

Oakhurst Orca Pod Swim Camp Protocol 2021

NOTE: This document is meant to explain and outline how Oakhurst Country Club Orca Swim Camp could operate safely under adherence to the Contra Costa Health Department's strict guidelines and social distancing protocols.

In order to comply with strict guidelines, the following conditions will be put in place:

- Social distancing MAX capacity within pool gates:
 - Pool = 15 (2-3 swimmer per lane depending on households)
 - Pool Deck = 3 (Orca swim camp leaders/coaches)
 - Orca swim camp leaders/coaches will be assigned to two groups (15 swimmers) for three weeks
- No illness whatsoever; If anyone has had a cough, fever (any temp above 99.6 degrees), shortness of breath with the last 2 weeks, swimmers are not allowed within the gate (see drop-off section below regarding how we will enforce)
- Swimmers must bring their own gear – towel, goggles, kick-board, filled water bottle, etc.
 - NO sharing of anything
- Swimmers must come dressed ready to enter pool. No changing onsite.
- Lap swimmers only, no leisure use
- 6-Foot social distancing must be observed at all times.
- Swim Camp leaders and staff must wear a mask at all times.
 - Swimmers must wear a mask entering and exiting the pool.
- Main Gate will be used for drop-off and Ramp Gate will be used for exiting.
 - Sidewalks will have 6ft social distancing markings
- Sidewalk at pickup area will be marked to allow social distancing while waiting on transportation
- No lifeguards on duty except certified Orca swim camp leaders.
- No shower, water fountain, or furniture use.
- The bathroom is open for emergency use (one person at a time) but not changing; it will be disinfected after each use.
- Gates propped open to negate handle touching.
- Hand sanitizing will be provided at each gate (entry and exit).
- All transportation (golf carts, autos, etc) must be parked in parking spot.

Swim Camp Drop-Off Process – Main Gate

- 1 Assigned Orca camp leader for that group will wait at the main gate
 - Swimmer is dropped off, wearing a mask, and approaches the Main gate, being sure to maintain a 6-foot distance.
 - Assigned Orca camp leader may ask basic Covid-19 questions (recent cough, fever -temperature higher than 99.6 degrees, shortness of breath, etc.).
 - Assigned Orca camp leader will assign lane to swimmer and instruct swimmer to enter the pool either deep side of the pool (odd lanes) or shallow side of the pool (even lanes) and waits for coach assigned on the pool deck to give instructions.
 - Swimmer sanitizes hands at main gate.
 - Swimmer puts towel and gear at entry point of their assigned lane.

Swim Camp Pool Exit – Ramp Gate

- Upon completion of swim camp, swimmer exits the pool, towels off, takes gear, puts mask on, sanitizes their hands, and exits via the Ramp Gate (not touching any surfaces) adhering to social distance guidelines until entering household vehicle.
- Sidewalk will be marked to indicate proper social distancing.
