



Menlo Swim and Sport Pool Rules

- No swimming unless there is a lifeguard on duty.
- No eating or smoking allowed on the pool deck. Eating permitted on grass area only. Drinking on the pool deck permitted from plastic containers for hydration during workouts. Smoking not allowed anywhere within the pool facility.
- No glass containers on pool deck.
- No running on pool deck.
- No roughhousing or unsafe swimming.
- Bathing suits must be worn at all times (State of California Health Code).
- We require both a disposable diaper and reusable swim diaper cover for all children not fully toilet-trained.
- Kickboards and pull buoys provided at the pool are for lap swimming, instructional programs, and team workouts only. Fins are provided for Menlo Masters workouts only.
- Floatation devices are not permitted unless they are Coast Guard Approved Personal Floatation Devices.
- No one permitted in the lifeguard chairs except lifeguards and no climbing on the lifeguard towers.

- Any patron in water deeper than the patron's armpits may be required to demonstrate to the lifeguard or Pool Manager on duty that he or she is capable of swimming the width of the pool in that depth. If the patron is unable to do so, he or she must remain in water that is below his or her armpits.
- A responsible party must supervise children under the age of nine at all times. A responsible party is defined as a person fourteen years of age or older who has the ability to swim. Supervision is defined as having the child who is less than nine years old within arm's reach at all times while at the Burgess Pool. Patrons age nine and older are permitted in the Burgess Pool facility without supervision, but are subject to removal by the Pool Manager on duty if they create a health or safety risk.
- Menlo Swim and Sport assumes no liability for the loss or theft of a patron's personal belongings. Lockers are provided to secure personal belongings. Patrons may bring locks for use on lockers. All locks must be removed from the locker at the end of the day or they will be removed. Items left in lockers after the end of the day will be placed in the pool's lost and found area.
- The Pool Manager on duty may close the entire pool complex, or any portions of the pool complex, for any safety or maintenance reason.
- Lifeguards have full authority over patrons using the pool area and as situations warrant, they may enforce rules not listed.
