

COVID-19 Disinfecting Protocol

The following tasks will be completed daily by the swim club staff, to include the Manager, Lifeguards, or Board Members who may be present at the pool.

The Swim Club will be using *Fresh Fields* (EPA Registration Number 10324-154-14531) and *Spray Nine* EPA Registration Number 6659-3). The *Fresh Fields* disinfectant is mixed 2 oz. of disinfectant with 1 gal of water, *Spray Nine* is a ready-to-use disinfectant and should **NOT be mixed** with any other chemicals. Staff must follow these directions (from the disinfectant label) to ensure the product is being used according to the EPA-approved label directions for disinfection.

Spray surface to be disinfected so that the surface is thoroughly wet. Let stand for appropriate time as per disinfectant directions then wipe with a clean paper towel. Staff should wear disposable gloves while disinfecting. Gloves should be disposed off after all disinfecting work is complete and then wash their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds.

The following high touch surfaces are to be disinfected hourly. Staff may only use the disinfectant identified by the Manager and Board so that the Swim Club ensures we are using an EPA-approved disinfectant on *List N: Disinfectants for Use Against SARS-CoV-2*.

* Cleaning products are subject to change due to availability at the discretion of the Pool Board or Manager.

Swimming Pool Area: *Spray Nine* (30 second wet time)

Gate attendant table

Grill handles/knobs - to be cleaned after each use (Grills will not be available for member use to open season)

Plastic and strap chairs for member usage (All chairs will be stored at the front gate, with separate piles for returned and disinfected chairs).

Pool ladders and steps (2 on near side, 1 far side shallow end, 1 deep end)

Diving board and slide handrails (Diving board and slide will not be available to open season)

Lifeguard stand hand rails and seats

Please note: disinfecting of wooden surfaces is not recommended members will be required to provide their own vinyl tablecloth in order to use wooden tables.

Bathhouses: *Fresh Fields Disinfectant* (10 minute wet time)

Toilet seats and flush handles
Stall door locks/handles/curtains
Counter/sink and faucets
Paper Towel dispenser (metal housing only)
Shower faucets

In order to achieve the 10 minute wet time, Staff will spray down all surfaces in a bathroom and then go back and begin wiping off the surfaces in the order they were sprayed. For items such as pool ladders, Staff will thoroughly wet the surface and have to wait for 30 seconds before wiping down. Staff may use the same paper towel to wipe down all the surfaces in one bathroom and then use a new paper towel to wipe down the other bathroom. The same paper towel may be used to wipe down all the ladders and handrails.

Lifeguards will alternate in shifts of 30 minutes on the lifeguard stand and 30 minutes off. The lifeguard not on duty watching the pool will be responsible for executing the cleaning protocol and checking the pool water chlorine and ph levels. Levels will be checked every hour.

Lifeguards should wear disposable gloves when removing trash. After cleaning, staff should wash their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
