

Swimming Roundup: Heath's Mitchell places second

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Heath sophomore Cole Mitchell had two impressive finishes to lead area swimmers Saturday in the Coshocton Invitational.

Mitchell placed second in the 200 free (2:14.21) and third in the 100 butterfly (1:07.21) to lead the Bulldogs. Connor McColley finished 14th in the 100 free (1:08.80).

Newark's James Dow finished 14th (2:40.18) in the 200 free, and teammate Mathew Pino finished 15th (1:37.23) in the 100 back.

In the girls meet, the foursome of Sarah Houpt, Kaitlyn LeFevre, Lauren Burd and Hannah Dehus placed seventh (2:18.02) in the 200 freestyle relay to lead the Wildcats.

Granville sweeps

Granville's teams swept a five-team meet at the Licking County Family YMCA on Saturday.

In the girls meet, Granville individual winners were Alexandra Specht in the 200 free (2:27.21) and Sarah Martin in the 50 free (28.08) and 100 free (1:01.38).

Northridge's Katelyn Darby (100 breaststroke, 1:25.56; 400 free, 5:13.07) and Riley Bunstine (100 back, 1:12.55; 200 IM, 2:39.99) also were double winners, and Newark Catholic's Callie Barnett won the 100 fly (1:15.97).

Licking Valley's Siarra Hoover placed second in the 200 IM (2:48.77).

In the boys meet, Granville's individual winners were Aaron Sargent in the 100 free (59.87) and 200 free (2:17.17); Rowan Moore in the 200 IM (2:24.36) and 100 breaststroke (1:15.95); Tristan Mullins in the 100 fly (1:08.96); Ross Barnett in the 400 free (5:25.97) and Bryson Hauenstein in the 100 back (1:12.41).

Northridge's Gabe Miller won the 50 free (28.42), and NC's Chris Ouweleen took second in the 200 free (2:28.49).

Watkins boys take second

Watkins Memorial's boys reset four school records Saturday while taking runner-up honors in the Delaware Invitational.

Individual winners were Issaac Hansen in the 500 free (5:13.30) and 200 free (1:53.91); Ian Jarvis in the 200 IM (2:17.36) and Zack Chism in the 100 back (58.31). Jarvis, Chism, Ethan Miller and Spencer Kleeh also won the 200 medley relay.

Abby Jarvis won the 500 free (6:05.52) to lead the girls to a third-place finish.
