

Yann has served on numerous Boards throughout the State of California and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to this opportunity of serving on the SCAT Board for a two-year term. During his tenure of serving on Boards, he has held numerous officer positions at the Chamber of Commerce, Tourism Board, Stadium Steering Board, local Rotary Board and Swim Club Boards to name a few.

In addition to Yann giving up his time to give back to the community and local sporting groups, he was a two-time French Olympian at the 1992 Barcelona and 1996 Atlanta Games who achieved a world ranking as high as 7th in the 200 meter Freestyle and 200 meter Butterfly. His International experience spans a decade long of success where he participated in two Olympiads, one World Championship, three European Championships (winning a Bronze Medal in 1993), three World University Games (winning eight medals including two gold), five World Cups (four medals) and four U.S. Opens (winning six medals including four gold). As a French National Team member from 1992-2001, he served as team captain in 1995, 1998 and 1999 and was a 14-time French National Champion, a three-time U.S. National Champion and has traveled to over 100 countries spanning six continents during his swimming career.

At the collegiate level, Yann was a twelve-time All American from 1991-1995 at the University of North Carolina. From 1997 to 2000, he served as the Assistant Swim Coach for the University of Georgia under Jack Bauerle ('08 US Swimming Women's Olympic Head Coach) where he was part of the 1999 and 2000 Women's NCAA Championship Teams. Lastly, he served as an Assistant Coach at SCAT from October 2013 up until February 2020. He attended the University of North Carolina and earned a B.S. in Business and International Studies while earning his MBA from Pepperdine University.
