As a volunteer-run club, we rely on volunteer board members to keep the club and our meets running smoothly. We meet via Zoom once a month. The additional time required varies by role and time of year, but board roles are fairly low stress. Board terms are three years.

Fundraising Chair

As a nonprofit swim club, the Fundraising Chair plays a vital role in leading and shaping the club's fundraising activities to bring in much-needed funds to support our program.

As the Fundraising Chair, you'll help the renew and recruit new club sponsors in late summer early fall. You'll also run the club's annual wreath sale; orders are solicited in September/October, and wreaths are delivered in November. You'll manage communication, gathering orders for families, submitting our order to the company, organizing pickup and receiving money from Sharks families.

We also have a spring pizza sale, which is an easy and delicious fundraiser. Orders are solicited in March/April, with delivery in early May. Duties are similar to those outlined for the wreath sale.

The Fundraising Chair also has the freedom, with input from the board, to plan and lead other fundraisers. You'll also help the board president and operations manager track fundraising progress and set the fundraising goal for our annual budget.

Approximate time commitment for this role:

- Monthly meetings (about 1 hour, 11 months of the year)
- A few hours in July/August, October/November and March/April to solicit/new sponsors, organize and administer fundraisers
- A few hours in November and late April/early May to run product pick-up; can coordinate with others for support
- Time for any other fundraising activities you'd like to do to support the team

Board members receive priority registration as having an active swimmer in the program is a requirement for being a board member.
