John Lynch has set up classes with Dale Andersen and Jeanette to help these teams create officials and coaches.

c. Illinois Staff Designate-Dave Hedden

- Review of standards and procedures for credentialing YMCA coaches in the Area.
 1. Sent out information packet to staff designates regarding upcoming year – registering coaches, sanctioning meets, etc.
 - a. Team registration is open on the website
 - b. Coach fee is a flat \$30
 - c. Any USA-Swimming coaches – make sure they send in their Principles Card to the USA-Swimming LSC chair – then their USA-Swimming card will get a ‘Y’ on the certification and can be used for both YMCA and USA-Swimming meets. Still need to register as a YMCA coach.
 - d. YMCA virtual invite – no meet packet yet but will be administered the same as last year – events and entry limits – follow last year’s packet.

(4) Old Business – By-law changes:

- 1) **Remove rule 5.B** (There shall be a limit of four (4) entries per association in the Area Championships in any individual event.)

- Justification:

- The state meet is supposed to mirror the National meet. This limit on entries is contrary to YMCA policies. The opening statement for the "rules that govern YMCA swimming" states, "Everyone wants, and should have, an equal opportunity to compete and a fair chance to win."
- Our state time standards are out there for the swimmers to set goals and hopefully meet them during the season. The time standards do not have an * next to them to state that if you make this time at the district meet, you get to swim at the state meet, *UNLESS THERE ARE FOUR FASTER SWIMMERS ON YOUR TEAM WHO ALSO QUALIFIED FOR THIS EVENT*.
- In the past, there were concerns about one team dominating the meet. Rather than micromanage that, let the kids determine who will win the meet.
- Example-Grace Waller in 2011-after fighting her way back to the ranks of championship swimmers from cancer, she qualified for the state meet, but we had 4 swimmers who were faster than she was therefore, she didn't get to swim that year. What kind of YMCA message did we send?

- Upon checking with other area committees and National chairperson concerning how other meets are run, none have this type of restriction in place.
 - This rule forces larger teams to look for other meets which will allow all of their swimmers to compete at a season ending championship meet. Rather than a meet which limits the team to only their four fastest swimmers in an event.
- 2) ***Remove rule 10.J.iii*** (Upon completion of the race, the Deck Referee will long whistle the swimmers on to the blocks, and when ready, releases the race to the starter. The Deck Referee will ensure swimmers in the water are properly motionless and positioned before releasing the race.)
- Justification
 - Unnecessary-Micromanaging. Referees are capable of making an appropriate decision as to when to safely step up swimmers. Frequently, swimmers are whistled up while others are still on their last leg. Gives back control of the deck to the referee where it belongs.
 - Returns the ability to make up some time to the deck staff-helpful when storm and/or equipment delays happen.
- 3) ***Remove from rule 12.B*** “, and the editor of Swimming World.”
- Justification
 - This is an outdated requirement for the Area Hosts.
- 4) ***Under “Responsibilities of the selected host;” Change “3 semi-automatic buttons per lane” to read “2 semi-automatic buttons and two watches per lane.”***
- Justification
 - 2 buttons are sufficient
 - National meet has 2 buttons
 - Easier to staff. Many teams complained about the amount of timers they needed to supply for the meet.
 - Less people on the deck and over the lanes

Proposal to remove the following rule regarding flyover starts:

- i. Deck Referee chirps swimmers ready when last swimmer has one length to swim.*

There is a need to clarify the eligibility for relay participants. There are two proposals for the following rules:

- A. To participate in a relay event at the Area Championships, a swimmer must have participated in some portion of the swimmer's District Championships. (A swimmer shall have been deemed to have participated in District Championships if the swimmer did not actually swim, but was entered in such

Championships and was unable to compete due to medical reason or other reason specifically approved in writing by the Meet Committee at the District Championships.)

- B. Except as provided in Rule 5C, in the Area Championships, relay team substitutions are permitted; provided that the swimmer being substituted has participated in his/her District Championships, and such participation does not cause the swimmer to have participated in more than four (4) different events throughout the swimmer's District Championships and the Area Championships combined. Any swimmer listed on a team roster that meets Area eligibility and participation rules will be accepted as an alternate.

Clarification for the fall meeting and final rule wording regarding whether an eligible relay participant must have been entered and swum (alternate on a relay does not count) OR an eligible relay participant must have been on the roster and met the requirements to have swum at the district meet without having been entered in the district meet. Wording should be as strict as possible, if exceptions are needed, we have an exception process. We may need to clarify practice regarding who can provide a declared false start to the referee.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES	REASON FOR CHANGE
<p>Rule 1.A Illinois / Missouri Area and District YMCA Swimming Championships are conducted under the jurisdiction of the YMCA's Illinois Alliance Network and the Illinois / Missouri Area YMCA Swim Committee ("Area Committee"). These Championships are governed by the current National YMCA "Rules That Govern YMCA Competitive Sports" (published by YMCA of the USA), "YMCA Black Book" (published by the National YMCA Swimming Advisory Committee), these "Rules Governing Illinois / Missouri Area YMCA Swimming Competition" and, to the extent not inconsistent with the foregoing, the current USA Swimming Technical Rules.</p>	<p>Does the Illinois Alliance of YMCA's have any jurisdiction in regards to how we operate as a committee? In addition, we also should include the YMCA Black Book as one of the rules documents under which we operate.</p>
<p>Rule 2.C The site(s) for the Area Championships shall be designated by the Area Committee. Written applications to host an Area Championship shall be submitted to the Area Chairperson prior to the October Fall Area Committee meeting of the second preceding year. e.g. applications to host the 2007 Area Championship will be voted on at the October Fall 2005 Area Committee meeting. In the event that no YMCA volunteers to host the Area Championships, the Area Committee shall assign a District to host the meet. Such assignment shall be done on a rotating basis.</p>	<p>For clarity, not all fall meetings are held in October. For consistency, the meetings are referred to as the "Area Committee meetings" in other sections of the rules and not "business meetings"</p>
<p>Rule 2.E Entry forms for the Area Championships shall be posted on the Area website and sent by regular mail to each Illinois / Missouri Area YMCA competing in swimming and to each Area Committee member by the host YMCA at least one month prior to the Area Championships.</p>	<p>To conform to current practices. It is unnecessary these days to send the meet packet via "regular mail" to each team when email can be used quicker and greener.</p>
<p>Rule 4.A A swimmer must be a YMCA member in good standing for the past 30 days in order to be eligible to participate in YMCA dual, triangular or invitational swim meets; and for the past 90 days to be eligible to participate in District, Area, Regional or National Swimming Championships.</p>	<p>This rule comes from the Rules That Govern. Is it necessary to restate?</p>
<p>Rule 4.B Except as provided herein, during the competitive short course season, August 15 September 1 – April 30 of the</p>	<p>As the rule stands, the short course and long course seasons overlap by 15 days in August. Also, for consistency, earlier in the bylaws the</p>

<p>following year, or long course season, May 1 – August 31, any swimmer who, after representing their YMCA in swimming competition represents another organization in open competition, shall be immediately ineligible for participation in the District or Area Championship for that competitive season. (Note: A swimmer may compete in open competition unattached but may not represent any team other than his or her local YMCA at any time during the current season after representing his/her YMCA). This rule shall in no event, however, prohibit an Area swimmer from representing either the state of Illinois or the state of Missouri in a multi-state competition, where such swimmer is clearly representing the state in such competition and not any specific club or association.</p>	<p>short course season was defined as September 1 – April 30. <p>Rule 4.C A swimmer must maintain an amateur status during the competitive season.</p>	<p>This rule also comes from the Rules That Govern. Is it necessary to restate?</p>
<p>Rule 4.D A swimmer, with one exception, must represent his/her association in closed YMCA competition at least three times in the competitive season to be eligible for District and Area Championships. A double dual meet is not acceptable as two meets. Swimmers participating who missed a portion of the YMCA season due to training and competing in high school swimming will be allowed to participate in the District and Area Championships if they have participated in two closed YMCA meets in the competitive season.</p>	<p>To clarify what it means to “participate” in high school swimming. Athletes who attend a high school that does not have a team can still represent their high school at sectional and state meets. This can be misinterpreted as having “participated” in their high school season. However, in the spirit of the rule, considering that these athletes still trained the entire season with their YMCA team, they should still be required to compete in 3 Y meets as they did not miss any time away from their YMCA season and had the same opportunities as all other non-high school swimmers to get their 3 Y meets in.</p>
<p>Rule 6.B Each District shall be represented at the Area Championships by the first-place finisher in each event at the District Championships. This automatic qualifier shall be in addition to any swimmer(s) who meet or surpass the Illinois Area Qualifying Times in the designated event in the preliminaries or, finals or swim-offs of at the District Championships. Area qualifying times for each event shall be obtained by averaging the 20th fastest 'best time' in the past seven (7) years, eliminating the high and low times, of the consolidated District Championship meets. Further, a time standard may not change by any more than plus/minus 5 seconds from the previous year. Each year, these Rules (including the Illinois Area Qualifying Times for the next season) shall be distributed to Area Committee members no later than July 1.</p>	<p>Housekeeping. <p>Rule 6.F Area and District Championships shall be deemed to be one series. All competitors who qualify by performance or by finishing first in their event shall be automatically entered in the Area Championships. If any swimmer qualifying for his/her District Championship does not swim in such meet and does swim at another meet on such date, all prior YMCA results during the competitive season shall be null and void.</p>	<p>This rule seems rather fascist. If an athlete elects not to compete at Districts, there are already rules in place barring him/her from participating in the Area meet and, since those 2 meets are the only options for a sanctioned meet, that athlete would also not be eligible for Nationals as a result of that decision. <p>Rule 7.A Fixed fees, including any entry fees, admission fees, surcharges, parking fees, and heat sheet charges, shall be part of the area champ Area Championship meet bid. There will be a \$5.00 fee for issuing the National certification card to coaches whose names, together with complete and proper proof of certification through the balance of the current competitive season, are forwarded to the Alliance Network Designate on or before December 1 of each competitive swim season.

Rule 15.D
 After December 31, the Illinois Alliance Network Designate (or his/her delegate) will continue to issue National certification cards to coaches providing proof of the required certifications effective through the balance of the competitive season, but the following fees will apply to the issuance of each such card:

Information received December 2 through January 31	-\$10.00
Information received February 1 through February 15	-\$25.00
Information received February 16 and after	-\$50.00

Rule 15.E
 The Illinois Alliance Network Designate will issue such certification cards in a prompt manner and, if possible, before any upcoming District or Area championship meet. If overnight delivery service is required, the coach requesting the certification shall pay the charge for such service.

Rule 15.F
 Notwithstanding the foregoing, there will be no fee charged for the issuance of a National certification card to a coach if such coach provides to the Illinois Alliance Network Designate (or his/her delegate) proper documentation of the four required certifications effective through the balance of the competitive season within 15 days of his initial employment by a participating Area YMCA.

Rule 15.G
 No Area coach will be allowed on desk **deck** during a District or Area eChampionship meet without a current National certification **coach credential** card. A valid **coach credential** card can either be a USA Swimming coach registration card that has a "Y" printed on it or a YMCA coach card that has been issued by the YMCA Group Representative. Rule 3.B & 3.C

Reason: I feel this rule needs some clarification in its language. Right now, I interpret it that an 8-year-old may compete in 15-21 year old events because 8 falls into the "21 years of age and under" competitive age group. However, an 8 year old may only swim in an 8&U relay or 9-10 relay, no more than 1 age group up. Is that correct? Should we allow an 8 year old to compete in 15-21 events? I would propose to eliminate the table in section B, re-word section C and add a table within that section that is more clear.
