

# Coach Forum Bios

## Greg Brown

Greg Brown heads into his third season at the helm of the men's and women's swimming programs at Gettysburg College. In his first two seasons, he has guided the Bullets to a total of 13 school records and eight swimmers have been named All-Americans.

A former student-athlete at Lycoming College, Brown has experience at all levels of college swimming. Brown was a volunteer coach at the University of Vermont from and spent four years as the head swim coach at the Greater Burlington YMCA before becoming the head women's coach at Division I Siena College from 2006-10. He led the team to the program's only 10-win season and a third-place finish at the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Championships in 2009-10.

More recently, Brown served as an assistant at Florida Atlantic University (2015-17) and then at Army (2017-19). He was also the first-ever head coach swimming coach at Division III Marywood University (2010-2105), building the program into a strong contender in the Landmark Conference. A native of nearby Mechanicsburg, Pa., Brown was a seven-time Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) medalist at Lycoming College and was the team MVP in 2001. Brown graduated from Lycoming with a degree in history in 2002.

## Katie Cameron

The Bryant University men's and women's swimming and diving teams have enjoyed incredible success under the leadership and guidance of head coach Katie Cameron since the programs' inception 14 years ago. Now entering her 15th season as the head coach, Cameron has brought the swimming and diving program to prominence in not only the Northeast Conference but the Northeast region.

Cameron has guided the Bulldogs to back-to-back NEC Championships and is a three-time NEC Coach of the Year. Cameron came to Smithfield, R.I., from current NEC-member Wagner College, where she served as head women's swim coach from 1997-2004.

In her eight seasons at Wagner, Cameron saw eight individual conference champions and coached a league-winning relay team. She led her squad to a second-place conference finish in 2002 and 2003 and a third-place finish in 2005. A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Cameron is a 1996 graduate of Syracuse University's School of Management, earning her Master's in Education from Wagner in 2001.

## Jeff Dugdale

Jeff Dugdale, the 2022 Division II National Coach of the Year, begins his 12th year in charge of the Queens University of Charlotte men's and women's swimming programs in 2021-22. His accolades include 12 Team NCAA Championships, 108 Individual NCAA Championships, and 685 All-American Swims (322 Men; 363 Women). Additionally, Queens swimming has had four athletes compete across three Olympic games (London, Rio, Tokyo) and one compete in two Paralympic Games (Rio, Tokyo).

A native of Kenosha, Wis., Dugdale joined the Royals in the summer of 2010 from the SwimMAC Carolina. Prior to joining SwimMAC Carolina, Dugdale was an assistant coach at Duke University, where he helped lead recruiting and leadership development. Dugdale was a member of the men's swim team at Auburn University becoming a three-year letter-winner, 1989-1991, before getting his start in collegiate coaching at his alma mater in 1992.

Dugdale earned a bachelor's degree in Health and Human Performance at Auburn in 1995. Dugdale has two children, Sydney and Colby.

## Jim Henry

Jim Henry was named Yale women's swimming head coach prior to the 2012-13 season and took over the men's program beginning with the 2017-18 season.

Henry, the 2017 Ivy League Coach of the Year, has enjoyed remarkable success at Yale. He has led the Bulldog women to a 75-9 overall record and a 47-8 Ivy mark. Yale captured the 2017 Ivy League Championship, the school's first since 1997. The Yale men finished in the top-3 at the Ivy League Championships in two of his three years and had a pair of Ivy championship relay teams in 2019-20.

Before arriving at Yale, Henry helped guide the University of Texas women's swimming program to four top-10 NCAA team finishes. He spent six years at Texas, returning to his alma mater after leading the University of Denver swimming programs from 2004-06. He guided Denver to back-to-back runner-up honors at the Sun Belt Conference Championships in 2005 and 2006.

Prior to his three-year tenure at Denver, Henry served as assistant men's swimming coach and recruiting coordinator at SMU from 1999-2003 when he coached 12 NCAA All-Americans and helped lead SMU to the Western Athletic Conference title each year. Before getting into collegiate coaching, Henry was the aquatics director and head swimming coach for the Allen (Texas) Independent School District in 1998-99 and head swim coach at The Peddie School in Hightstown, N.J. (from 1995-98). Peddie finished fourth at the 1997 U.S. Nationals and was second at the U.S. Open that year. Henry led Peddie to the 1998 Junior National Team Championship and developed 31 high school All-Americans as well.

## Glenn Neufeld (moderator)

Since 2014, Glenn has served as the head coach of Mercersburg Academy where he also works as the Assistant Director of College Counseling. He has led a resurgence in the program at Mercersburg, helping to oversee the building of the Lloyd Aquatic Center with the program once again among the premier high school programs in the United States.

From 2000-2014, he was the Director of Competitive Aquatics at the Upper Main Line YMCA where he won three national coach of the year awards, placed 5 athletes on US National teams and was a US National team coach. In 2003-04, he moved south to the University of Alabama, coaching athletes who competed at the NCAA Championships, US Olympic Trials and the 2004 Olympics. He returned to UMLY with the realization that he preferred coaching and mentoring high school student-athletes rather than college swimmers.

Glenn's knowledge base as not just an experienced swim coach (club, high school & college) but also as a college and guidance counselor gives him a unique perspective on college admissions and athletic recruiting. His blend of education and experience allows him to share thoughts and strategies on how to maximize opportunities for college admissions as well as swimming in college and university settings. He has served as the forum moderator since the programs inception in 2013.
