



MODEL LOCKER ROOM MONITORING

PURPOSE

The following guidelines are designed to maintain personal privacy as well as to reduce the risk of misconduct in locker rooms and changing areas.

FACILITIES

The following is a description of our practice and competition facilities to allow athletes and their families to plan their use:

We practice at: Volusia Flagler Family YMCA – Ormond Beach/Port Orange location

This location has: Locker Rooms designated for 18 and under only

Sample locker room descriptions:

The changing area that is shared with the other minors in general public. As such, there are likely to be other minors who are not associated with Hydro4 Swimming in the changing area around the time of practice.

MONITORING General Policy Considerations

Coaches and staff make every effort to recognize when an athlete goes to the locker room or changing area during practice and competition and, if they do not return in a timely fashion, we will check on the athlete's whereabouts. We discourage parents from entering locker rooms and changing areas unless it is truly necessary. In those instances, it should only be a same-sex parent. If this is necessary, parents should let the coach, YMCA staff or administrator know about this in advance.

If an athlete needs assistance with his or her uniform or gear (for example, a child under the age of eight), or an athlete's disability warrants assistance, then we ask that parents let the coach or an administrator know beforehand that he or she will be helping the athlete. They are allowed to take the athlete into the men/women changing area if accompanied by guardian.

USE OF CELL PHONES AND OTHER MOBILE RECORDING DEVICES Cell phones and other mobile devices with recording capabilities, including voice recording, still cameras and video cameras increase the risk for different forms of misconduct in locker rooms and changing areas. The USA Swimming Athlete Protection Policies prohibit the use of such devices in the locker room or other changing area. The YMCA prohibits any photography inside locker rooms.
