1. Approval of minutes from October 4, 2003- 2<sup>nd</sup> approved
2. Old business-
  - a) 10 and Under and 11 and 12 Age groups-move the 200 IM from the Sunday to Saturday to reflect the order of events of the SC Championships.
  - b) Order of events- 11 and 12 events should proceed the 10 and Under events.
3. Report of Officers  
Age Group Vice Chair- Jackie Bussard-Bertucci- Zone team report, Meet in Fort Lauderdale, formula will be 7/3. Hotel reservations have been secured and working on Air Fare. Goal is to keep the cost down for the swimmers and the association.  
Senior Vice Chair-James Barber- report on the Association's results at the recent Short Course Championship season. Report will be on the web page.
4. Review of Southeastern Championships  
Districts
  - a) West-OK around 400 swimmers, one course used.
  - b) East- Sessions were about 4 hours long, one course was used, around 445 swimmers.
  - c) South- Large numbers, 620 swimmers, over 4 hour sessions, used two courses.Southeasterns
  - a) Little large but went well, Warm ups need to be addressed.
5. Submitted proposals
  - a. Brian Wrighton - Districts - divide the existing districts into four geographical areas. After much discussion - passed.
  - b. Ed DeBruyn - Anti-recruiting - withdrawn by Ed.
  - c. Stan Corcoran - Districts - Recommended that Stan come back with more details, numbers, detailed outline of events and the effects of his proposal would be on the

District meet.

d. Ed DeBruyn - Disabled swimmers-Recommended that we get more information from the Disabled community as to their needs-tabled until the Fall.

e. Ed DeBruyn - Team specific warmup procedures-Not Recommend to pass.

f. Tom Healey- Aquatic guide changes/additions

a) Outreach - Add to A.1.C. Outreach Athletes  
Registration fee \$5.00. Athletes must provide certification of enrollment in a Reduced or Free Lunch Program.  
Recommended to Pass

b) Open Water Swim Membership - Add to A.1.D.  
Membership for a specific date of an Open Water competition. The athlete must compete unattached. Single-meet membership is not valid for competition at or above the Zone Championship. Fee will be the USA fee of \$10.00 and the LSC basic fee of \$5.00=\$15.00. Recommend to Pass.

c) Seasonal Membership-add a third category to our seasonal membership. The Open Seasonal Membership-membership will be offered for an unspecified by continuous period of not more that 150 days commencing on the date of REGISTRATION. Seasonal membership is not valid for competition at or above the Zone Championship level. Fee would be the USA fee plus the basic fee of \$5.00. For the 2005 season it would be \$21.00 plus \$5.00=\$26.00 Recommend to pass.

D) Section 4 - General Meet Management - 4.3 Specific rules about SES competitions. Add A.18. Host team meet director will submit the Meet Manager SD3 file (registration file) to the Registration Chairperson as close to one week before the scheduled meet and will upon completion of the meet send an updated SD3 file to the Registration Chairperson to verify athlete's current registration status. Recommend to pass.

## 6. New Business

a) Time Standards- hand out was distributed, recommendation to amend the time standards for the 800/1000 and the 1500/1650 to the 24<sup>th</sup> place and to use the past three years data. Passed

b) Joe Goeken - Proposal to add 15/16 age group to Southeasterns beginning this Summer with revisions to the existing format for Seniors and 13 & 14 consolations. Times standards were to be established by a committee and presented to the body at a later time during the weekend for approval. Both Proposal and time standards were passed.
