

DUAL SWIM MEET SCORING:

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS:

- 1st place - 5 team points
- 2nd place - 3 team points
- 3rd place - 1 team point

RELAYS:

- 1st place - 7 team points

NO SWEEP RULE:

A team cannot sweep an individual event (i.e., score all 9 Points). If a team sweeps an event it receives 8 points and the other team gets the third place 1 point. (But the swimmer who actually finished third gets the third place ribbon).

EXHIBITION RACES:

Exhibition races do not count toward team points.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

If a swimmer is disqualified ([DQ'd](#)) during an event, he or she will not score any team points.

RIBBONS:

Ribbons are awarded for 1st through 6th place in individual events for swimmers 12 and under; and 1st through 4th place for swimmers 13 and older. Ribbons are awarded for 1st through 3rd place in relays for all swimmers. If a swimmer is in a relay that is DQ'd, there are no ribbons awarded to any swimmer. If a swimmer is in a relay that finishes 4th, 5th or 6th place, there are no ribbons awarded. Exhibition ribbons are awarded for individual events to swimmers 12 and under. If a swimmer is disqualified (DQ'd) from an individual event, a ribbon will not be awarded. Ribbons from the previous swim meet are available for pick up after race 30 at the scorer's table.

*Note: There are special scoring rules for unopposed races and ties. Talk to a scorer for details (but not during the meets, they are very busy)!

DUAL DIVE MEET SCORING:

Summer Diving has 4 age groups: 10 & under, 11-12, 13-14, 15 & Over

In diving, there are 5 categories of dives:

- Front
- Back
- Reverse (you walk forward and dive or somersault backwards)
- Inward (you start on the board backwards but dive or somersault in towards the board)
- Twist (any dive or somersault with a twist added)
- *Most dives/somersaults can be done in one of three positions: tuck, pike or straight
- All divers must do a 101 (front dive) as their first dive in each meet.
- For meets, divers must do the following:
 - 10 & Under: 101, 2 other dives from 2 different groups (3 dives total)
 - 11-12: 101, 3 other dives from 2 different groups (4 dives total)
 - 13-14: 101, 3 other dives from 2 different groups (4 dives total)
 - 15 & Up: 101, 3 other dives from 3 different groups (4 dives total)
- For all dual meets, the coaches from each team serve as the judges.
- Scores are based on a 0-10 point scale.
- The judges awards are added together, then multiplied by the dive's degree of difficulty to determine the total points earned for that dive.
