

Jack Ver Helst

Jack Ver Helst began his involvement with the YMCA in the late 1950's as a member of the learn-to-swim program at the Mason City, Iowa YMCA. At that YMCA, Jack was involved in a variety of their programs ranging from the club programs (Jr. Leaders Club and Hi-Y Club), physical education classes, YMCA Camp, and through all areas of the YMCA aquatic programs including scuba.

Jack's competitive swimming started at the Mason City YMCA at the age of 12. The Mason City High School did not have a competitive swim team while Jack was in school, so he turned to teaching and coaching the age group team at the YMCA while still in high school.

In 1965 Jack became program director at the Boone YMCA in Boone, Iowa while completing his B.S. degree in physical education and biology. He was the leading force in a movement which converted a railroad YMCA into a well developed community based YMCA program which included social, physical and aquatic programs. He assisted in the organization of the Mid-Iowa YMCA Swim League, the oldest YMCA swim league in the state of Iowa, and later became president and secretary/treasurer of this league. Jack is currently actively coaching the age group swim program for the Boone County YMCA and is co-coordinator for the YMCA competitive swimming for the state of Iowa.

Jack and his wife Sharon live in Boone, Iowa. They have three sons: Brian, Jeff, and Eric: and one daughter Wendy.
