COMMENTS

First game of the tournament matched two south American countries Argentina and Brazil. The first half of the game as a very close one. Brazil went ahead on a penalty goal by Guimaraes (#11) the lone goal of the quarter. Strong defense and solid goalkeeping by both teams kept the game close with neither team able to capitalize on their extra man situation. The second quarter was almost an exact copy of the first one. Real (#7) from Brazil was the lone scorer of the quarter. Leading 2-1 at the start of the third quarter Brazil started capitalizing on their patient and precise game plan. For the second time Brazil as able to score on a penalty shot and capitalized with four seconds left in the quarter to close the quarter with a 5-2 lead. Last quarter was all Brazil. They scored from the perimeter from extra man and from turnovers by Argentina. Brazil scored three goals in a three minute span to open a close game to go ahead 8-2.
