2019 Southern Zone Age Group Championships

This was the first year we did NOT take a senior age group to the meet. Based on this, we knew we would struggle with how to keep the team engaged and excited.

We took a full team of 11-12 and 13-14 kids plus one disability swimmer. The swimmers swam well especially given the meet's timing versus SES Championships. We finished the meet with 35 individual top 8 finishes including 13 top 3 finishes. Two relays were top 3 and we finished the meet in 7th place. It became more difficult to keep the excitement going as the week went on and we were not vying for a top team finish.

We are looking at ways to keep the kids engaged at Age Group Zones as well as getting our very top swimmers applied. The meet will be in Tupelo, Mississippi in late July.

2019 Southern Zone Open Water Championships

We took 17 swimmers to OW which was not a full team. It was disappointing not to have any 11-12 boys apply for the team. In addition, we had kids apply who did not meet the minimum selection criteria. We definitely need to market the meet better than we have.

We finished 7th overall. We had 6 top 8 individual finishes with one overall Open winner. We won one relay and were fourth in another. Three swimmers qualified for Open Water Junior Nationals next year with their swims.

We plan to market the OW meet better and give more time for kids to qualify. It will help that the meet is not until late May this year. The meet will be in Chattanooga, Tennessee and we plan to have parents be responsible for getting their kids to the meet like this year.
