The meeting was called to order at 10:06 AM

1. Welcome and Roll Call

2. Approval of Fall 2009 HOD Minutes

The minutes from the October 3, 2009 House of Delegates meeting held at the Kroc Center in Coeur D'Alene, ID had been available for review on the IES website. Copies were made available at the meeting if there were any questions. There were no changes or additions. A motion was made and seconded that the minutes from the Fall HOD meeting be approved. The motion was carried.

3. Reports of Chairpersons and Officers

Reports were submitted and copies provided as part of the agenda. All reports are attached.

Robert Broyles, General Chair – Has been elected as Western Zone National Director. If anyone has anything that you would like to have brought up to the national board, please let Robert know as he is now the direct pipeline for that. Every LSC in the country will be required to participate in the LEAP program. LSC Evaluation Program that will evaluate performance and quality that each LSC provides to not only each club, but also the athletes, parents and volunteers. Each LSC has a deadline by when they need to complete requirements and submit to USA Swimming. Our deadline is not until next year sometime. It is fairly complete and detailed. Each LSC needs to get all paperwork, procedures, rules and regulations down, getting rid of old references and bringing everything up to date. They upcoming board will be in charge for getting this all together

and we will be asking for their help. The idea of LEAP is to improve LSCs. One of the ideas is to do something with LSC, either shrink them down or do away with them altogether. So, please step up and perform well make sure we keep our LSC strong and so we can keep it here in our area. We do a great job and let's keep it that way.

Another issue is the sexual abuse issues all over USA swimming. Spoke with coaches yesterday and with not going into a lot of detail, if there are any issues in any of your clubs or if anyone comes to you with allegations, please do not deal with them in your club. Bring them to Robert and he will report them to USA Swimming and get a handle on them. Right now there are at least 4 cases in the courts and there are more TV features coming up along with a 20/20 episode and NY times articles. Do not set yourself up for trouble. Do not create new policies until we are given instructions to do so. Let USA Swimming tell us what to do regarding this issue.

Todd Marsh, Administrative Vice-Chair – Ran audit that was overdue for Inland Empire with Todd Stafek and Mitch Anderson. There were no flaws or problems with review. Will be submitted to USA Swimming. We have been working on rules and regulations and disability portion will have a few additions. Inland Empire is known to be very accommodating on allowing disability swimmers.

Todd Stafek, Senior Vice Chair/Records – Seventeen SC records were broken. Regarding Senior Travel Fund we used 67 points and currently are at 57 points, so we are having more athletes taking advantage of senior travel fund so each point will be worth a little bit less than last year, so we will be keeping track of that pretty close. Quite a few swimmers attended short course nationals and short course junior nationals. Nobody attended NCSA junior national and one team with three swimmers went to the Austin Grand Prix. We have summer nationals and summer junior nationals coming up.

Vicki Marsh, Age Group Vice-Chair – Working on Zones Trip for summer, had great feedback on caps for incentive for short course champs.

Mickie Beck, Treasurer – Current budget looks on track. Senior Travel Fund has a little over \$2,000. Zones trip plane tickets have been purchased. Started a High Yield Savings Account that has made \$200. No out of the ordinary expenditures.

Kyle Marsh-Sr. Athletic Rep – Joe Loftus is now the new Junior Representative. Thought the clinic with was great and the speech was the best ever. They are trying to come up with some new things to do at Zones for the Spirit Award.

Kevin Wang – Coaches Representative – Going to be making a coaches clinic/think tank in conjunction with the Fall HOD and have come up with 24 topics will pare down to 4 topics that a local coach who has expertise in that area can give a talk.

Don Hougardy – Safety Chair – No incidents to speak of, everything looks really good.

Jack Beck and Don Hougardy-Co-officials Coordinators – IES has new Team Unify website with an official's site. Loren Eddy is updating officials listing. Sorted by name, by club and by certification. Started a program to put out a quarterly newsletter to communicate with coaches, swimmers and parents to keep everyone up on current issues.

If you have articles you would like to submit, please talk to Jack or Don. Our officials are going outside of our LSC which is great for us to come back with lots information. Bringing evaluators in such as Dan McGowan and Gloria Schultz help to keep the quality of our officiating up and we are proud of how IES is doing. An issue is getting new officials and keeping officials. We are working on a program to reward teams that go out and help with other meets and encourage teams to acquire more officials on their teams. Don Hougardy has been chosen to replace Robert Broyles as Western Zones Chair!

Dave Drown – Equipment Coordinator – Well within budget. Have not spent anything since last October. No major damages or problems with IES equipment. Upgraded to Colorado System 6. New set of shortened instructions sheets has been written up. The wireless stopwatches we bought last year have had some major malfunctions. Please see report. Watches are also expensive to keep in 9V batteries. The watches are not kept in the trailer so if you would like to use them, please request them and we will find a way to get them to you. There have been inquiries as to buying a PA system for the trailer. The issue becomes that the trailer is already packed full. Over the next year or two we need to think about purchasing a larger trailer. A thought is a horse trailer that could also be used as a results office. Todd Stafek and Dave will do some research into a larger, safer trailer and will report back at the next HOD meeting. Other questions talked about a second starter unit and deck computer when IES is running two meets on the same weekend. There was also some discussion of eventually phasing out the trailer and each club having their own systems.

Karen Byers – Registration Chair – In Orlando for National Registration Committee Meeting. Robert indicated that registration in IE are on the way up. Congratulations to all the teams.

Kari Weinman – See attached report

Loren Eddy-Club Development – Toyota Championship Series now changed to a full year. USA Swimming has announced Club Excellence Awards. The program has been ongoing for 10 years and recognizes the top 200 clubs in the United States. IES has been represented every single year by either Spokane or Tri-Cities or both. Both SAS and TCCC has been recognized this year and Spokane Waves is almost there. Club Recognition Program has been progressing. The last report indicates that SAS has moved to Level 2, as has CAST. SWAT has moved to Level 3. Encouraged other clubs to get involved in the program.

Ken Schuh – Open Water – We have two open water swims scheduled for this year. The Snake River Challenge offers a ¾ mile swim on July 3rd and Coeur d’Alene on August 14. Sanction should be ready soon. CDA will be offering 2.5, 5 or 10 K distances so we need lots of officials. Ken will be going to the National Open Water Officials Clinic on June 3-6 in Long Beach, CA in conjunction with the National 5 and 10 K championships which is the national qualifier for US National Team as well as Canadian Team. IES goal is to have four open water events within 3-4 year. CAST has a goal to be bidding on national championship. USA swimming is really pushing open water events.

b. Meet Entry Priority Report

Have made some accommodations for some clubs such as Apple Capital and Summer Solstice that will allow them to change their meet entry system and dates to allow early entry into those meets. For example Apple Capital had 550 entries in 3 hours. They were proactive with communication to make sure we can get our LSC entries in before they fill up. Communication is very important and we do want to have priority for our own teams because the west side response is very large. Loren Eddy and Kari Weinman have worked on the meet priority issue. Ken Schuh, Loren and Kari will work on information for the rules and regulations.

c. Officials at Meets Report

Want to reiterate the need for more parents on deck and how IES can positively encourage that.

d. IES Rules and Regulations Housekeeping and Updates

Important to get Rules and Regulations updated. Several sections have been completed.

- Section 5 – Time Standards – Pulled for revisions – Approved Unanimously
- Section 7 – Records – Approved Unanimously
- Section 8 – IES Zone Team – Approved Unanimously
- Section 9 – IES Financial Assistance Program – Approved Unanimously
- Section 10 – IES Equipment Procedures – Approved Unanimously as is. Corrections may be made regarding open water equipment.

Hope to have remainder of sections approved at Fall HOD Meeting.

- e. **Open Water Equipment Proposals – Ken Schuh/Dave Drown**
See attached report. Would like to have equipment to use collectively for open water events. The radios we have are not powerful enough to cover the entire distance on open water events. Also to create open water event fees in the range of \$35-\$45 to help pay back the total amount into the IES Equipment Fund. Conversation centered around the equipment belonging to IES and radios can be used for other IES meets. After lengthy discussion the following was proposed:

Separate Surcharge Structure for Open Water Events: The IES surcharge fees for Open Water will be the same as for all IES swim meets. Approved Unanimously

Purchase of 12 Radios for Open Water Events instead of the 10 proposed to be used for Open Water Events, Champs meets and to be requested for other meets. Approved Unanimously

To allow up to \$10,000 for purchase (including radios) and accommodate storage for open water equipment to be owned by IES to be purchased ASAP. Approved unanimously

- f. **2011 Meet Schedule –** See report
Meet Schedule with additions and corrections – Approved Unanimously
- g. **Order of Events for SC Champs/Time Standards for Relays –** No change – same as last year.
- h. **LC Champs –** has some changes. Todd will send out approved changes.

6. **New Business**

- a. **Rules and Regulations for sanctions for champs meets** have been changed almost every year. Proposal is to have a pre-approved sanction for all three LSC Championship Meets. It will be provided to the club hosting the meet. All they will have to do is fill in the blanks. Also have a template for the Meet Director to follow and then report back to HOD meeting before the meet. Loren Eddy will send to Executive Board prior to fall meeting.
- b. **Open Water Meets –** Ken Schuh will be working with Loren for additions to the Rules and Regulations regarding Open Water meets.
- c. **Consolation Finals for 15 & Over at Championship Meets –** Kevin Wang will work on this.

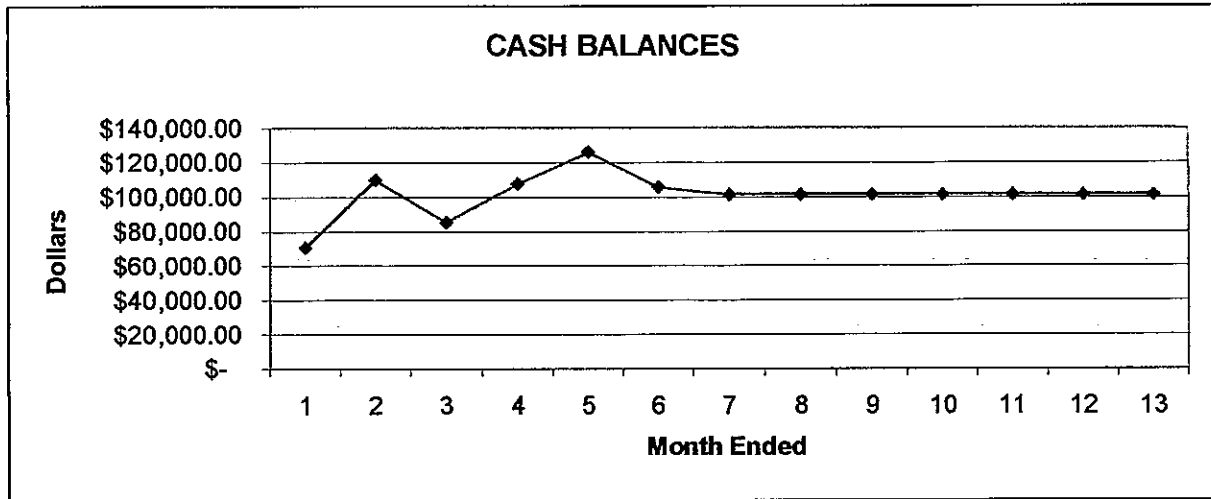

Sanctions Report

Kari Weinman

To date for 2010 sanctions, I have sanctioned 21 meets. Most of the meets for the remainder of the summer LC season have been sanctioned with the exception of LC Champs and a few others. Issues with sanctions have been minimal with maybe the exception of a few. Hopefully clearer guidelines and the revision of procedures will make the process easier for all involved.

Dolphin wireless stop watches

The IES set of 21 Dolphin wireless stop watches has been repaired by Colorado Time Systems and were tested as the PRIMARY timing system at a pair of high school dual meets (late October 2009). They will not be included in the IES equipment trailer, but are available from the equipment chair upon request.

Conclusions and recommendations:

The Dolphin wireless stop watches can be used as the PRIMARY timing system. They are more susceptible to human error. They DO NOT reduce labor, DO NOT eliminate need for manual watches, and they require a higher skill level, training & experience of the people running the system.

- 1) the Dolphins technically work but require a higher skill level of people including the STARTER, RESULT COMPUTER OPERATOR, and LANE TIMERS. The potential for human error is greater with the Dolphins than with our normal way of running a meet timing system; make a mistake and the entire race times are lost, not just a single swimmer.
- 2) MANUAL WATCHES must still be used as back up and times recorded on paper at each lane! The only meet labor reduction when using the Dolphins is the runner is not needed after every event to collect the timer sheets; the runner will only be needed when there is a discrepancy in the wireless watch times or one of the above listed people makes a mistake (which happened on ~10 to 15% of the heats with some of the most experienced IES starters & computer operators in IES working the 'test meets').
- 3) the Dolphin watches are EXPENSIVE TO OPERATE, Colorado claims the 9-volt battery in each watch should last ~30 hours of operation. That would mean you need to supply 20 batteries for a typical 3-day swim meet at ~\$40 buying alkaline Duracell 9-volt batteries in bulk 10-packs at Costco. The limited experience so far with about 10 hours of meet use plus set up programming, diagnostic testing, and whatever operational testing Colorado did while they repaired them has required 4 watch batteries to be replaced during the second test meet (these meets were only 3-to-4 hours total operational time); it looks like maybe 20 hours of operation will be the actual battery life. Thus you will need to have at least 17 spare batteries on hand for an 8-lane pool! Might need 2 complete sets of batteries to run a full 3-day meet.
- 4) RECOMMENDED applications = small meets that are not using touch pads, the Dolphin system makes a convenient PRIMARY timing system if you have experienced skilled people running the meet. All you need is a Colorado Infinity

Start Unit, the Dolphin watches, and Meet Manager results computer with the Dolphin software also installed (this software is on a CD included in the case with the Dolphin watches and is straightforward to install and set up). Plus manual stop watches as backup times, use 2 timers per lane with each timer running a Dolphin in one hand and a manual watch in the other hand.

- 5) to attempt to use Dolphins as backup timing system with touch pads, a special upgrade license version of Meet Manager from HyTech is required (must be purchased and mailed to you since HyTech will not provide it online as a download). IES purchased this upgrade last winter to use on the IE Championship Meet license and Karen Byers tried without success after numerous phone conversations with HyTech support to get Meet Manager to interface with the Dolphin data as backup times to the pads/buttons as primary. We might try once more at the next meet hosted at UI that Karen Byers is at and brings the IES computer with the licensed MM program, but we have no intention of running the entire meet in this mode or using the Dolphin watches as part of the results.

Problems and issues:

- a) the STARTER must operate the 'head timer watch unit' in addition to his duties as starter. If the starter forgets or doesn't verify the head watch readout that the stop button and then reset actually were accepted by the unit, then the synchronized start of all the lane watches does not happen and there are no times for the race from any of the Dolphin watches! MANUAL WATCHES are a must as backup or the entire heat has no timing data.
- b) the RESULTS COMPUTER OPERATOR must retrieve the Dolphin times immediately after every heat and remain synchronized with the actual events taking place. The Dolphin software merely writes the wireless time data to a computer file by 'race number' and does not have any event or heat number information. Meet Manager "get times" retrieves the data from the last race stored unless the results operator scrolls through the list of race numbers and picks a different #. An extra start beep (such as a test start, recalled race, or inadvertent button push by the starter) gets a new race number and there is no way to delete the individual race file or reuse the race number. A missed 'reset of head watch' and there is no data so there is no race number even though the race happened. If the results operator is not synchronized with the meet as it takes place, it becomes very tricky if not impossible to retrieve the correct race times for a previous race.
- c) LANE TIMERS cannot switch watches between lanes and if they make a mistake (inadvertent stop) a back-up Dolphin cannot be swapped in. The Dolphin watches are programmed to a specific lane # and position A, B, or C; it takes a couple of minutes to program a Dolphin watch so it can't be done during a race shorter than a 200, and even if you reprogrammed a spare watch during a longer race it wouldn't have the start time. MANUAL WATCHES are a must as backup in each lane and

a head timer is still needed with spare manual watches. IF lane timers swap watches between lanes, the Dolphin software does not know this and incorrect times are recorded; a common observation during the 'test meets' was timers in a lane with no swimmer would time a different lane (probably their kid or friend was swimming in another lane) and these times are recorded in the Dolphin file for the lane the watch is programmed for and made no sense and added confusion to the RESULT COMPUTER OPERATOR.

- d) RESULTS Meet Manager/Dolphin computer needs to be on deck adjacent to the starter and be watching the pool during the race for which lanes do and don't have swimmers. The STARTER and RESULTS OPERATOR need to check with each other between each heat to remain synchronized, resolve LANE TIMER discrepancies as they occur, and the next race should not be started until Dolphin time results from previous heat have been accepted by results computer operator. Need an extra few seconds between heats in the time line to accommodate all this.

OW Equipment Purchase Proposal: Ken Schuh

\$7000 loan from the IES Equipment Reserve to be repaid from funds collected from the proposed OW surcharge. Please refer to the IES rules and regulations proposals for that information.

Radios

What we have in IES works OK for 50M meets, but as we found out last year at Snake River Challenge, they only cover about half the course. Based on the radios used by USAS at the Grand Prix I have researched the cost and requirements with Motorola. We need longer range (more power). The power level we need does require an FCC license. We need a set of **10** to do a basic OW meet.

Here are the details that Motorola recommends for our application:

Day Wireless Systems (Motorola Radio Distributor for the Northwest)

Motorola CP200 5 Watt VHF Lithium Batteries \$355 per unit, Headset \$75-90 per unit. Water resistant. Over 5-10 mile range. Charger included. 10 year life expectancy. **Note: Headset prices may come down to a range of \$25 to \$60. I am waiting for Day Wireless to get in a CP200 and 2 different types of headsets to see which is better. Our IES headsets will not work with the CP200. I borrowed a headset from Jack.**

Regional (WA, ID, OR) License with assigned frequency, 10 years. \$685

10 units at \$445 = \$4450 plus the license = \$5135.00 Day Wireless says that if we come to them with a bulk purchase they expect they could get a discount for IES as a not for profit.

Bouys

Regatta Bouys 60" Dia \$162 each (Turn Bouys) (Need Qty 4) \$648
Regatta Bouys 40" Dia \$66 each (Intermediate Bouys) (Need Qty 4) \$264
