

ASC Locker Room Behavior Policy

Locker rooms and changing areas are a high-risk area for abuse to happen. Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy addresses this in the Locker Rooms & Changing Areas section, but the following policies are in place to ensure our locker room activity is compliant with USAS MAAPP policy.

In the locker rooms, whether at our home pool or a facility at which ASC is a visitor, we expect people to behave as a welcomed guest would:

- Get in, shower, dress and get out. 10-15 minutes is plenty for locker rooms
- 15
- Keep the water in the shower area and use the toilets for bathroom purposes
- Show respect for others' privacy and leave others' personal property alone
- Use the courteous and respectful language teammates deserve
- Keep your belongings in a contained area (duffel bag, swim bag, locker). We recommend locking up property to protect items from public access.
- Spitting, horseplay, throwing things or behavior that could be considered unhealthy, unsanitary or likely to cause injury, may result in team suspension.
- as we share with other groups, such as water fitness groups, we ask all clothing be stowed away neatly or in an out of the way bag allowing access for all other users.

Cell phones, cameras or other devices of any kind that are capable of taking or producing still or video pictures are not allowed in the locker rooms at any time.

Phone calls or texts should be made in a public area outside the locker room and under no circumstances should photos or videos be taken in changing areas.

Locker room infractions are a USA Swimming safe sport issue and are taken seriously.

Depending on the severity of the infraction consequences may include

- parent meeting and one month suspension of locker room privileges
- permanent suspension of locker room privileges
- suspension from the team
