

Awards Reception Committee

This committee is responsible for the Awards Reception and Senior Night at the end of the short course season. This event usually takes place on a weekday evening at the end of March. Jobs include: working on senior bios, printing or putting together programs, planning, set up, work and clean up at the reception.

Fundraising Committee

Members of this committee work on various team fundraising projects throughout the year such as: team photographs, championship yard signs, and Swim-A-Thon. Swim-A-Thon takes place during practice times on a weekday in mid-June. This is our largest fundraiser. Preparations for a fun and successful event begin in April.

Group Parent Committees (Bronze, Silver, Gold/Yellow, Blue & Senior)

The chairs will serve as a liaison between coaches and group parents to organize activities and assist with projects. Members of these committees will help with bulletin boards, holiday parties, holiday cards and gifts for coaches, theme for PCY Winter Classic, service projects, Senior/Blue canoe trip and other group activities.

Graduating Senior Committee

Members are usually parents of HS seniors and juniors. Members help collect senior bio information and photos for the senior slide show. Meetings will take place throughout the year to plan and collect materials. This committee is also in charge of the senior gift and senior devotion at the Awards Reception. Chairs will coordinate with the person creating the slide show as well as the Awards Reception Chair.

Meet Awards Distribution Committee

This committee chair makes sure swim folders are up to date at the start of each season and coordinates with the head coach to get the awards following a meet. Committee members sort awards and distribute them to the appropriate swimmer folders in a timely manner.

Meet Operations Committee

This committee is run by the Meet Director and Assistant Meet Director. Members have specific jobs that they will perform at home meets. Jobs include: Meet Set Up and Clean Up, Volunteer Check In, and Announcers. You will be provided training. This counts as your committee work and your meet work.

Meet Concessions and Hospitality Committee

This committee coordinates and runs the concessions and hospitality at our home meets. These jobs require commitment and count as both your committee work and your meet work. Members have specific jobs such as: concessions or hospitality supervisors, cooks, shoppers, set up and clean-up crew. Training is provided.

Officials Committee

Members of the Officials Committee must be certified YMCA Swim Officials. Training is offered in the spring and fall and consists of classroom work, an online test and a brief apprenticeship period. (No experience necessary – training is provided.) Cost is reimbursed upon successful fulfillment of service hours at the end of the season. This job fulfills your committee work and your meet work.

Meet Timing Team Committee

The Timing Team is responsible for the set-up and tear down of all timing equipment as well as operation of the Colorado Timing booth and meet computer. New team members will receive "on the job" training. Members of the team will be needed to help at all home meets (Polar Bear, dual meets, and A champs). The team is also needed to help at the HS Classic in January. You are not required to work every session of every meet. This job fulfills your committee work and your meet work.

Photography Committee

This committee takes pictures at swim meets for the team to use. There are positions for each age group. You must provide your own camera with an SD card or external device to transfer files. You are responsible for some editing and sorting. Additional details and guidelines will be provided to committee members.

Spirit Wear Committee

This committee selects, helps design, organizes and distributes team spirit wear including: Team Fan Shirts, Personalized Swim Caps, Team Spirit Wear, Polar Bear Shirts, etc. There is a general committee that works with the chair to coordinate all spirit wear. There are also specific jobs throughout the season.

Summer Breakfast of Champions Committee

This committee hosts a breakfast for swimmers during practice times on the Thursday before Long Course Champs. Committee work consists of two required days -1 hour on Wednesday night for set-up and approximately 4 hours on Thursday morning. Tasks include preparing and serving food to swimmers as well as clean up.

Triathlon – Family Fun Festival Committee

The Triathlon Committee runs the annual Fun Fest portion of the YMCA's Healthy Kids Triathlon held every year on a Saturday in late August. You are responsible for setting up the event on the Friday evening before and clean-up afterwards. (7 hours of work - 2hrs on Friday and 5hrs. on Saturday). Adults will help serve food as well as supervise stations and activities. Only sign up for this committee if you are available the last two weekends in August.

Winter Psych Party Committee

This committee plans a Winter Psych Party for the team prior to A Championships. This event takes place on the last Sunday in February. There is 1 planning meeting prior to the event in early January. Some prep work is assigned and done independently. All members must attend the January meeting and the event. Jobs at the event include set-up and clean-up (approximately 4-8PM)

Zone Meet Committee

This committee organizes the team dinner: location, menu, sign-ups and billing. They coordinate with the Hotel Accommodations Chair to secure a block of hotel rooms. They coordinate with the Spirit Wear Committee to design, order shirts and distribute shirts. The Communications Chair and Head Coach will provide guidance and help as needed. Your swimmer should be attending the Zone Meet (qualifying times needed).
