

Arriving at the Facility

Swimmers will NOT enter through the main UW Health entrance. The pool entrance is to the far right of the main entrance, just past the glass block wall. Proceed down the ramp and wait for your coach. The pool entrance will remain locked until a coach is present and will remain locked during practice.

- Locker rooms will NOT be available for changing. Swimmers should arrive ready to swim and leave immediately after practice ends.
- A designated area will be provided on deck for personal items but please limit what you bring.
- Please be aware of other pool users on deck and in the warm water pool.
- Only swimmers allowed in the facility. No family members or visitors.

Prior to Swimming

Swimmers entering the Research Park Aquatic Center will participate in COVID screening process. The Lifeguard will ask you three COVID related questions and will take your temperature with a forehead thermometer. It may take you a few extra minutes to complete the screening process before you proceed into the Aquatic Center.

- For the process to go as quickly as possible, please allow our screeners to ask the questions in their entirety before answering.
- We will ask you the below COVID-19 related questions. Do not come to the Aquatic Center if:
 - You are experiencing any new or unexplained symptoms of fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, sore throat, severe fatigue/exhaustion, muscle pain, loss of taste and/or smell, headache, nausea/vomiting, or diarrhea
 - You were exposed to someone with a positive COVID-19 test in the past 14 days
 - You had a positive COVID-19 test in the past 20 days.
- We do not need to know your vaccination status and it will not exclude you from the screening process.
- If you screen positive you will not be allowed to enter UW Health Research Park or the Aquatic Center.
- While in the UW Health Aquatic Center, everyone will wear a medical grade barrier mask until pool activity begins.
- Social distancing will be reinforced, please maintain 6-foot distance from others, not including family members.
