edit the page. There will be a page on the club's site for "announcements", "upcoming meets", "practice schedules", "meet results", and "facilities."

Besides the Club Portal link that will appear in the club search there also will be a link called "Map to Pools Used." This information will be entered through the Club Profile section. One of the main features of this will be that we are looking to create an inventory of all pools in the country (a very daunting task, but one that is becoming increasingly important). The mapping project is being developed by Tom Avischious and Club Development.

REGISTRATION: The year is not much more than half over, but it is not too early to be thinking about the 2005 registration year.

The complete list will be sent to all teams in August. In the meantime, there are a few changes that you should know about as you make your plans to update your certifications.

- 1. All Infant/Child/Pediatric CPR and First Aid courses have been deleted from the list. These courses are for children under the age of six and are not applicable to the majority of our athlete members.
- 2. Many organizations are offering their CPR curriculum with an additional AED module and we will accept that if the COR course is already on the approved list. The card will list the name of the course with both COR and AED. If the only letters on the card are "AED," we cannot accept the card. For example, Adult CPR/AED is acceptable; Adult AED is not.
- 3. The American Heart Association is discontinuing their Heartsaver FACTS course. The replacement course, Heartsaver First Aid, is not acceptable.

REIMBURSEMENT POLICY FOR NATIONAL AND SECTIONAL MEETS, 2004--2005

ATHLETE REIMBURSEMENT POLICY:

A New England Swimming Open, USA Swimming Junior Nationals or a World Cup meet hosted by USA Swimming will be reimbursed \$300 by New England Swimming. A New England Swimming registered swimmer who qualifies for and swims in an individual event at the Conoco Phillips National Championships will be reimbursed \$500 by New England Swimming. A New England Swimming registered swimmer who qualifies for and swims in an individual event at the USA Swimming Disability Championships will be reimbursed \$500. A New England Swimming registered swimmer who qualifies for and swims in an individual event at the USA Swimming Speedo Championships (Sectionals) will be reimbursed. For this meet, an amount of \$5,000 will be shared by the qualified swimmers who apply and submit receipts within the eight week period, with a maximum of \$50 per swimmer. One check per team will be issued by New England Swimming for reimbursement for sectional swimmers.

ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible for reimbursement, an athlete must have been registered in New England Swimming and have completed in a New England Swimming calendar meet at least six months prior to the meet for which reimbursement has been requested.

During the short course season, September 1, 2004 to April 31, 2005, a swimmer must fully participate in three New England Swimming calendar meets to be eligible for reimbursement. During the long course season, May 1, 2005 to August 31, 2005, a swimmer must fully participate in two New England Swimming calendar meets to be eligible for reimbursement. As an option, swimmers may fully participate in a total of five New England Swimming calendar meets during the period of September 1, 2004 to August 31, 2005 to be eligible for reimbursement. "Full participation" means participation in all or at least two days of competition and at least one individual event at each day of participation. Disabled swimmers are strongly urged to participate in New England Swimming meets. However, the Board will consider waiving the minimum meet requirements on a case by case basis.

If the New England Senior Championships is in place with a named facility by a certain date (90 days preceding the first day of the meet for long course; 120 days preceding the first day of the meet for short course), mandatory participation in the Senior Championship meet is required in order for a swimmer to receive reimbursement. The New England Swimming Board may waive this requirement for good cause, such as illness or conflict with the National Team requirement.

A swimmer must request the reimbursement within eight weeks of the meet. The request must include the stub from the swimmer's plane ticket or receipt of other expense to equal or exceed the amount of requested reimbursement.

Waivers for the USA Swimming Open, USA Swimming Junior Nationals, a World Cup meet hosted by USA Swimming, and the Conoco Phillips National Championships: If an athlete does not meet the New England Swimming eligibility requirements, all reasonable requests for waivers will be considered by the New England Swimming Board of Directors following the long course season. To request a waiver, complete the reimbursement request form and attach a detailed explanation of your request for waiver signed by both the coach and

athlete (or parent if under 18). Incomplete reimbursement forms will not be considered for a waiver.

Waivers for the USA Swimming Speedo Championships (Sectionals): For the USA Swimming Speedo Championships (Sectionals) there will be no waivers.

COACH REIMBURSEMENT POLICY:

For each team that sends a swimmer to the Conoco Phillips National Championship, the USA Swimming Disability Championships, the USA Swimming Open, the USA Swimming Junior Nationals, or a World Cup meet hosted by USA Swimming, New England Swimming will provide \$300 to reimburse coach expenses. The \$300 per team may be used to reimburse one coach or be split among several team coaches at the team's discretion. The team will have to provide New England Swimming with receipts for coach expenses that equal or exceed the \$300 reimbursement.

For the USA Swimming Speedo Championships (Sectionals) an amount of \$1,500 will be shared by the coaches who attend the meet and apply and submit receipts within the eight week period (one coach per team) with a limit of \$100 per coach.

This policy was approved by the Board of New England Swimming at the Board Meeting on November 9, 2004.

SWIMMER PARTICIPATION FEE

New England Swimming recognizes the increase in facility and other related expenses associated with running meets. Therefore, New England Swimming has accepted a proposal to give New England Swimming teams the **option** to charge an additional per athlete Swimmer Participation Fee for sanctioned calendar meets. It is the intention of New England Swimming to encourage member teams to acquire the best possible venues for our athletes while at the same time promoting organized, successful and well run meets.

A team that chooses to charge this optional Swimmer Participation Fee, which has a maximum of \$10 per swimmer, must include the fee in the bid form. Once the bid deadline has passed, there can be no change to the fee. When the calendar is posted on the web site, the meets with accepted swimmer participation fees will have these fees noted on the calendar. The Calendar Committee at its discretion maintains the ability to reject any bid it feels is incomplete or unreasonable.

No Swimmer Participation Fees will be allowed on any meet bid submitted after the meet bid deadline or on any sanctioned or approved meets not listed on the calendar.

New England Swimming also recognizes that the increased expenses also impact "end of season" meets and accordingly has increased the stipends to be given to teams running these meets. There will be no additional Swimmer Participation Fee allowed for these meets and all current entry fees and surcharges will remain the same.

This Swimmer Participation Fee Policy will be in effect for a trial period beginning with long course season 2005 and will be reviewed within a year by the Technical Committee. However, the stipends will be in effect for at least two years. The meet bid deadline for the 2005 long course meter season is February 1, 2005. Changes to the Swimmer Participation Fee will not be accepted after the deadline nor will late bids be allowed to charge a Swimmer Participation Fee.

New England Swimming Technical Committee, September 1, 2004

NOTE: The Technical Committee Report was accepted by the Board of New England Swimming with the following exception: The entire section of MEET FEES was referred back to the Technical Committee. The result is the SWIMMER PARTICIPATION FEE policy.

The Technical Committee of New England Swimming met at the home of Priscilla Davis on September 1, 2004. The meeting was called to order at 6 pm by chairman, Dan Warner.

Attending were: Dan Warner, Priscilla Davis, Mariella Allard, Bob Gauvin, Amy Parratto, Mike Parratto, Michelle Bernal and guests, Ray Grant and Mary Riddell.

EVALUATIONS OF PAST MEETS: Mariella Allard reported that she had received no evaluations.

OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS: Committee members were satisfied with the individual awards and high point awards for 13 and 14 swimmers. There was more discussion concerning the 13 and 14 age group, but no changes in the meet format were proposed.

All agreed that the positive check in for distance events worked well and should be continued.

It was agreed that for all championship meets times from meets on the weekend before the championship meet should be able to be updated until 5 pm on the Tuesday before the championship meet begins.

At the present time, an unlimited number of relays are permitted, although only 2 relays per team can score. The committee recommended that teams be allowed to swim up to 4 relays, with only 2 relays allowed to score. Relay only swimmers can be added only if the team has 1, 2, or 3 qualified swimmers. The committee recommended that as part of its entry a team can enter 13 and 14 relays and can add 13 and 14 relay only swimmers if a team has only 1, 2, or 3 qualified 13 and 14 swimmers.

Mike Parratto would like to flip the 800 free and the 1500 free (and the 1000 free and 1650 free) in the open schedule. The Thursday schedule would include the 200 breast and 1000/800 free and the Sunday schedule would include the 100 breast and 1650/1500 free. The committee agreed to this. There was some discussion of having the men's 1000/800 free and women's 1650/1500 free on Thursday and the men's 1650/1500 free and women's 1000/800 free on Sunday, but that was rejected.

There was much discussion concerning whether to have a 13—14 and older age group meet or an open meet. Although there was discussion of some coaches and parents who are very interested in bringing back the 13 and over age group meet, a straw vote of committee members definitely favored the open concept, especially with the addition of

13 and 14 relays. All agreed that the open meet is the only option in the summer because of time restraints. Amy Parratto will take this recommendation to the Age Group Committee.

The short course end of season calendar for 2004--2005 includes both an open meet and a senior meet. When the calendar was proposed it was expected that a swimmer could not attend both the open meet and the senior meet. The question was asked if the open time standards would have a cut off time as well as a cut on time. Having a cut off time would mean that a swimmer who has a senior cut could not swim that event at the open meet. There was much discussion about this, but in the end, the committee felt that having a cut off time would be too limiting for some swimmers. Swimmers could still attend only one of the two meets, but, if they had cuts for both meets, would be able to choose which meet would better suit their goals.

12 and under CHAMPIONSHIPS: The committee would like teams to be able to bring relay only swimmers to the meet. However, they recommended that each team be limited to no more that four relays per sex per event per team.

Members felt that distance awards were unnecessary for the 12 and under meet unless the athlete reps wanted to add them.

There was concern that some long time New England policies are not making it into end of season meet invitations and that meet invitations are not being posted in a timely fashion. Ray Grant suggested that we need special end of season meet templates. Mary Riddell said she would prepare them once the Age Group and Senior Committees have given her the information that she needs.

COMBINED SCORING OF CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS: The committee agreed that each championship meet should be scored separately.

REVIEW OF MEET STIPENDS FOR END OF SEASON MEETS: Committee members reviewed the current stipends and did not recommend any changes.

TIME STANDARDS: Committee members would like the time standards to be released as soon as possible. The Senior Committee and the Age Group Committee will make their recommendations at the October meeting. (The committees will submit written reports, and Mary Riddell suggested that the reports be submitted in time to send them to the board members before the meeting.) Once the format is set for short course, the time standards can be announced as soon as possible. Ray Grant will help Laura Matuszak with the time standards for regionals, 12 and unders (with or without 8 and unders), and the open (or 13 and over age groups). Mike Parratto will do the senior time standards now.

The committee agreed that 25 meter time standards are needed since more meets are being held in 25 meter pools.

EIGHT and under END OF SEASON MEET CONCEPT: Committee members liked the concept of a "fun" meet during the long course season. It should be held earlier that it was this past summer. Members do not think an 8 and under meet is needed during the short course season since 8 and under swimmers are included in the regional meets.

MEET CUTTING PROCESS: After some discussion, members agreed that "A" meets and faster should be cut by time rather than by a lottery. There also was discussion about cutting the distance events on Friday nights of team specialty meets. Often after the meet has been cut by a lottery to a proper size for Saturday and Sunday, the Friday distance events are still over subscribed. The committee agreed that these events could then be cut by time if necessary.

MEET FEES: Many committee members thought that meet fees need to be increased especially for those teams who run meets in some of the more expensive pools. They think that a meet fee increase would encourage teams to run meets in the better (and more expensive) pools, and that teams would gladly pay increased fees to attend more meets in these pools. In addition to the discussion of unlimited meet fees, there was discussion of would other formats such as facility surcharges, a flat fee for a meet, and different fees for short, one session meets. While acknowledging that pools costs have increased (and probably will continue to increase), some members were uncomfortable with the proposed unlimited fees or surcharges, concerned that costs will increase too much and that it be hard for teams to plan their schedules since they would not know the costs of a meet until the entry was posted on line.

A compromise for next summer's long course season was proposed as follows. Meet fees per swim would remain the same as they are now. However, teams would be allowed to add a per swimmer facility surcharge. This surcharge would be stated in the meet bid and would be included in the calendar when the calendar is posted on the web site and in the newsletter. This way teams would know up front what the fees would be and could plan accordingly. New England would set the surcharge for end of season meets and possibly help with more subsidies to keep costs down for the swimmers.

NOTE: This entire proposal has been formalized by the SWIMMER PARTICIPATION FEE policy.

TEAM WORK ASSIGNMENTS FOR END OF SEASON MEETS: This summer there were some problems with work assignments for teams. For one meet the assignments were posted too late to notify parents and for both meets there were problems with teams being assigned timers for sessions when they had few or no swimmers. It was agreed that more time would be taken at the meet managers meeting to discuss how to assign timers. There also was a problem with time trials. At some end of season meets, the assigned timers were required to stay for time trials. New England's policy is that time trial swimmers have to provide their own timers unless the host team wants to do this. This policy will be made very clear in the future.

CALENDAR MEETS HELD OUT OF NEW ENGLAND: There has been an increasing problem with New England teams running meets out of New England since often our policies are in conflict with the policies of the other LSC who is sanctioning the meet. New England receives no financial benefit and has no control over these meets. The committee recommends that non-championship meets which are held out of district by New England Swimming teams not be listed on the New England calendar.

NEW ENGLAND SENIORS: The Calendar Committee still has not received any bids for New England Seniors on February 24—27. SSA has submitted a bid for Bowdoin College for the weekend of March 3—6, 2005. It was decided that Bob Gauvin will ask Rick Osterberg to post on the web site that a bid has been received for this weekend and asking that any other teams who want to bid should submit a bid within two weeks. There was concern that this change of date places the meet a week before the sectional meet, rather than two weeks. It was suggested that the meet be open to out of district swimmers who would have to qualify for each event. (New England swimmers who qualify for one event could swim five events. Those who qualify for five events could swim nine events.)

The meeting was adjourned at 9 pm.

JEFF GUDMAN VICE PRESIDENT NATIONAL ADMINISTRATION USA SWIMMING

At a recent swim meet I was asked about USA Swimming SWIMS program, how it worked and why at times did it appear to take more than a few days to get results posted on the USA Swimming web site and the Oregon Swimming web site. Plus, what was the relation between SWIMS (USA Swimming) and the Oregon Swimming times data base. All these are good questions.

The process begins with the club hosting the meet. At the end of the meet you will often see coaches clustered around the "crows nest" administration area waiting for the disk containing all the results of the meet. Copies of the results are also forwarded to the appropriate person or persons in the Local Swimming Committee (LSC). Oregon Swimming is one of 59 LSCs throughout the country. At this point the process splits into two parts....the Oregon Swimming part and the USA Swimming part although both parts can use the tools from the USA Swimming SWIMS program for exceptions and/or corrections.

At the Oregon Swimming level, the meet results are run against the SWIMS database for an exception report. What kind of exceptions? Easy...anytime anything from the results of a swimmers race (including leading off a relay) do not match the SWIMS database an exception is noted. Exceptions include:

- 1) Finding the swimmer listed with one club on the meet results, but another club in the SWIMS database.
- 2) Unregistered swimmers these are the hardest to correct
- 3) Names not matching.
- 4) Birthdates not matching.
- 5) Other variations

Correcting these exceptions can take up to one hour or more per meet. A volunteer does this work and it is appreciated. The results are then posted to the Oregon Swimming web site and top times database. The exact same process or a similar process is used by LSC's around the country. However, these are fixes at the LSC level and not at the national level, i.e. the SWIMS database.

The best and easiest way of minimizing exceptions is for the host team and the teams entering the meet to use Team Manager as much as possible and to make sure their Team Manager software has all the information recorded the same way as the USA Swimming registration form. The responsibility for this is with each team and swimmer. That takes care of the LSC side. Now let's explore the USA Swimming side. At the USA Swimming level, the SWIMS database is used to authenticate the import file for the top times database.

So far, so good. At this point the challenges begin. Another volunteer will upload the files to the USA Swimming database and the results in the file are compared to the registration database. If there are differences between the two, the results of the meet are transferred to a "holding tank" until the differences are corrected. Does that mean that all the swims from a meet where there are differences are placed in the "holding tank"? No, it does not. Just the swims where there are discrepancies.

The person uploading the results must then verify the swimmers registration, or find the correct swimmer in the registration database and match the record up to the swimmers in the meet results file. This sounds easier than it is. As mentioned above, there are a lot of reasons why a result may go into the "holding tank" for correction. When this happens, the person uploading may not be able to proceed without going back to the host club or teams or individuals entering the meet.

At the local level and the national level the decision has been made that there is a higher priority on accuracy over speed. Some LSC's make as many corrections as possible prior to uploading to USA Swimming. Other LSC's upload and then wait and see what goes into the "holding tank". In both cases, the LSC is doing what best fits their circumstances and situation. That is one reason why it sometimes takes more than a few days after a meet is completed before the results are seen on the USA Swimming web site.

Perhaps the easiest way of thinking a bout the process is one of information going both up and down with a variety of checks and verification procedures built in to provide for accuracy and security of both the data and the athlete. That process can take time.

Another challenge is when teams go to meets outside their own LSC. The responsibility for getting the meet results into the USA Swimming data base lies with the host team and the LSC the host team is in. Oregon Swimming does a pretty good job of getting the results for meets outside Oregon Swimming to get the results for its own internal Top 5 swims or records but for the meet results to get to USA Swimming, they need to go through the local host club and local LSC.

Let's look at the process in another way. There are approximately 230,000 year round swimmers registered in USA Swimming. Let's make some conservative assumptions about those 230,000 swimmers. Assume each swimmer participates in 1 meet each month for a year and at each meet swims 6 races. How many swims would that produce in a year? Answer... a lot and it is a conservative number.

230,000 swimmers * 12 meets per year * 6 races per meet

16,560,000 swims per year!!

Let's go one step further. According to the USA Swimming office there is an approximately 2% error rate in swims reported to USA Swimming. What does that mean to an LSC like Oregon Swimming? Let's follow the math.

16,560,000 swims * 2% error = 331,200 swims to be checked.

331,200 swims to check divided by 59 LSCs divided by 12 months = 467 swims per LSC per month to be checked.

That is a lot of swims to check! What is remarkable is how quickly these swims are checked and then posted to the USA Swimming web site. It is wonderful testament to the great work done by the volunteers and coaches throughout the country.

Does that mean we can not do better? Of course not. But compared to where we were and where we are now, great progress has been made.

If you have not checked out the USA Swimming web site and its ability to slice and dice results, it is truly amazing.
