Job Title: **Swim Team Head Coach**

POSITION SUMMARY:

This position supports the work of the Sidney-Shelby County YMCA, a leading nonprofit committed to strengthening community through youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. The Head Swim Team Coach must be committed to the YMCA mission, vision, and goals as the basis of carrying out the duties of this position. The Sidney-Shelby County YMCA competes in the Southwest Ohio YMCA Swim League and the Head Coach must comply with the rules and regulations of the league. The qualified candidate must possess exceptional leadership, administrative, organizational, supervisory and coaching experience, knowledge and skills. As a member of the YMCA staff, this individual must be able to develop strong relationships with other full-time and part-time staff, volunteers, program parents, and youth athletes.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Functions as a member of the YMCA staff team and as such is knowledgeable of and abides by and is able to communicate all YMCA policies and procedures
2. Leads and articulates his or her vision of the swim team program as well as all short-term and long-term goals
3. Model, teach, and demonstrate the YMCA Core Values of caring, honesty, respect and responsibility
4. Prepare, organize, and complete all necessary swim team program entries and data into the applicable swim team computer program on time and in advance of each swim meet.
5. Works with Associate Executive Director, SWIMPAC President and other swim team coaches to ensure any/all sponsors are secured, fundraisers are organized, and swim team apparel has been ordered.
6. Works to enhance, promote, and grow the YMCA Stingray Swim Team throughout the community
7. Attends each monthly SWIMPAC meeting and shares in leadership responsibility of organization of meetings, meets, fundraising activities and swim team events such as end of the year banquet etc.
8. Creates a culture of safety and works to prevent and minimize injuries by eliminating hazardous situations or dangers both at the YMCA and off site, and be capable of handling and emergency if one should arise.
9. Arrive in advance of all practices and meets to ensure that all activities are able to start and finish on time, preform assigned duties at such events and provide the necessary support and guidance to return the facility and any equipment to its original state prior to the event.
10. Ensure compliance with Lindsey's Law and OSHA concussion protocol.

YMCA COMPETENCIES (Leader):

Mission Advancement: Accepts and demonstrates the Ys values. Demonstrates a desire to serve others and fulfill community needs. Recruits volunteers and builds effective, supportive working relationships with them. Supports fund-raising.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Certifications must be current and comply with coach certifications; these include, but are not limited to: Safety Training for Swim Coaches, Professional Rescuer CPR, First Aid, Principles of YMCA Competitive Swimming and Diving
- Must be able to demonstrate coaches' safety skills in accordance with Red Cross standards
- Must meet all USA Swim Association head coach requirements
- Must be 21 years of age or older
